

Volume 8 (Summer 2023) Kids Sermon Outlines

UNIT 22, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus is fully man (Matt. 8:24): Even something as simple as Jesus needing rest reminds us that Jesus was fully human and can relate to our struggles.

Jesus is fully God (Matt. 8:26): Jesus had the power to bring calm to the wind and the sea.

Jesus is worthy of our faith (Matt. 8:27): In moments of fear, we remember that even the wind and the sea obey Jesus.

UNIT 22, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus has the power to save (Mark 2:5): Jesus saw the faith of the men and told the man who could not walk that his sins were forgiven.

Jesus has the power to heal (Mark 2:10-11): Jesus has the power to heal both physically and spiritually.

There is no one like Jesus (Mark 2:12): The people were astounded and gave glory to God and we can do the same.

UNIT 22, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus knows what people need (Luke 8:45-47): Jesus sensed that someone in the crowd needed His healing and had touched Him.

The woman had faith in Jesus (Luke 8:48): The woman knew that even touching the hem of Jesus' robe could bring her healing, her faith is what saved her.

Jesus can do what no one else can (Luke 8:49-56): The little girl was dead, but Jesus brought her back to life. He has the power to raise the dead.

UNIT 22, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus came for everyone (Matt. 15:29-31): Jesus and His disciples were traveling in an area where Gentiles, or non-Jews, lived.

Jesus cared for the physical needs of the crowds (Matt. 15:32): Jesus had compassion on the crowd and did not send them away hungry.

Jesus is the Bread of Life and can satisfy our spiritual needs (Matt. 15:37): The fact that they ate, were satisfied, and had leftovers reminds us that Jesus fulfills us. He satisfies us far better than bread and fish ever could!

UNIT 22, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God had a plan (John 14:1-7): God has been preparing a plan from the very beginning.

Jesus was going away, but it was for the disciples' good (John 14:12-14): God's power would not decrease when Jesus went to heaven. This was part of God's plan.

The Holy Spirit would teach the disciples now (John 14:15-17): God would send the Holy Spirit to be with the disciples forever.

UNIT 23, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We can honor God with our actions (Matt. 5:13-16): Our actions help people notice that there is something different about how we live our life, like salt seasons food or a light shines in the darkness.

We can honor God with our choices (Matt. 5:17-20): Our life is not simply about the choices that we make, but about why we make those choices. We want to obey God for the right reasons.

We can honor God with our heart (Matt. 5:43-48): We can love our enemies and pray for those who hurt us.

UNIT 23, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus taught how people should live (Matt. 6:1-18): God calls us to be generous, to pray, and to fast, but not to get attention from others.

Jesus taught how people should treat one another (Matt. 6:14-15): We are to forgive one another.

Jesus taught how to love God (Matt. 6:25-34): We should choose to seek God's kingdom and His righteousness, instead of being worried about what might happen tomorrow.

UNIT 23, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God loves people (Luke 15:1-2): The Pharisees and scribes were complaining because Jesus was letting tax collectors and sinners get close to Him.

People can repent (Luke 15:17-21): The lost son realized that he had sinned against his father. He turned around and came back to his father and asked for forgiveness.

God offers forgiveness (Luke 15:22-24): When a sinner repents, the Lord offers forgiveness and celebrates, like the father in the parable.

UNIT 23, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God's kingdom is growing (Matt. 13:31-33): The kingdom of God is growing, like a mustard seed into a tree or yeast in bread dough.

God's kingdom is valuable (Matt. 13:44-46): The kingdom of God is valuable, like a field with a buried treasure, or a priceless pearl.

Not everyone will understand God's kingdom (Matt. 13:47-50): At the end of the age, those who trust God will be separated from those who do not.

UNIT 23, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus taught about God's kingdom (Matt. 22:1-2): Jesus used parables, or stories, to teach about the kingdom of God.

Jesus offers salvation (Matt. 22: 3-4): The wedding feast represents heaven, Jesus invites us to join Him in heaven through offering us salvation.

Jesus clothes us in His righteousness (Matt. 22:8-14): Jesus offers us His righteousness so that we are properly clothed for the wedding feast, but we have to accept His gift of salvation.

UNIT 24, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

The path to heaven is like a narrow door (Luke 13:23-25): Many people will try to enter heaven because of what they have done or who they are, but salvation only comes through Jesus.

Jesus came to offer salvation to all (Luke 13:22): Jesus traveled to many places to tell different groups of people about the kingdom of heaven.

Not everyone will choose to accept the good news of Jesus (Luke 13:25-30): Only people who accept the good news of Jesus can enter the kingdom of God.

UNIT 24, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Everything can bring glory to God (John 11:1-4): Even sickness and death can bring glory to God.

We can ask Jesus for miracles (John 11:3): Mary and Martha asked Jesus to heal their brother of his sickness. They had no idea that the miracle Jesus planned on performing would be even greater.

Jesus has power over death (John 11:38-44): Jesus commanded Lazarus to come out of the tomb and he did, the dead man was brought back to life.

UNIT 24, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Our battle is against evil (Eph. 6:12): Our struggle is not against people; it is against evil.

Our need is for the armor of God (Eph. 6:13-17): We can put on the armor of God to protect us in the battle against evil.

Our call to action is prayer (Eph. 6:18-20): We must always remember to pray.
