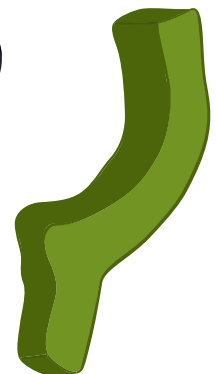
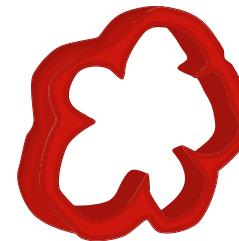
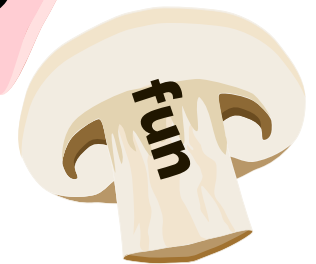
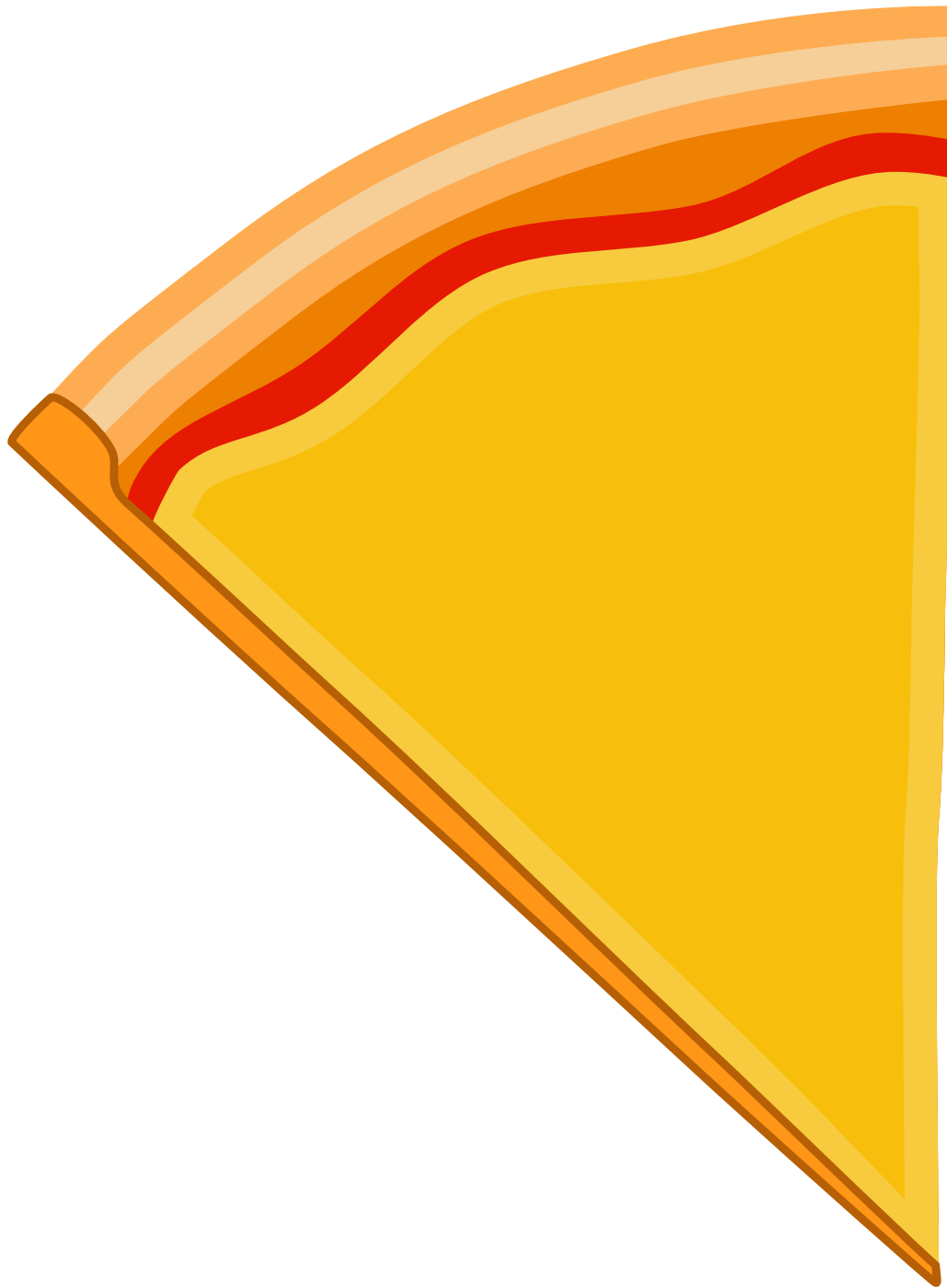








- Yvette Aaronson was born deaf.

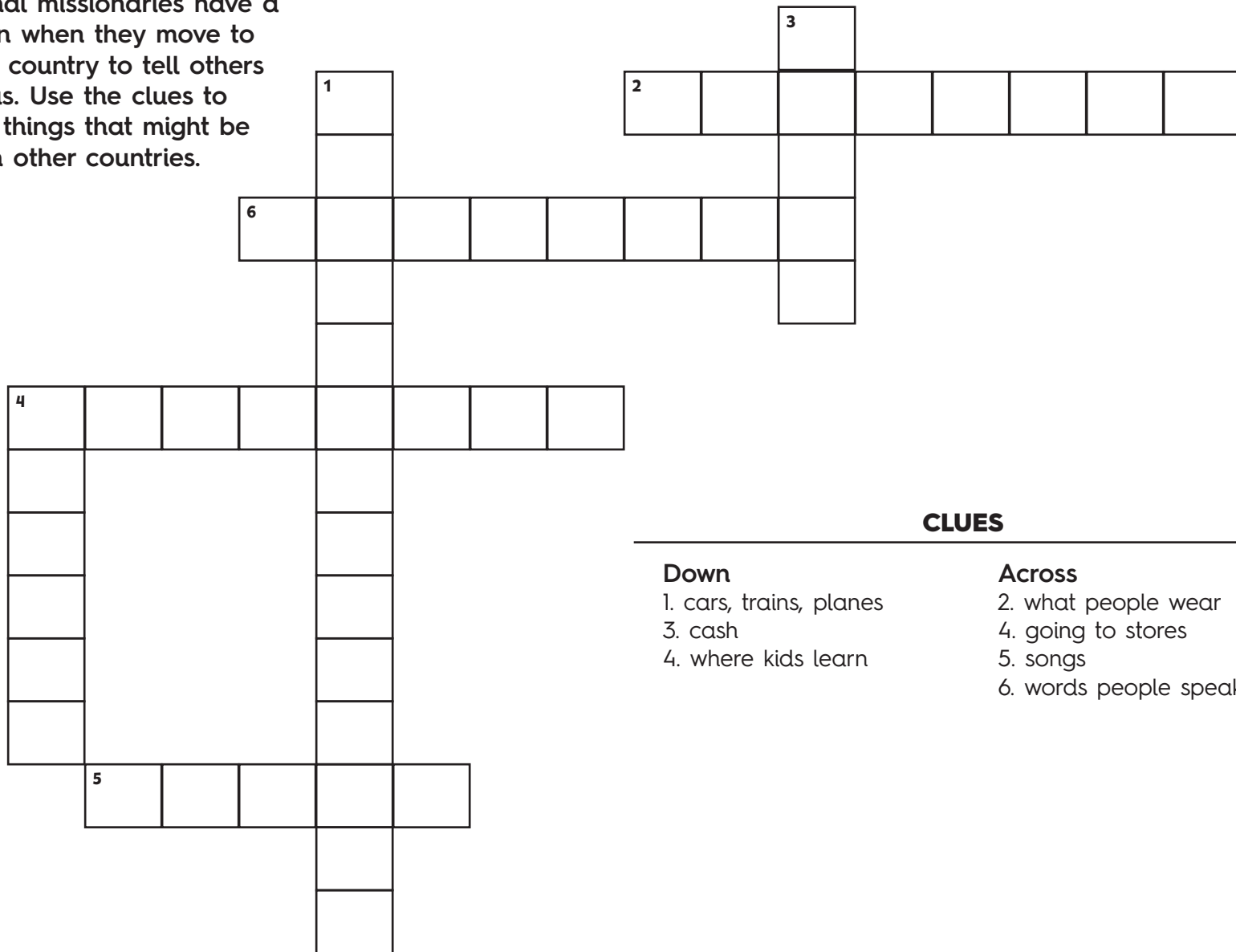

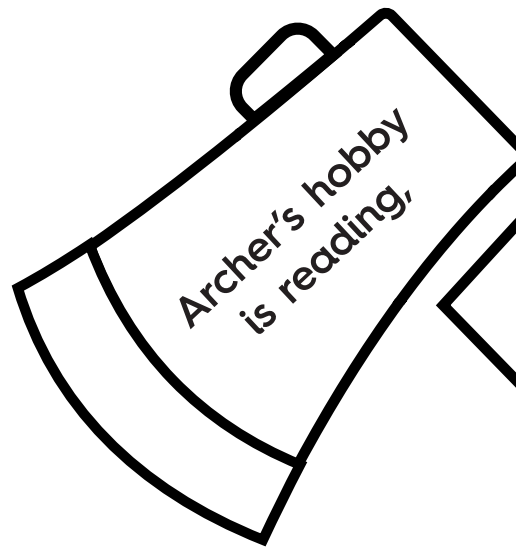
