



Philip and Jummai Nache are from the African country of Nigeria. They moved to the United States and now they tell other Africans who moved here about Jesus.




Philip Nache is a missionary church planter in Minnesota. He started a church called Hope of Nations Gospel Church.

<h2>5. We respond.</h2>  <p>You can respond to Jesus. Believe in your heart that Jesus alone saves you. Repent, turning from self and sin to Jesus. Tell God and others that your faith is in Jesus.</p> <p><i>Read Romans 10:9-10, 13.</i></p>	<h2>4. Jesus gives.</h2>  <p>Jesus lived a perfect life, died on the cross for our sins, and rose again. Because Jesus gave up His life for us, we can be welcomed into God's family for eternity. This is the best gift ever!</p> <p><i>Read Romans 5:8; 1 Peter 3:18; 2 Corinthians 5:21.</i></p>	<h2>3. God provided.</h2>  <p>God sent His Son, Jesus, to rescue us from the punishment we deserve. It's something we, as sinners, could never earn on our own. Jesus alone saves us.</p> <p><i>Read John 3:16; Ephesians 2:8-9.</i></p>
<h1>The Gospel: God's Plan for Us</h1> <p>Have you ever heard the word <i>gospel</i>? The word <i>gospel</i> means “good news.” It is the message about Jesus Christ, the kingdom of God, and salvation.</p>	<h2>1. God rules.</h2>  <p>Because God created everything, He is in charge of everything.</p> <p><i>Read Revelation 4:11.</i></p>	<h2>2. We sinned.</h2>  <p>Since the time of Adam and Eve, everyone has chosen to disobey God. The Bible calls this sin. Sin separates us from a holy God and deserves God's punishment of death.</p> <p><i>Read Romans 3:23; 6:23.</i></p>

James lives in the United States now, but he came from a country in Africa called Sudan. When he was a young boy, he was forced out of his country during a war. He joined thousands of boys who had to leave their homes and walk for hundreds of miles to another country. They were called the “Lost Boys.”

James often went for days without food and slept outside on the ground. Finally he arrived at a refugee camp in Ethiopia. Life was still very hard at the camp, but Christians were there and told James about Jesus. He believed and chose to become a Christian.

James says: “If you believe in God, it can lead you to a better life. You can suffer, but you know that one day you will not suffer. God can turn it around for good. That’s what I’ve been believing.”

Now in the United States, James goes to church, has a food job, and he graduated with honors from a local community college. God is blessing James. He is not lost anymore.
