

## **Volume 1 (Fall 2024) Kids Sermon Outlines**

### **Unit 1, Session 1**

**God is Creator (Gen. 1):** God created everything by His word and for His glory.

**God is Ruler (Gen. 2:1-9):** God completely and perfectly rules over His creation.

**We are created in God's image (Gen. 1:26-31):** God created men and women in His image to reflect Him.

### **Unit 1, Session 2**

**Adam and Eve disobeyed God (Gen. 3:1-6):** Adam and Eve chose to eat the fruit that God instructed them not to.

**Sin separates us from God (Gen. 3:7-9):** Adam and Eve hid from God when they realized what they had done.

**God promised a way of hope (Gen. 3:21-24):** Even though Adam and Eve were forced to leave the garden, God still had a plan.

### **Unit 1, Session 3**

**Sin infects all of humanity (Gen. 4:1-5):** Adam and Eve's sin did not just touch their lives, but every person's life who would come after them.

**Sin is destructive (Gen. 4:6-8):** When God confronted Cain about his sin, Cain became angry and ultimately killed his own brother.

**God shows mercy to sinners (Gen. 4:13-16):** Even in Cain's punishment, God was kind and protected him from enemies.

### **Unit 1, Session 4**

**God wants us to know Him (Gen. 6:18-22):** God spoke to Noah and promised to establish His covenant through Noah and his family.

**God will not allow evil to go unpunished (Gen. 6:11-17):** God is perfect, but saw that the world was filled with wickedness.

**God rescues us from sin (Gen. 9):** God delivered Noah and his family from the flood, and He delivers all of humanity from the consequences of sin through Jesus.

### **Unit 1, Session 5**

**People desire to be like God (Gen. 11:1-4):** The people desired to make a name for themselves and control their future.

**God alone deserves glory (Gen. 11:5-9):** The Lord confused the people's speech so that they He alone would get the glory He deserves.

**One day all believers will be united in God's Kingdom (Gen. 11:9):** The people were scattered throughout the earth, but one day we will all be together worshiping God for eternity.

### **Unit 2, Session 1**

**God invites people to participate in His plans (Gen. 12:1-3):** God invited Abram to go to a new land and promised to make a great nation through Abram's family.

**Our obedience honors God (Gen. 12:4-9):** Abram obeyed God, followed Him, and built an altar to worship God.

**God blesses people who trust Him (Gen. 13):** Abram trust God and allowed Lot to choose his land first, and God promised to bless Abram.

### Unit 2, Session 2

**God doesn't forget His promises and plans (Gen. 12:1-3):** The first time God spoke to Abram, He promised to bless him and make him into a great nation.

**God intends to bless all nations (Gen. 17:1-8):** God would bless all people through sending Jesus through Abram's family.

**We can respond to God with trust and faith (Gen. 17:15-27):** Even though Abram doubted that God give him and Sarah a son, God was faithful to hold to His promise.

### Unit 2, Session 3

**God tests us to reveal our faith (Gen. 22:1-6):** God asked Abraham to sacrifice his only son.

**We can trust God even when we do not fully understand His plans (Gen. 22:7-10):** Abraham was able to obey God because he trusted God's promise to make him the father of many.

**God provides the necessary sacrifice (Gen. 22:11-19):** God provided the ram so that Abraham did not have to sacrifice Isaac, and God provided Jesus so that we can be in relationship with Him.

### Unit 2, Session 4

**God goes before us to lead us (Gen. 24:1-15):** Even before the servant finished praying, God sent Rebekah as the answer to the prayer.

**God proves Himself faithful to us in all circumstances (Gen. 24:16-32):** God provided in abundance through Rebekah and her family.

**We can be confident in God's provision (Gen. 24:50-67):** Rebekah trusted God's plan, even though it meant leaving her family and going to a new land.

### Unit 3, Session 1

**We want control over our lives (Gen. 27:5-10):** Rebekah and Jacob tricked Isaac so that Jacob received the blessing.

**God uses sinful people to bring about His plans (Gen. 27:11-32):** Even though Jacob was sinful, God sent the promised Savior through his Jacob's family.

**We can submit to God's plans (Gen. 27:32-40):** Even when life doesn't go as we expect, we can trust that God has good plans.

### Unit 3, Session 2

**Nothing can stop God's plans (Gen. 28:1-15):** Jacob had to leave his home because he had lied and Esau was mad, but God still had a plan.

**God's glory leads us to worship Him (Gen. 28:10-22):** Jacob saw the Lord's goodness and that led him to worship God.

**God desires to be with His people (Gen. 28:10-15):** In Jacob's dream, God promised to not leave him and to fulfill His promise.

### **Unit 3, Session 3**

**Sin brings destruction (Gen. 37:12-36):** Joseph's brothers were overcome with jealousy and allowed that to fuel their actions toward Joseph.

**God watches over His people (Gen. 39):** Even in the midst of difficult situations, the Lord was with Joseph and showed him kindness.

**God has a good plan, even when we don't understand it (Gen. 50):** Joseph experienced heartbreak and pain, but God had a plan to put him in leadership and reunite him with his family.

### **Unit 3, Session 4**

**Suffering can occur apart from sin (Job 1):** Job was a good man who worshiped God, yet he still experienced suffering.

**We can worship God through suffering (Job 1–2:10):** Job lost everything, yet he still worshiped God.

**God is all-powerful and good (Job 42):** Job learned that he can still trust God, even though he didn't understand everything, because God is all-powerful and completely good.
