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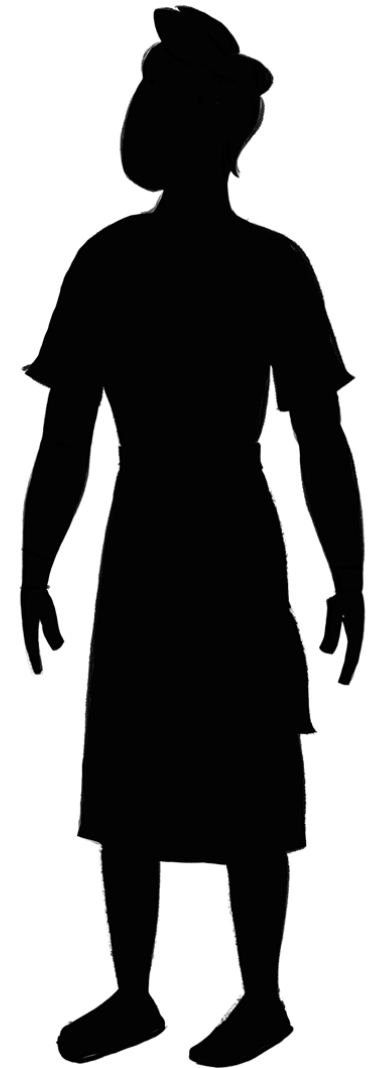
Micah

Zephaniah

Narrator: “God loved His people and sent prophets, who told the people to repent of their sin. One of the prophets was a man named Micah.”

Micah: “God will judge the wicked leaders of His people. Do justice, love mercy, and walk humbly with God.”

Micah: “But there is hope: God will one day send a new King from the line of David to rule over God’s people.”

Narrator: “God told Habakkuk that He would send the nation of Babylon to destroy Judah.”

Habakkuk: “God please be merciful to your people!”

Narrator: “Even though God’s judgment would come, Habakkuk trusted God.”

Habakkuk: “I will celebrate in the Lord; I will rejoice in the God of my salvation!”



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
