

Volume 4 (Summer 2025) Kids Sermon Outlines

UNIT 10, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Trusting God requires faith (1 Sam. 8): The Israelites did not have faith in God as their ruler.

Trusting God can mean our lives look different than those around us (1 Sam. 8:9-22): The Israelites wanted to be like the nations they were surrounded by and have a human king.

We can always trust God, even in the unexpected (1 Sam. 9:14-27): Saul did not expect to be chosen as king, but God's plan always prevails.

UNIT 10, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God sends His Spirit on people to accomplish His will (1 Sam. 11:4-11): When Saul heard the people needed help, the Spirit of God came powerfully on him to do the Lord's work.

We can obey God even when we don't understand His plans (1 Sam. 13:6-13): Saul and his troops were gripped with fear.

We can trust God and wait patiently on His plans (1 Sam. 13:6-22): Rather than wait for Samuel to arrive and offer the offerings, Saul foolishly offered the sacrifices and did not wait for God's plans.

UNIT 10, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Obedience is more valuable to God than sacrifices (1 Sam. 15:22): The Lord instructed Saul and his troops to completely destroy the Amalekites, but they disobeyed Him.

God rejects people who reject Him as Lord (1 Sam. 15:23): The Lord regretted making Saul king because Saul did not obey God's instructions.

We are accepted by God because of Jesus' obedience (1 Sam. 15:24-31): We all disobey God's commands at some point, but God sent Jesus to be perfectly obedient and then die in our place so that we can be made right with God.

UNIT 10, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God cares more about our heart than our outward appearance (1 Sam. 16:7): The Lord told Samuel not to pay attention to David's appearance or stature.

God's plans are better than we can see (1 Sam. 16:1-11): Samuel expected God to pick one of the older, stronger sons to be king, but God's plan was better.

God empowers His people with His Spirit (1 Sam. 16:12-13): Samuel anointed David with oil and the Spirit of the Lord came powerfully on David.

UNIT 10, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God gives us gifts that can be used to bless others (1 Sam. 16:14-18): God gave David the gift of music and David used that gift for King Saul.

God calls us to humbly serve others (1 Sam. 16:22): David served King Saul and Saul loved him very much.

We can show kindness to everyone (1 Sam. 16:19-23): Saul was plagued by an evil spirit, but when David would play his

lyre, Saul would feel better.

UNIT 11, SESSION 1- KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Apart from God we are helpless (1 Sam. 17:34-37): David knew that his strength and rescue came from the Lord.

Everyone who defies the Lord will be put to shame (1 Sam. 17:48-58): Goliath taunted God's people for weeks but was ultimately brought down by a slingshot and stone.

We have courage because God is all-powerful (1 Sam. 17:34-47): David understood that it didn't matter what armor or weapons he did or did not have, his strength and victory came from the Lord.

UNIT 11, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jealousy destroys relationships (1 Sam. 24:1-2): Saul became jealous of David and his success and sought to kill him.

Showing mercy to others reflects God's character (1 Sam. 24: 3-7): David could have killed Saul, but instead chose to show him mercy.

Despite how others act, we can have peace with God (1 Sam. 24:5-22): Saul was attempting to kill David, and David's men were encouraging David to retaliate against Saul, but David chose to obey God.

UNIT 11, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God wants to dwell with His people (2 Sam. 7:4-11): The Lord remained with the Israelites in every situation.

We can look forward to the great things God will do (2 Sam. 7:11-16): David wanted to build a temple for God, but God had bigger plans.

God keeps His promises (2 Sam. 7:11-29): The Lord promised to raise a descendent from David's family through which He would establish His kingdom.

UNIT 11, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We cannot hide our sin from God (2 Sam. 11): David tried to hide his sin from everyone, but the Lord knew he had done evil.

God is faithful to forgive when we bring our sin before Him (2 Sam. 12:1-15): David recognized his sin and the Lord was gracious toward him.

Only Jesus was without sin (Psalm 51): When we believe in Jesus, God is faithful and just to forgive our sins.

UNIT 12, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We can pray for God to make us like Jesus (1 Kings 3:1-15): Solomon asked for God to give him wisdom.

We need wisdom to lead godly lives (1 Kings 3): Solomon looked to God's wisdom to make decisions.

God blesses those who humble themselves before Him (1 Kings 3): Solomon understood that he could not be a wise king without God's leading.

UNIT 12, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God loves His people (1 Kings 6): The Lord promised to dwell with His people and not abandon them.

God gives us the ability to create beautiful things for His glory (1 Kings 6–7): The Lord used the gifts and talents of His people to build the temple.

God is compassionate toward sinners (1 Kings 8): King Solomon understood that when sinful people return to God, He is compassionate and forgives fully.

UNIT 12, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God gives meaning to our lives (Eccl. 1:1-11): Everything is meaningless apart from God.

Our choices matter to God (Eccl. 1:12-18): Knowing and serving God is what truly matters.

We can find joy and purpose in our work (Eccl. 1:12-18): God has given us the ability to think and take action for His glory, not our own fame, power, or riches.

UNIT 12, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Wisdom comes from God (1 Kings 10:1-9): The queen recognized that Solomon's wisdom came from his God.

We can grow in wisdom (1 Kings 10): Solomon continued to grow in wisdom.

We can be a blessing to others with the gifts God has given us (1 Kings 10:14): King Solomon shared his wealth and wisdom with the Queen of Sheba.

UNIT 12, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God gives us knowledge and wisdom to guide us (Prov. 1): King Solomon recognized that all wisdom comes from the Lord.

We can look to God for everything we need (Prov. 3): We can trust in the Lord and look to God in everything we do.

Honoring God leads to blessing (Prov. 4): Following God's commands leads to light and life.
