

Volume 9 (Fall 2023) Kids Sermon Outlines

UNIT 25, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus was the Messiah Zechariah prophesied about (Matt. 21:4-5): All along, God had every detail of Jesus' entrance planned.

Jesus was humble (Mark 11:1-7): While many may have expected the Messiah to enter on a powerful warhorse, instead Jesus entered on a humble donkey.

Jesus was victorious (Luke 19:37-40): Even though many were against Jesus, He knew that He would ultimately be praised and glorified.

UNIT 25, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus cannot be tricked (Matt. 22:15-18): The Pharisees attempted to trick Jesus with their questions, but Jesus cannot be fooled.

Jesus answered with wisdom (Matt. 22:19-22): Jesus told them to give to the government that which belongs to it and to do the same with God.

Jesus is the Messiah (Matt. 22: 41-46): Jesus' answers and teachings proved that He is the Messiah.

UNIT 25, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Our actions should match our beliefs (Matt. 23:1-7): The Pharisees taught the right message, but it did not match how they actually lived their lives.

We are to show justice, mercy, and faithfulness (Matt. 23:23-24): Jesus taught that above all else, these are the characteristics we should practice.

Jesus changes our hearts so we can love God and obey Him (Matt. 23:27-32): The Pharisees appeared righteous on the outside but were dead on the inside. Only Jesus can bring us true life.

UNIT 25, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We are all given a life to use for God's glory (Matt. 25:14-15): Each servant was given money, much like each person is given gifts and skills.

We have a responsibility not to waste what we've been given (Matt. 25:24-29): The servant who did nothing with the master's money was rebuked for being lazy.

We eagerly wait to share in the joy of our Master (Matt. 25:21-23): When we properly use what God has given us we get to share in His joy.

UNIT 25, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God provided Moses as a prophet to the Israelites (Deut. 18:1-8): God provided a leader and instructions for His people.

God warned against false prophets (Deut. 18:9-14): God's people were not to follow the false customs and religions they were surrounded with.

God sent an even greater prophet than Moses (Deut. 18:15-22): God provided for His people both in the present and in the future. Moses was a shadow of Jesus.

UNIT 26, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

What we believe impacts our response to Jesus (Matt. 26:6-16): In this passage, we see two very different responses to Jesus.

Mary responded with worship (Matt. 26:6-7): Mary worshiped Jesus through her sacrifice, because of her love for Him.

Judas responded with rejection (Matt. 26:14-16): Judas claimed to love Jesus, but his actions showed otherwise.

UNIT 26, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus brought in a new covenant (Matt. 26:28): The old covenant relied on continual sacrifices for sin, but Jesus was the perfect and final sacrifice.

Jesus invites us to receive from Him (Matt. 26:26-27): Jesus invited the disciples to sit and eat with Him then, and He still invites us into His presence.

Jesus calls us to remember what He has done (Luke 22:19): The Lord's Supper is a way for us to remember Jesus' sacrifice.

UNIT 26, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus brought His sadness to God (Matt. 26:36-39): Jesus brought His grief to His Father and we can do the same.

Jesus submitted to God's plan (Matt. 26:42): Even though Jesus knew that He would face pain and sadness, He still chose to follow God's plan.

God's plan is always for our good (Matt. 26:47-56): Jesus was left by His friends, betrayed by Judas, and arrested, but even still He trusted God's plan and character.

UNIT 26, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God provided priests to lead His people (Heb. 7:1-10): God sent many priests to lead His people, including Melchizedek.

God provided written encouragement to the early church (Heb. 7:1-14): The book of Hebrews reminded the early church that it is worth it to continue following Jesus, even in the midst of persecution.

God provided the perfect priest in Jesus (Heb. 7:23-28): Jesus is able to intercede for us as a perfect, innocent, holy High Priest.

UNIT 27, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus was truthful when questioned (Mark 14:53-65): When asked in court, Jesus truthfully said that He was the Messiah.

Jesus was peaceful when unfairly punished (Mark 15:1-5): When Pilate was questioning Him, Jesus did not fight back or argue.

Jesus was the perfect substitute for our sins (Luke 23:13-16): Pilate admitted that he found Jesus to be innocent, but Jesus' perfection is what makes Him an adequate sacrifice for our sins.

UNIT 27, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus was mocked (Matt. 27:27-31): Jesus was dressed in a scarlet robe and a crown of thorns to make fun of His claims of being the King of the Jews.

Jesus died for our sins (Matt. 27:32-53): Jesus did nothing wrong but was crucified on the cross as a punishment for our sins.

Jesus is the Savior God promised (Matt. 27:54): Miraculous events took place immediately following Jesus' death and even the centurion who had been watching over Him realized He was the Son of God.

UNIT 27, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus' body was put in a tomb (Matt. 27:57-61): Jesus' body was prepared for burial and then put in a tomb with a large stone covering the entrance.

Jesus did not stay dead (Matt. 28:1-10): Jesus was fully dead and in the tomb for three days but came back to life as God planned.

Jesus reigns as King over all creation (Matt. 28:16-20): All authority has been given to Jesus both in heaven and on earth. He has power over everything, even death.

UNIT 27, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Paul encouraged believers to remember what is true about the gospel (Col. 1:1-8): The church at Colossae knew the gospel, but false teachers had been telling them lies. Paul encouraged them to continue believing the truth.

Jesus' resurrection paved the way for us to have life with God (Col. 1:15-20): Jesus is at the center of the gospel and the only way to life with God is through Him.

Our faith impacts how we live now and for eternity (Col. 1:21-23): What we believe about Jesus and the gospel affects every part of our life and the decisions we make.
