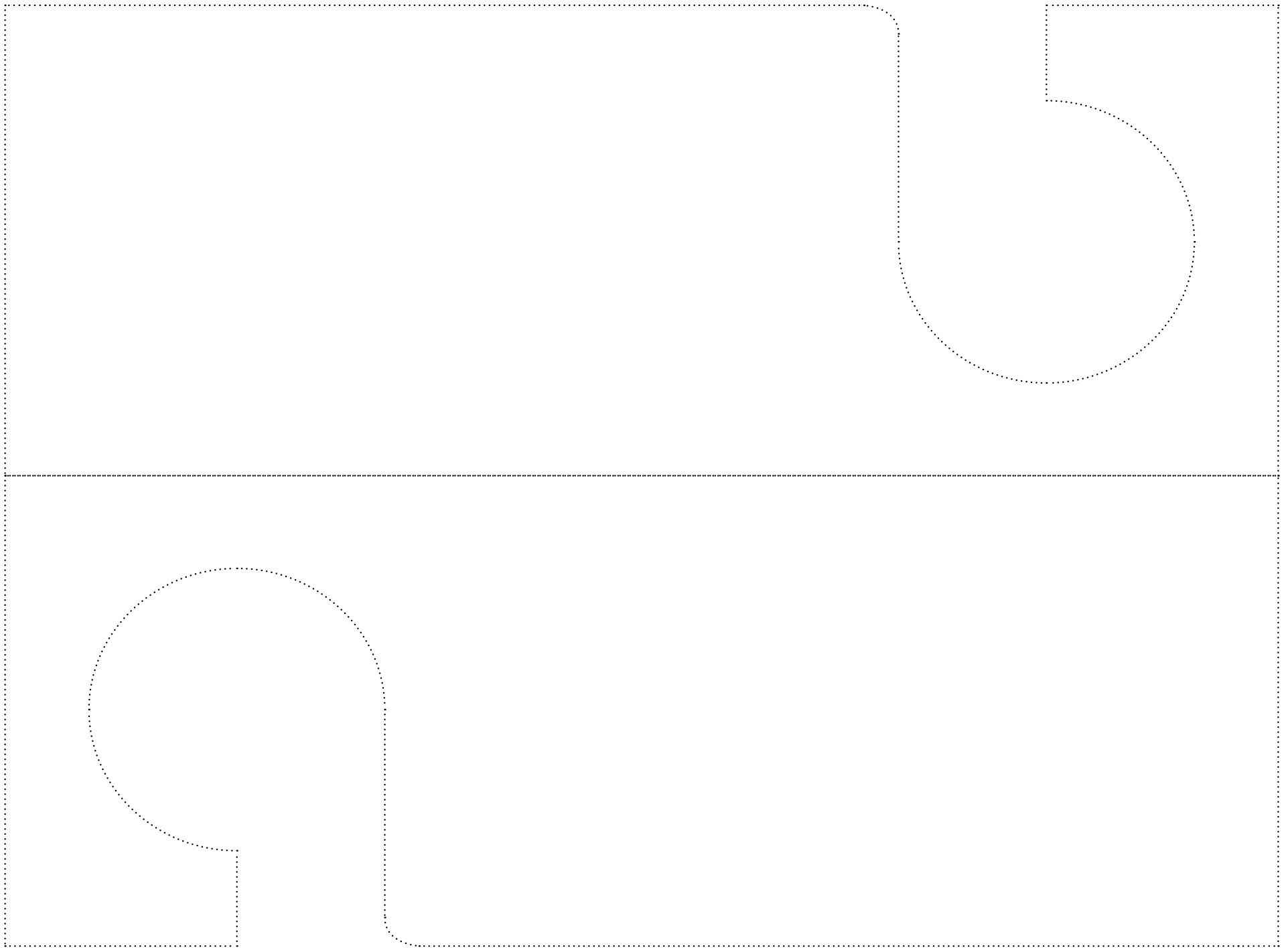

Samuel Zwemer (zuh-WAY-mer) was one of the first missionaries who had a real passion for reaching people who practice the Islamic faith. Samuel was born in Michigan. When he was a baby, his mother prayed that God would call him to be a missionary. By the time Samuel graduated from college, he decided to become a foreign missionary. Samuel knew he wanted to go to the Middle East, where the Islam religion began. Samuel felt compassion for the Muslim people because they were worshipping a false god.

But Samuel had a difficult time getting support from the Missionary Society that usually funded foreign missions efforts. He was told that Muslims were beyond help because they were too attached to their religion. That didn't hurt Samuel's enthusiasm. He raised his own support through local churches, and he left everything he knew behind to move to Arabia to tell Muslims about Jesus.

It wasn't an easy mission field. In 39 years of teaching the gospel there, Samuel saw fewer than a dozen people come to know Jesus. But he never stopped believing that it was exactly where God had called him to serve.

Samuel wrote about one book per year while he was on the mission field, and he came back to the United States and encouraged young people to go to the Islamic world to teach Muslims the love of Christ. After all those years and so few victories in the mission field, he still wanted so badly to see Muslims understand the truth of God's Word. Samuel inspired so many young missionaries through his writing and teaching, he became known as the "Apostle to Islam." An apostle is someone who obeys God and brings God's Word to a group of people.

Even though Samuel didn't see thousands of people come to know Jesus during his lifetime, he always believed that what He did was for God's glory. Samuel lived to be 84 years old. He never stopped teaching young people about the importance of missions.



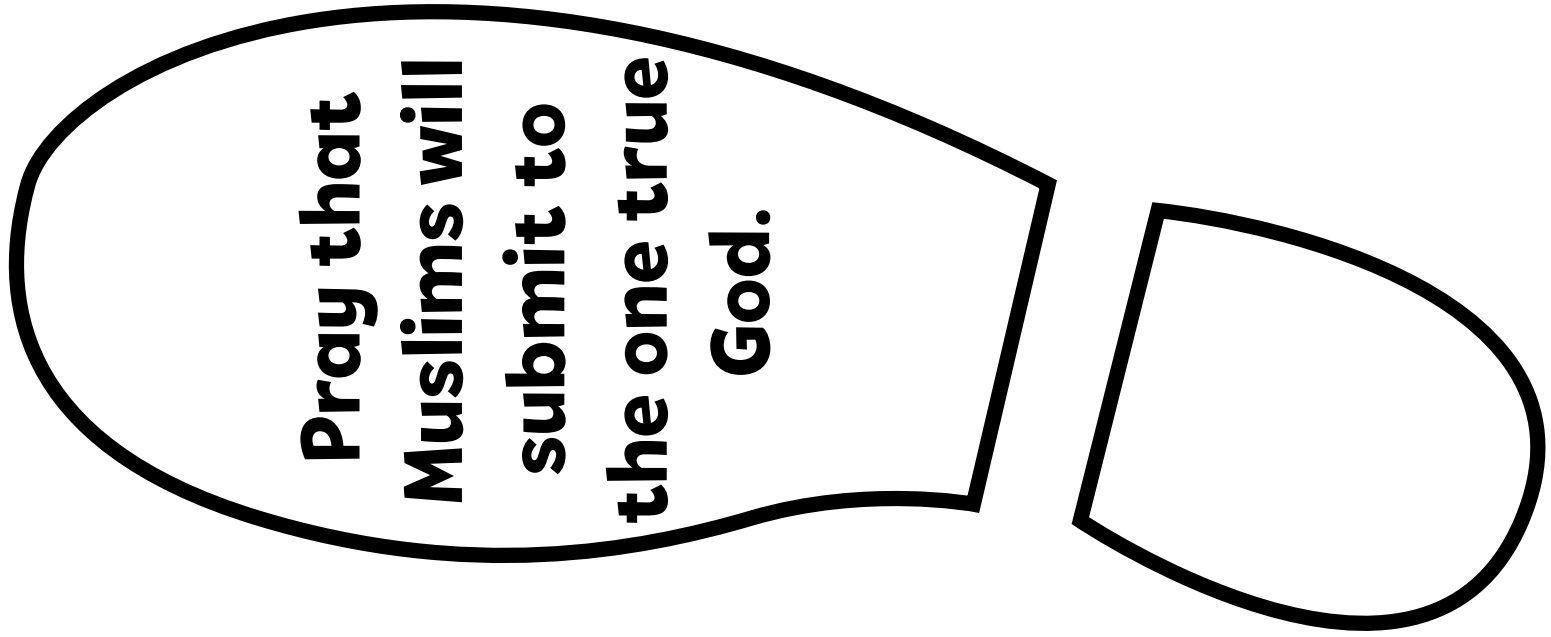
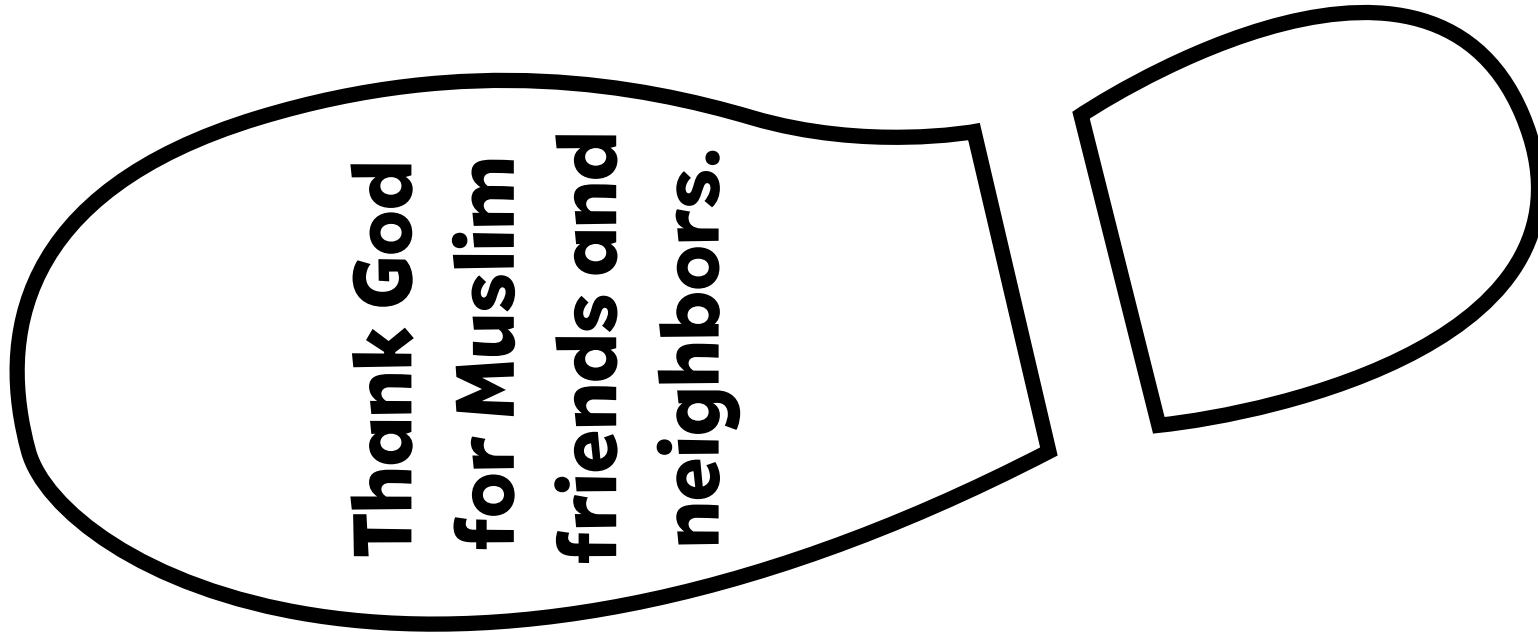


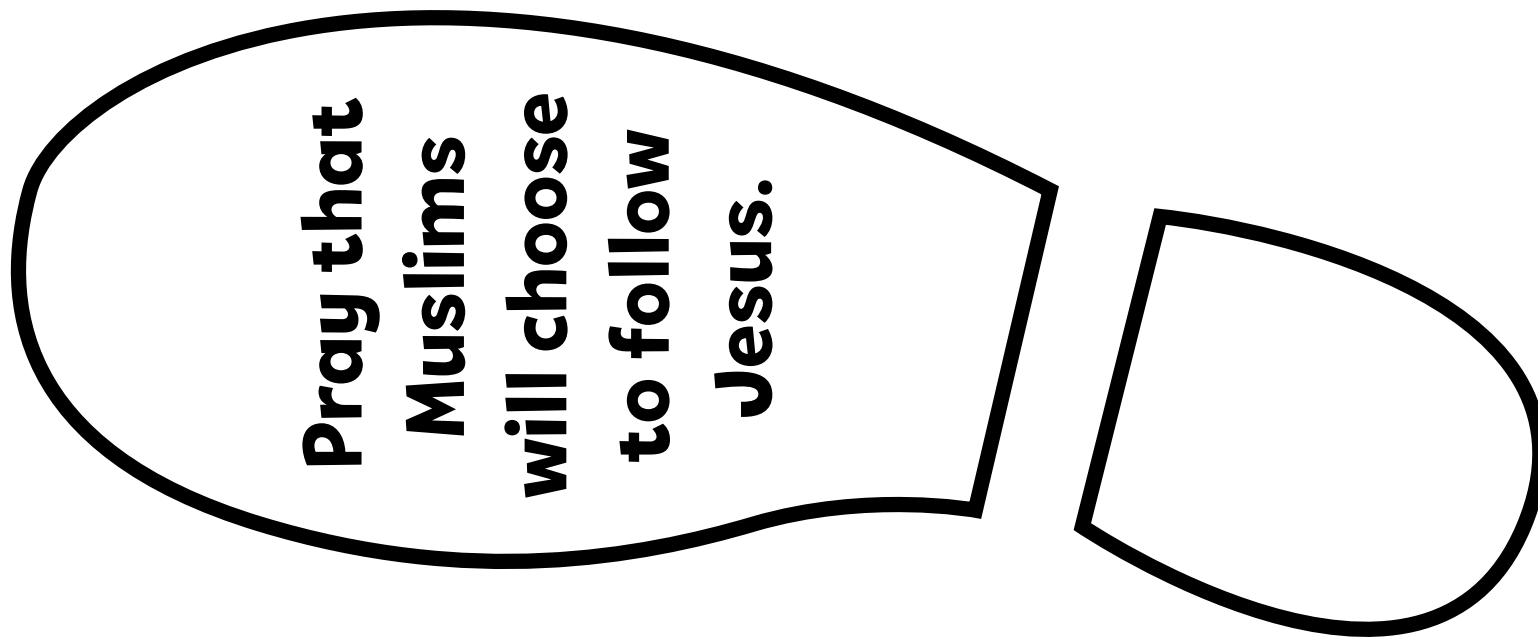
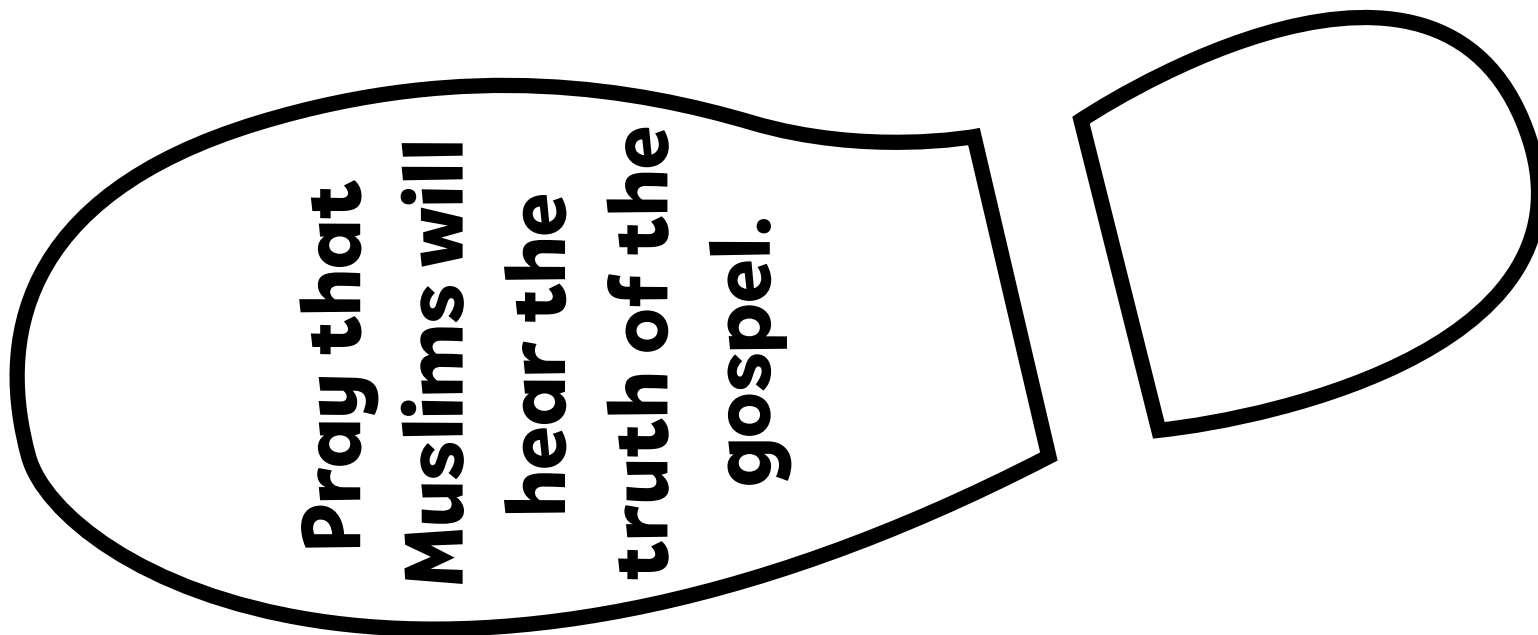


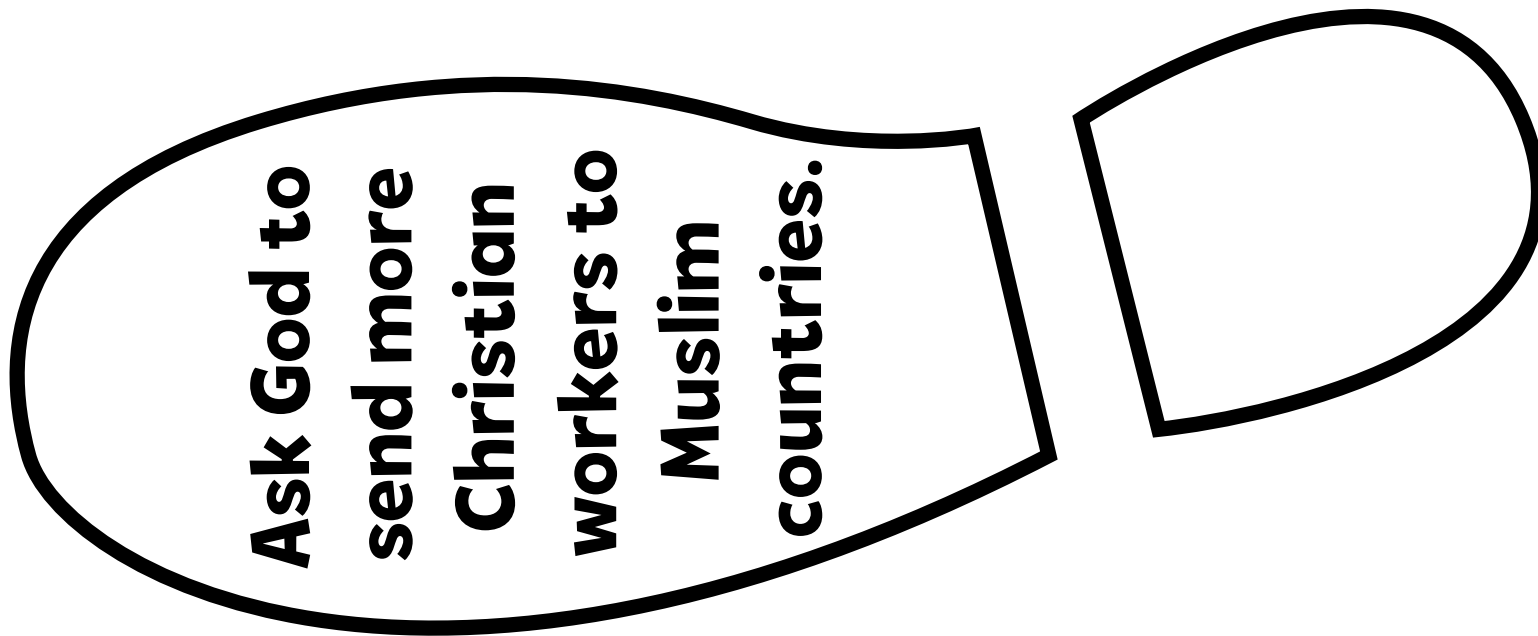
