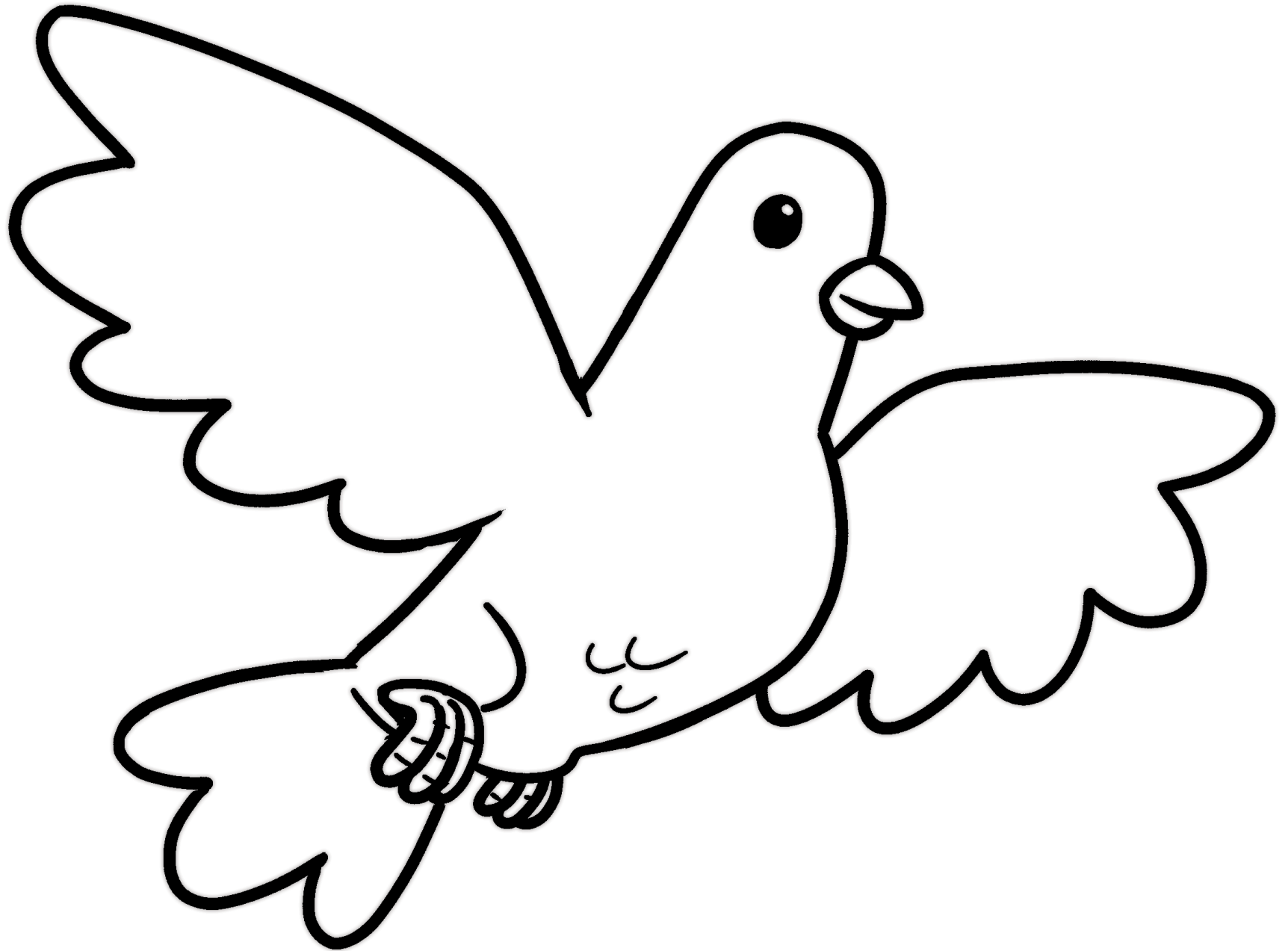


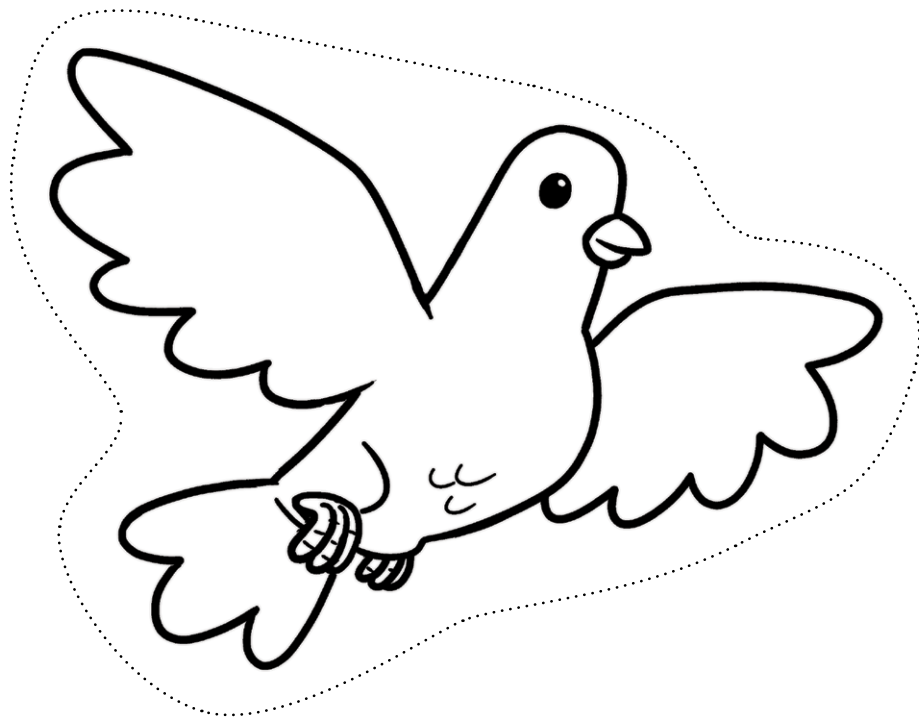

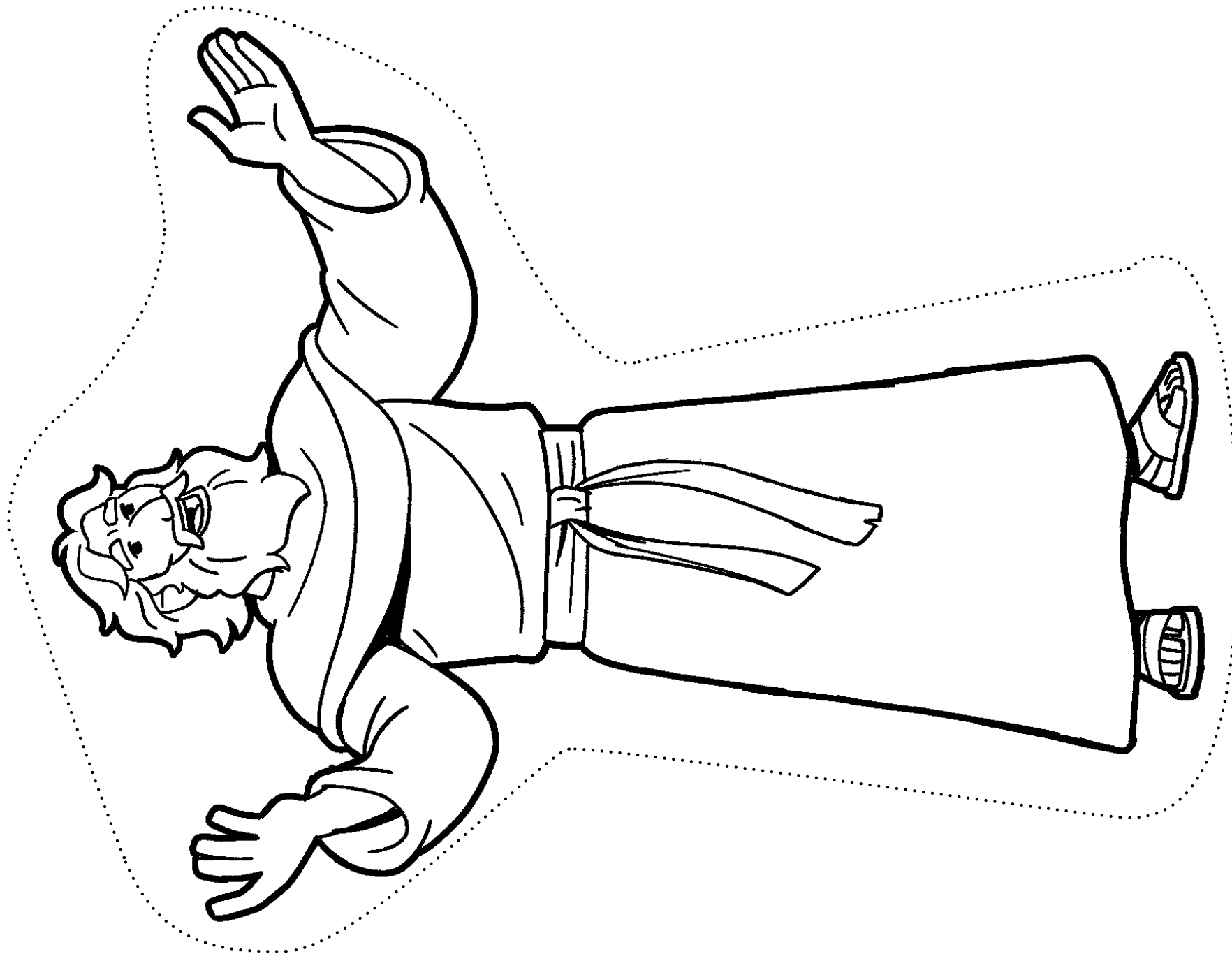

Dave and Amy Knotts in Central Asia

Did you know that many people don't have easy access to a Bible written in their language? But God is making a way for people in Central Asia to learn about Him—even through their phones and computers!

Dave and Amy Knotts are missionaries who want to help people in Central Asia hear about Jesus. Several years ago, they put a simple message on the internet that said: “Do you want to read the Bible in your language?” In just one day, 2,500 people downloaded the Bible!

Dave and Amy realized that technology could help them reach more people in their area. Now, they use things like videos, websites, and special apps to tell the good news about Jesus. Some of the people they reach live in places where there are no churches. Others live in countries where talking about Jesus is not allowed. But even in those places, people can learn about God through their phones and computers!

Amy and Dave's team makes videos and messages to help people understand that God sees them and loves them. One message they share says: “Do you feel ashamed? God sees you and wants to walk with you.” When people see these messages online, they can send a message back to learn more. A team of Christian helpers is ready to answer their questions and tell them more about Jesus!

Sometimes, these online conversations lead to something even bigger. People start reading the Bible, praying, and meeting other Christians. Some even start new churches! Isn't it amazing how God can use the internet to spread His love?

Everyday Conversations

Josh* is a missionary who lives in Central Asia. Every day, he talks to people and tells the people stories about Jesus. But Josh didn't just start talking about Jesus right away. He listened carefully and looked for moments when he could tell others about God's love. If someone talked about the weather, Josh could start talking about God, who created everything!

One day, Josh was chatting with a man whose name was "Good News." Josh smiled and said, "Did you know that the word gospel means 'good news'? It's the good news about Jesus!"

Just then, two other men walked in. The first man's name was Abraham, and the second man's name meant "salvation." Josh laughed and said, "Wow! It's like God brought us all together for something special."

Josh told the men how God gave us the greatest gift. A long time ago, God promised a man named Abraham that one of his family members would bless the whole world. That promise came true when Jesus came to save people from their sins!

As Josh told the story, another man named Hussein walked in. Hussein said something surprising: "I came here because Isa (EE suh) sent me." Isa is how people in Central Asia say the name Jesus!

Like Josh, we can listen for moments to tell people about God's love. Every name, every conversation, and every day can be an opportunity to tell someone about Jesus.
