




Bible – represents God's Word and His promises

Shepherd's staff – symbolizes Jesus as the Good Shepherd

Heart – represents God's love

Cross – represents Jesus' sacrifice and salvation

Tree with fruit – represents God's provision

Shield – represents God's protection

Umbrella – symbolizes God's covering and protection

Cup of water – symbolizes God providing for our needs

Dove – represents peace and the Holy Spirit

Pair of shoes – represents walking in God's path or trust in Him

Path or Road – represents the way Jesus leads us or trusting in God's direction

Star – represents hope and guidance, like the star that guided the wise men

Lamb – represents Jesus as the Lamb of God

Rainbow – represents God's promise to never flood the earth again

Gift box – symbolizes God's grace and blessings

Mountain – represents strength or God's mighty power

Plate of food – represents God's provision

Lightbulb – represents God's light and guidance

House – represents God's care and shelter

Waterfall – represents God's cleansing power or refreshment
