David Livingstone believed that God called him to explore so that he could tell people about Jesus and work to end slavery in Africa.














This is the story of George Liele (LIGH-uhl). George was born a slave in Georgia. George grew up hearing about Jesus from his family and church. He accepted Jesus as his Savior and Lord when he was 23 and was baptized by his pastor. After he became a Christian, his owner gave him his freedom so that he could become a preacher.
George became the first ordained African American preacher in America, and he started the first African American church. He preached in plantations in Georgia and South Carolina, before a friend helped him move to Jamaica.
In Jamaica, he became a missionary to the slaves and led hundreds of people to the Lord. He told people that once they knew Jesus, they needed to tell others and he encouraged people to become missionaries to other countries. He also worked to end slavery in Jamaica. He taught all people how to be free in Christ.
