

Volume 7 (Spring 2026) Kids Sermon Outlines

UNIT 19, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus' birth is evidence of God's love for us (Mt. 1:22-23): Immanuel means "God is with us," reminding us of God's presence and love.

God's plans may surprise us (Mt. 1:18-25): God had a special plan for Mary and Joseph, but it was very different from what they expected for their lives.

Jesus is the path back to God (Mt. 1:21): Jesus saved us from our sins.

UNIT 19, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Believers are called to dedicate their lives to God's purposes (Lk. 2:25-38): Simeon and Anna dedicated their lives to serving and worshiping the Lord.

We can worship God with faithful expectation (Lk. 2:25-28): The Holy Spirit revealed to Simeon that he would see the Messiah before he died.

We can share our hope in Jesus with others (Lk. 2:38): After Anna met Jesus, she spoke about him to all who were looking forward to the redemption of Jerusalem.

UNIT 19, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We must seek Jesus above all else (Mt. 2: 9-11): The wise men followed the star to Jesus.

We can worship Jesus with a heart of devotion (Mt. 2:11): The wise men worshiped Jesus and presented him with gifts.

We can follow God's leading in obedience (Mt. 2:12): God warned the wise men in a dream to not go back to Herod, and they obeyed.

UNIT 19, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We grow in wisdom when we seek God (Lk. 2:51): Jesus grew in wisdom as He remained close to His Father.

Living in obedience means trusting in God's timing (Lk. 2:43-46): It was part of God's plan for Jesus to stay back and spend time in the temple.

God prepares us for His plans (Lk. 2:49-52): God used this time in Jesus' life to prepare Him for what was coming next.

UNIT 20, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

We can prepare our hearts for Jesus (Mt. 3:1-6): John the Baptist prepared the way for Jesus.

We can point others to Jesus (Mt. 3:11-12): John the Baptist baptized people with water, and made it known that Jesus would baptize with the Holy Spirit.

God is more powerful than anyone (Mt. 3:7-10): The Pharisees and Sadducees thought they were saved because of their family line, but God is more powerful than anyone.

UNIT 20, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Our obedience honors God (Mt. 3:13-14): Jesus' baptism was an act of obedience to God.

Baptism has shown that a person has chosen to follow Jesus (Mt. 3:15): Jesus asked to be baptized by John the Baptist to fulfill all righteousness.

God affirms our commitment to Him (Mt. 3:16-17): When Jesus was baptized, God spoke from heaven and the Holy Spirit descended upon Jesus.

UNIT 20, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus was tempted (Mt 4:1-2): Jesus was tempted by the devil for forty days and nights while He fasted in the wilderness.

We must recognize the reality of temptation (Mt. 4:1-10): The devil twisted Scripture to tempt Jesus.

We can use God's Word as a defense against temptation (Mt. 4:4-10): Jesus used God's Words to fight temptation and speak Truth to the devil.

UNIT 20, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Following Jesus requires a willing heart (Jn. 1:29-50): Jesus called the disciples, and they responded by following Him.

Following Jesus means recognizing who He is (Jn. 1:34-37): Jesus' disciples heard John refer to Jesus as the Lamb of God and followed Him.

Following Jesus leads to a transformed life (Jn. 1:44-51): At first, Nathanael doubted, but after meeting Jesus, He recognized that He is the Messiah.

UNIT 21, SESSION 1 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus' power leads us to wonder (Jn. 2:9-10): The headwaiter was surprised at what Jesus had created.

Jesus transforms the ordinary (Jn.2:6-9): Jesus turned water into wine.

We can celebrate the work of Jesus (Jn. 2:11-12): The disciples believed Jesus and His power.

UNIT 21, SESSION 2 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

True worship involves reverence (Jn. 2:13-16): Jesus was angry because the temple was intended to be a place of worship, not a place of business.

Jesus cleanses what is unholy (Jn. 2:15-16): Jesus drove out the merchants from the temple.

We can honor God in every area of our lives (Jn. 2:17): God wants us to be passionate about His plan in every part of our lives.

UNIT 21, SESSION 3 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Faith begins with curiosity (Jn. 3:1-2): Nicodemus wanted to know more about Jesus.

Asking questions brings opportunity for growth (Jn 3 :9-13): Nicodemus asked Jesus questions about what He taught.

Jesus calls us to personal faith (Jn. 3:14-21): Nicodemus was a religious leader who knew the law, but he still needed to be born again to enter the kingdom of God.

UNIT 21, SESSION 4 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

True humility points to Jesus (Jn. 3:25-29): John recognized his role in God's plan to make a way for Jesus.

Jesus is greater than all else (Jn. 3:30): Jesus must increase, and we must decrease.

We can be glad when people follow Jesus (Jn. 3:25-26): John's followers were upset that people were going to Jesus, but we should celebrate when others choose to follow Him.

UNIT 21, SESSION 5 - KIDS SERMON OUTLINE

Jesus meets us with love and grace (Jn. 4:1-9): The woman was surprised at the kindness and love that Jesus showed her.

Jesus calls us to a life of holiness (Jn. 4:13-24): Jesus invited the woman to turn away from her sin and live in a God-honoring way.

True belief leads to a transformed life (Jn. 4:25-39): The woman believed the Jesus is the Messiah and shared that message with others, who also believed.
