

Volume 5 (Fall 2025) Kids Sermon Outlines

UNIT 13, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

King Rehoboam wanted to be served (1 Kings 12:6-14): King Rehoboam rejected the advice of the elders and chose to treat the people harshly.

King Jesus came to serve His people (Matt. 20:28): Jesus came not to be served, but to serve others.

We demonstrate God's love through serving others (1 Kings 12:15-33): God's people were divided into two nations because of Rehoboam's disobedience.

UNIT 13, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

People are tempted to turn away from God (1 Kings 14:6-10): Jeroboam acted wickedly and made false gods for the people to worship.

God calls believers to remain loyal to Him (1 Kings 14:7-8): Life works best when we keep God's commands and follow Him with all of our hearts.

Jesus does not turn away from us (2 Chron. 12-13): Despite the people's disobedience, God remained faithful to them.

UNIT 13, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

False gods have no power (1 Kings 18:20-29): No matter what the prophets of Baal did, their false god did not respond.

Only God has true power over creation (1 Kings 18:36-39): God brought fire and completely consumed the burnt offering, wood, stone, and even the altar, even when it was completely soaked with water.

One day all people will bow before the Lord (1 Kings 18:38-39): When the people saw that the altar and offering were consumed by fire, they fell facedown and acknowledged that the Lord is God.

UNIT 13, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Walking in sin leads to misery (1 Kings 21:17-29): Ahab was a disobedient, greedy, and stubborn king who refused to lead Israel in the ways of the Lord.

Obedience to God leads to blessing (Deut. 5:32-33): God instruct us to obey His commands so that we may live and prosper.

God holds us accountable for our actions (1 Kings 22:29-40): King Ahab was struck by an arrow during battle and died, just as the prophet of the Lord said.

UNIT 14, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God has power over life and death (2 Kings 2:1-12): God took Elijah to heaven in a whirlwind.

God can do miraculous works (2 Kings 4): Elisha performed many miracles through God's power.

We can worship God by serving others (2 Kings 6): Because Namaan witnessed the miracles God performed through Elisha, the commander worshiped the one true God.

UNIT 14, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God loves His children (Jonah 1): God called Jonah to go to Nineveh to preach truth to them.

God's mercy is for everyone (Jonah 1:17-2:10): Rather than allow Jonah to drown, God mercifully sent a large fish to swallow him and bring him to Nineveh.

We can show compassion toward others (Jonah 4): God showed compassion to the Ninevites and they repented of their evil ways.

UNIT 14, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God loves us unconditionally (Hosea 1-2): God still loved Israel, even though they worshiped other gods and disobeyed Him.

God is faithful even when we turn away from Him (Hosea 3-7): Gomer's unfaithfulness to Hosea was like Israel's unfaithfulness to God. But God still loved Israel and forgave them for their lack of faithfulness.

God calls us to a life of faithfulness (Hosea 11-14): God is faithful to all sinners who repent and trust in Jesus, and He invites us to be faithful to Him in return.

UNIT 14, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Disobedience has consequences (2 Kings 17:6-20): The Israelites were given over to their enemies because they sinned against God and worshiped other gods.

God is patient and wants to be connected to us (2 Kings 17:13-14): God warned Israel to repent and turn from their evil ways, but they did not listen.

We face destruction apart from Jesus (2 Kings 17:16-20): The kingdom of Israel was destroyed and only the tribe of Judah remained.

UNIT 15, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Judah's good leaders were loyal to God (2 Chron. 15): Judah had several good kings, such as King Asa, that led the people to follow God and turn away from sin.

God guides us to follow Him through prayer (2 Chron. 14:8-15): King Asa prayed to the Lord and the Lord answered his prayer.

Jesus leads us to love and obey God (2 Chron. 34-35): King Josiah led the people to renew their covenant with God and stay faithful to Him.

UNIT 15, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God is slow to anger (Nahum): God is slow to anger and great in power.

God is rich in mercy (Amos): Through Amos, God showed the people that they were mistreating the poor. We are called to reflect the character of God toward others, including His mercy.

God will judge sin (Zephaniah): Zephaniah saw that the nation of Judah was going to be judged for worshiping idols.

UNIT 15, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Trusting in ourselves leads to sin and shame (Jer. 17:5-8): The person who trusts in other people is cursed, because people are sinful and imperfect.

Truth comes from God alone (Jer. 17:7-13): We are to trust in God alone. He is trustworthy. Those who trust in God will be strong and healthy.

God's covenant is unbreakable (Jer. 31): God has loved His people with an everlasting love and made a new covenant with them.

UNIT 15, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God gave His people time to repent, but they refused (2 Chron. 36:15-16): God continued to send prophets to warn Judah, and good kings to set good examples, but God's people did not listen.

God is right to judge sin (2 Chron. 36:17-21): Because the people continued to sin and rebel against God, God allowed the Babylonians to destroy the nation of Judah.

Jesus' life, death, and resurrection bring hope (2 Chron. 36:16): While God was patient with His people, all sin deserves punishment. Through Jesus, believers are set free from that punishment.

UNIT 15, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God brings hope from despair (Ezek. 37:1-3): Only through the Lord could the dry bones come back to life.

God's Word is powerful to bring us life (Ezek. 37:4-14): The Lord's promises bring life and hope.

God will bring unity to His people (Ezek. 37:15-28): God committed to gather His people into one nation with one king.
