Volume 7 (Spring 2023) Kids Sermon Outlines

UNIT 19, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Mary and Joseph trusted (Matt. 1:18-25): As miraculous as the birth of Jesus was, it would also have been a very trying situation for Mary and Joseph. Every part of this story, from their social standing to where Mary would give birth, required them to trust God.

An army of angels celebrated (Luke 2:8-14): The angels shared the good news with the shepherds and gave glory to the Lord

The shepherds obeyed (Luke 2:15-20): The shepherds followed the angels instructions and found Baby Jesus in the feeding trough.

UNIT 19, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus was presented to the Lord (Luke 2:21-24): Mary and Joseph obeyed God and took Jesus to the temple in Jerusalem.

Jesus was the answer to God's promise (Luke 2:25-38): God's Spirit showed Simeon that Jesus was the promised Messiah.

Jesus grew to be strong and wise (Luke 2:51-52): Jesus grew up and was strong and healthy. He was wise, and God was happy with Him.

UNIT 19, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

John prepared the way for Jesus (Matt. 3:1-6): John's job was to get people ready for Jesus. John began telling people, "Repent and be baptized because God's kingdom is almost here."

Jesus was baptized by John (Matt. 3:13-15): Jesus asked John to baptize Him. Even though Jesus never sinned, He was baptized to obey God.

God was pleased with His Son (Matt. 3:16-17): When Jesus came out of the water, God's voice said "This is My Son, I love Him, and I am very pleased with Him."

UNIT 19, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus was confident in His identity as God's Son (Matt. 4:1-4): The devil tempted Jesus to sin and prove that He was God's Son. Jesus did not give into temptation, He was confident in His identity and did not have to prove anything.

Jesus trusted God's plan and submitted to Him (Matt. 4:5-7): The devil twisted Scripture to try and tempt Jesus, but Jesus still trusted that God's plan was better.

Jesus rules over a new kind of kingdom (Matt. 4:8-11): The devil tempted Jesus by offering Him all the kingdoms of the world, but that paled in comparison to what God had in store for Jesus.

UNIT 19, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus is the Son of God (John 1:19-28): John recognized and shared with others that Jesus is the Son of God.

Jesus came to save people from their sins (John 1:29-36): Jesus is the Lamb of God, who takes the sin from the world.

Jesus called disciples to follow Him (John 1:43-51): Jesus invited people to follow Him to learn more about God's plan for the world.

UNIT 19, SESSION 6 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God is holy (Heb. 10:1-4): God first gave the Israelites His law through Moses so that they could understand that God is holy.

A greater sacrifice was needed (Heb. 10:11): The sacrifices that the priests offered over and over again would never completely take away sins.

Jesus was that greater sacrifice (Heb. 10:12-18): Jesus offered one sacrifice, Himself, and it took care of sin forever.

UNIT 20, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Nicodemus was confused (John 3:1-4): Nicodemus thought that the way to heaven was to keep all of God's laws, but Jesus said otherwise.

Jesus taught Nicodemus about eternal life (John 3:10-16): The way to eternal life is through Jesus, not through following the law.

We all need new life through Jesus (John 3:17-21): Jesus offers us new life through Him, but we have to choose to either step into the light or stay in the darkness.

UNIT 20, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus saw the woman at the well (John 4:1-10): Jesus went to the well and asked the Samaritan woman for a drink of water.

The woman at the well listened to Jesus (John 4:13-15): Jesus shared the truth of who He was with the woman, and she listened and responded.

Jesus offered the woman living water (John 4:21-26): The woman realized that Jesus was the Messiah and shared what He had offered her with others.

UNIT 20, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God is love (1 Cor. 13): God showed us the ultimate form of love in giving His own Son so that we can be close to Him again.

Paul described love in his letter (1 Cor. 13:4-7): Paul gives us a good description of what love is and is not in his letter.

God's love is unlike any other spiritual gift (1 Cor. 13:8-13): Love does not end and we are all called to love.

UNIT 21, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus went to His hometown (Luke 4:16-20): Jesus went to Nazareth, entered the synagogue on the Sabbath day, and read from the Scriptures.

The people were surprised (Luke 4:21-22): Jesus told the people that He was fulfilling the prophecy, but they questioned Him.

Jesus was rejected (Luke 4:24-30): The people became enraged and they drove Him out of town.

UNIT 21, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus taught (Luke 4:31-32): Jesus amazed the people with His teaching, because He taught with authority.

Jesus commanded (Luke 4:33-41): There was a man with a demonic spirit in the synagogue and Jesus commanded the spirit to come out.

Jesus rested (Luke 4:42-44): In the morning, Jesus went out by Himself to pray and rest with God.

UNIT 21, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Peter listened to Jesus (Luke 5:1-3): Jesus got into Peter's boat and asked Him to row out into the water.

Peter obeyed Jesus (Luke 5:4-5): Peter had been fishing all night and had not caught anything, but Jesus told him to cast his net again, so he did.

Peter worshiped Jesus (Luke 5:6-11): When they drew up their nets and saw the great amount of fish, Peter recognized the power and perfection of Jesus.

UNIT 21, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God calls us to live by faith (Heb. 11:1-3): Faith is being sure that God will fulfill His promises and obeying God because we trust Him.

Many people in the Bible had faith (Heb. 11:4-38): We can look to the faith of those who have come before us and be encouraged.

We can have faith (Heb. 11:39-40): These people had faith that God's promised Messiah would come. We get to see the fulfillment of that promise through Jesus and allow it to fuel our faith.
