UNIT 16, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Obedience to God brings blessings (Daniel 1:17-20): Daniel and his friends obeyed God's laws and God gave them knowledge and understanding.

Believers are called to be faithful to God in everything (Daniel 1:1-16): Daniel knew that the food the king provided him would go against God's commandment, so he asked for permission to eat other foods.

Our identity is rooted in God (Daniel 1:1-7): Even though King Nebuchadnezzar brought Daniel and his friends to a different country and changed their names, they still chose to obey and worship God.

UNIT 16, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God is greater than anything threat (Daniel 3:8-23): Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego were commanded to worship the statue, but they trusted God and chose not to bow down to it.

God alone is worthy of our worship (Daniel 3:1-7): King Nebuchadnezzar made a huge statue and required people to bow down to it, but only God is worthy of our worship.

We can be courageous in our faith (Daniel 3:24-30): Shadrach, Meshach, and Abednego courageously refused to bow down to anything but God, and God protected them.

UNIT 16, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We can live honorably even when opposed (Daniel 6:1-10): Despite the king's command, Daniel continued to pray to God alone.

God can be trusted, even in difficult circumstances (Daniel 6:10-18): Daniel trusted God to keep him safe in the lions' den.

God demonstrates His power in surprising ways (Daniel 6:19-28): God shut the mouths of the lion so that Daniel was not harmed, which led King Darius to decree that everyone worship and fear the God of Daniel.

UNIT 16, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God rules over all creation (Daniel 7): Daniel's visions showed that God is ultimately in control.

God's truth brings comfort and hope to His children (Daniel 8-10): God sent an angelic messenger to explain the dream to Daniel.

God will defeat all evil and sin (Daniel 11-12): God's kingdom will last forever and never be destroyed.

UNIT 17, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God keeps His promises (Ezra 1): God promised that He would bring His people back to Jerusalem.

We can be joyful in God's faithfulness (Ezra 2:68-70): Once they arrived at the Lord's house in Jerusalem, the families gave offerings to God to celebrate.

God desires our worship and obedience (Ezra 3): The people rebuilt the temple and praised God.

UNIT 17, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God's plans cannot be stopped (Ezra 4): God's enemies tried to stop the rebuilding of the temple of the Lord.

We can celebrate God's protection and provision (Ezra 6:16-22): The people finished the temple and had a great

celebration. They worshiped God and celebrated Passover.

God strengthens us when we face opposition (Haggai 1-2): God spoke through the prophet Haggai to encourage them to continue building the temple.

UNIT 17, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We can eagerly await Jesus' return (Zech. 1-6): God gave Zechariah eight different visions where He shared His future plans for His people.

Jesus is our humble King and promised Messiah (Zech. 9:9-17): Zechariah prophesied that the Messiah would enter Jerusalem riding on a donkey.

God is faithful, even when we sin (Zech. 13): Zechariah said a future day was coming when God would wash away people's sin and remove the idols from Jerusalem.

UNIT 17, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God is always in control (Esther 2): God knew the threat that was about to come upon His people; He placed Esther in just the right place at the right time.

Faith results in courage (Esther 4-5): Esther prayed and trusted God, which led her to bravely approach the king.

God calls us to stand up for what's right (Esther 4): Esther stood up for what was right, and God saved His people through her.

UNIT 18, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

God hears and answers our prayers (Neh. 1): God prayed to Nehemiah, asking him for favor with the king.

God enables us to be productive and fruitful (Neh. 2-3): Nehemiah and the people worked together to rebuild the walls of Jerusalem.

We can experience unity in the face of opposition (Neh. 4-6): Enemies of God were not happy that the walls were being rebuilt and tried to discourage God's people. But God's people did not allow the enemies to stop them from building.

UNIT 18, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Knowledge of sin leads us to repent (Ezra 9): Ezra learned that the people had disobeyed God's commands; he prayed to God and confessed the people's sin.

God's Word reveals our need for Him (Neh. 8): The Levites came to the people and explained the law so they could better understand what was read.

We are to love God with our minds by studying His Word (Ezra 7:10): Ezra committed to study the law of the Lord, obey it, and teach it to God's people.

UNIT 18, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Remembering God's past faithfulness leads to worship (Neh. 9): As the people prayed, they remembered the ways God had provided for them in the past.

God is faithful to us even when we are unfaithful to Him (Neh. 9:16-21): The people remembered how their ancestors did not obey God, but how He was forgiving and slow to anger.

We can celebrate God's faithfulness (Neh. 12-13): The people dedicated the wall around Jerusalem and celebrated with music and gave thanks to God.

UNIT 18, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We must be diligent to remember God's goodness (Mal. 1): God spoke to Israel through Malachi and reminded them of how He loved them and chose them.

God gives us leaders to encourage us to follow Him (Mal. 4): Malachi encouraged the people to look forward to the promised Messiah.

God gives believers clear instructions for how to live as His children (Mal. 2-3): God told His people how to turn away from sin and live for Him through Malachi.

UNIT 18, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus is the Savior the prophets foretold (John 1:1-5): Jesus was God's plan to save the world from the very beginning.

God prepares the way for His promises (John 1:6-36): God sent John the Baptist to prepare the way for the promised Messiah.

God has been faithful throughout all time (Luke 1): All the way through the Old Testament, God used His prophets to share His plan to send Jesus.
