UNIT 31, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

The apostles were arrested (Acts 5:17-21): Peter and John had been arrested for teaching about Jesus.

The apostles wouldn't stop speaking about Jesus (Acts 5:25-32): Even after being arrested for teaching about Jesus, the apostles continued to proclaim His truth to people.

God's plans cannot be stopped (Acts 5:33-42): No matter what the religious leaders said or did to Peter and John, they continued preaching the truth about Jesus, as God had planned.

UNIT 31, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

The church worked together (Acts 6:2): When the leaders of the church heard of an issue, they brought together all of the members to help solve it.

We can handle difficulties with grace (Acts 6:3-5): Rather than arguing with each other, the church members prayed and found a solution to the problem.

Jesus equips the church to care for everyone (Acts 6:5-7): When Christians act as God intended, then the church will grow and the Word of God will spread.

UNIT 31, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Stephen was persecuted for his faith (Acts 6:8-15): Stephen followed Jesus and communicated the truth, but Jews began to argue with him.

Stephen faced suffering for trusting God (Acts 7:54-58): The religious leaders were angry that Stephen was saying Jesus was the Messiah, so they threw stones at him.

We can be fearless when we are close to Jesus (Acts 7:59-60): Even as he was dying, Stephen called out to Jesus and trusted Him.

UNIT 31, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

The Holy Spirit led Philip (Acts 8:26-29): The Holy Spirit spoke to Philip and led him to the man from Ethiopia.

Philip helped the Ethiopian understand the Scriptures (Acts 8:30-35): The Ethiopian was reading the Scriptures but did not understand what they said. Philip helped him understand the good news about Jesus.

We need wisdom to understand God's Word (Acts 8:36-40): The man from Ethiopia not only read and heard the Word of God, he also chose to obey it by being baptized.

UNIT 31, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus' death brings forgiveness (Phil. 2:1-4): Jesus died on the cross as a way to offer us complete forgiveness.

Jesus' resurrection brings hope (Phil. 2:5-11): Jesus did not stay dead, He rose again to life and has been exalted by God the Father.

We represent Jesus to the world (Phil. 2:12-18): God is working within us for His good purpose.

UNIT 32, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Peter healed through God's power (Acts 9:32-34): While Peter was traveling, he came across a man who was bedridden. Peter healed the man in Jesus' name.

Peter's miracles pointed to Jesus (Acts 9:35): People saw that the man had been healed and turned to the Lord.

The Holy Spirit gives us power for His glory (Acts 9:36-43): When Dorcas was brought back to life, many people believed in the Lord.

UNIT 32, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Peter was given a vision for God's kingdom (Acts 10:9-16): God gave Peter a picture of His plan for His people, but Peter was hesitant.

The kingdom of God is for all who trust Jesus (Acts 10:10-33): God's vision showed that He offers salvation to everyone.

We can experience unity with other believers (Acts 10:34-43): When we choose to follow Jesus, we are brought together with believers of all backgrounds.

UNIT 32, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God rescued the Gentiles and Jews (Acts 11:1-14): God showed Peter that the good news of Jesus is for everyone.

We can celebrate when others turn to Jesus (Acts 11:15-18): The believers glorified God for giving life to the Gentiles.

We can encourage others in their faith (Acts 11:19-26): Lots of people began to trust in God, and the apostles and believers continued to spread the good news of Jesus.

UNIT 32, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Peter was put in prison for his faith (Acts 12:1-6): King Herod Agrippa arrested Peter, not because Peter was guilty, but because the king wanted to make the Jews happy.

God answered the believers' prayers (Acts 12:5-10): The church prayed for Peter, and God sent an angel to lead him out of the prison.

We can pursue God in prayer (Acts 12:11-17): The people were encouraged by their prayers being answered and Peter's freedom.

UNIT 32, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God designed the church to work together (1 Cor. 12:1-11): The church was having a difficult time agreeing on what was most important, but God intends for the church to be a family.

We all have a different role to play in the church. (1 Cor. 12:12-24): The Holy Spirit brings together many different people, but we are all one in Christ.

The church is most powerful when believers are unified (1 Cor. 12:25-31): The church is designed to suffer together and rejoice together.

UNIT 33, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Saul was an enemy of the church (Acts 9:1-2): Saul sought out disciples of the Lord in order to bring them as prisoners to Jerusalem.

Saul was transformed by Jesus (Acts 9:3-9): Jesus met Saul while he was on his way to persecute believers.

We are changed when we give our lives to Christ (Acts 9:10-30): Saul had wanted to end the church, but after encountering Jesus, Saul began to proclaim Him as the Messiah.

UNIT 33, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Paul and Barnabas faced many difficulties (Acts 13:44-50): The people in Lystra turned against Paul and Barnabas. They threw stones at Paul and dragged him out of the city.

Paul and Barnabas were determined to spread the gospel (Acts 13:51-52): Even after trials, Paul and Barnabas continued to share the good news of the gospel with Jews and non-Jews.

We can reflect Jesus through discipleship (Acts 14:21-28): Paul and Barnabas encouraged believers to continue in the faith, even when they experienced suffering.

UNIT 33, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We are forgiven in Christ (2 Cor. 5:10-15): Jesus died so that our sins can be forgiven completely.

Jesus gives us His righteousness (2 Cor. 5:21): Jesus died so that we can be covered by His perfection.

We are ambassadors for Christ (2 Cor. 5:16-21): When we choose to follow Jesus, we are given a new perspective and an identity as an ambassador for Him.
