UNIT 34, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

The gospel is for everyone (Acts 15:5-9): Jesus died for everyone, God has made no distinction or special allowances.

We cannot be saved through the Law (Acts 15:19-29): We follow God's commands not to earn salvation, but rather to honor Him and His good plans for our lives.

We are justified by grace (Acts 15:10-11): Paul taught that Jews and Gentiles are saved the same way—by the grace of the Lord Jesus.

UNIT 34, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Paul preached to all kinds of people (Acts 16): Paul spoke about Jesus to a businesswoman, a servant girl, prisoners, and many others.

Some believed and others rejected Jesus (Acts 17:1-9): In Thessalonica, some people joined Paul and Silas, while others formed a mob and started rioting the city.

Paul was committed to his mission (Acts 18:4): Despite trials and persecution, Paul continued to share the gospel with both Jews and Gentiles.

UNIT 34, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God wants us to know and believe Truth (Acts 19:1-7): The twelve men believed in God but had not heard of the Holy Spirit. God wants us to know and believe the full truth of the gospel.

God provides teachers to help us understand the Bible (Acts 19:8-10): Paul devoted over two years to teaching and discussing God's Word in Ephesus.

We are called to obey God's call in our life (Acts 20:17-38): Paul obeyed God's call on his life, even when it included danger and sadness.

UNIT 34, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We are united to other believers through faith (Romans 15:7-13): We are to follow Jesus' example and accept others as He accepted us.

Following Jesus impacts the way we live (Romans 15:1-4): We are to seek to build up those around us and not live to please ourselves.

Our purpose in life is to bring glory to God (Romans 15:5-6): We are to live in harmony with one another and glorify our God.

UNIT 35, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

When faced with suffering, Paul trusted God (Acts 21:13-14): Paul was not only ready to be taken prisoner, but to die for the sake of sharing Jesus' love with people.

Everyone is invited to follow Jesus (Acts 22:1-21): Before following Jesus, Paul persecuted Christians. But even he was invited to experience life change through the gospel.

We can follow God's plan and tell others about Jesus (Acts 22:22-30): Even in dangerous situations, God protected Paul so that he could continue to share the gospel.

UNIT 35, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Paul was persecuted for speaking the truth (Acts 22:30-23:9): Paul was brought before religious and political leaders for telling the truth about Jesus.

The Lord encouraged Paul to continue his ministry (Acts 23:10-11): God spoke to Paul and told him to continue telling people about Him.

We can obey Jesus even when it's difficult (Acts 23:12-35): There was a plot to kill Paul, but God continued to keep him safe.

UNIT 35, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God calls Christians to endure trials for the sake of what is true (Acts 24:1-21): Paul had done nothing wrong, yet he faced persecution for telling the truth about God.

God calls Christians to share the gospel with others (Acts 24:22-26): Paul even shared the gospel with everyone, even those who were holding him as a prisoner.

God calls Christians to be faithful to speak the truth (Acts 25:13-26:32): Paul was faithful to speak the truth of the gospel in every situation, even in front of powerful leaders who did not agree with him.

UNIT 35, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Paul endured a shipwreck (Acts 27:1-20; 39-44): Paul's boat was tossed around by strong winds and rain and eventually steered off course.

God gave the men courage (Acts 27:21-26): Paul shared the angel's message with the prisoners and sailors and challenged them to have courage, no matter what the ship did.

We can trust God's provision (Acts 28:1-10): God kept everyone on the ship safe and brought them to Malta, where they were welcomed by the people who lived there.

UNIT 35, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We can tell others about Jesus no matter where we are (Acts 28:1-10): Paul shared the truth about Jesus, prayed with people, and healed people while he was on the island of Malta.

God has a plan, even when circumstances feel difficult (Acts 28:11-28): Even when he got to Rome, Paul was still a prisoner. But God used that time to continue his ministry.

The truth of Jesus brings life and joy to all who believe in Him (Acts 28:30-31): Paul welcomed everyone who visited him and shared the gospel without hindrance.

UNIT 35, SESSION 6 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Christians rely on Jesus for strength to live for God (1 Thess. 4:1-8): Through the power of the Holy Spirit, we can live as

Jesus calls us to.

Believers are called to be unified (1 Thess. 4:9-12): We are to love one another, as God teaches.

Believers represent Jesus on earth until He returns (1 Thess. 5): As believers, we can encourage each other to live like Jesus, because we have the hope of eternity with Him.

UNIT 36, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

John had a vision of heaven (Rev. 4:1-2): Jesus appeared to John and showed him what will happen before the end of time.

Every living creature will worship Jesus (Rev. 4:3-11): John saw the creatures give glory, honor, and thanks to the One on the throne.

Jesus deserves our worship (Rev. 5): Jesus is the only One who is worthy to open the scroll; He is worthy of all our praise.

UNIT 36, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God has a plan for when Jesus comes back to earth (Rev. 19:1-16): John's vision shows God's plan for when Jesus returns to earth.

Jesus is strong and powerful (Rev. 19:11-20: 3): Jesus will come back ready to defeat evil.

We will one day celebrate Jesus' final victory (Rev. 20: 4-6): Jesus will defeat evil and bring happiness to His people.

UNIT 36, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

One day all suffering will end (Rev. 21:1-4): In the new creation, sadness, crying, and pain will no longer exist.

We can have hope that Jesus will return (Rev. 21:5-6): Jesus is the beginning and the end, we can trust that He keeps His promises.

There is a place in God's kingdom for all who believe (Rev. 22:12-17): God invites everyone to come, and those who believe will be joined together with Him.
