

Set 1 – Creation

T-God created the world in six days and rested on the seventh day.
(Genesis 1-2:2)

T-God made humans in His own image. (Genesis 1:27)

F-God created land animals before sea animals. (Sea animals came first.
Genesis 20-25)

Set 2 – The Garden of Eden

F-God encouraged Adam and Eve to eat from every tree in the garden.
(They were instructed not to eat from the tree in the middle of the garden.
Genesis 3:3)

T-A serpent tempted Eve to eat the fruit. (Genesis 3:1-6)

T-God made clothing for Adam and Eve after they sinned. (Genesis 3:21)

Set 3 – Noah’s Ark

F-Noah built the ark just because he liked boats. (God told him to build it.
Genesis 6:13-14)

T-It rained for 40 days and 40 nights. (Genesis 7:12)

T-God made a rainbow as a promise never to flood the whole earth again.
(Genesis 9:13-15)

Set 4 – Abraham and Sarah

T-God promised Abram that his family would be as many as the stars in the
sky. (Genesis 15:5)

F-Abraham’s wife Sarah had a baby when she was very young. (She was
very old. Genesis 21:1-2)

T-Their son’s name was Isaac. (Genesis 21:3)

Set 5 – Daniel

F-Daniel stopped praying to God so he wouldn’t get in trouble. (He kept
praying. Daniel 6:10)

T-Daniel was thrown into a den of lions. (Daniel 6:16)

T-God sent an angel to protect Daniel from the lions. (Daniel 6:22)

Set 6 – Jonah

F-Jonah was happy to go to Nineveh at first. (He ran away. Jonah 1:3)

T-Jonah was swallowed by a big fish. (Jonah 1:17)

T-The people of Nineveh listened to Jonah and turned back to God.
(Jonah 3:5-10)

Set 7 – Jesus’ Life

T-Jesus was born in Bethlehem. (Luke 2:4-7)

T-Jesus was baptized in the Jordan River. (Matthew 3:13)

F-Jesus’ first miracle was healing a blind man. (His first miracle was turning
water into wine. John 2:1-11)

Set 8 – Jesus’ Death and Resurrection

T-Jesus died on a cross to take away our sins. (Matthew 27:35)

F-Jesus stayed in the tomb forever. (He rose on the third day. Matthew 28:6)

T-When the women came to Jesus’ tomb, the stone had been rolled away.
(Mark 16:4)

Set 9 – The Early Church

T-The Holy Spirit came to the disciples on Pentecost. (Acts 2:1-4)

T-The early believers shared what they had with each other. (Acts 2:44-45)

F-Peter and Paul (also called Saul) were both disciples of Jesus
before His resurrection. (Paul/Saul became a believer after Jesus’
resurrection. Acts 9)

Set 10 – The Fruit of the Spirit

T-The fruit of the Spirit includes love, joy, and peace. (Galatians 5:22-23)

F-The fruit of the Spirit includes anger and jealousy. (Those are works of the
flesh, not the Spirit. Galatians 5:19-21)

T-The Holy Spirit helps us grow good fruit in our lives. (Galatians 5:22-25)



Noah builds a big boat to save his family and animals from a great flood. (Genesis)

God helps a young shepherd defeat a giant warrior named Goliath. (1 Samuel)

God parts the Red Sea so His people can escape from Pharaoh's army. (Exodus)

A man is swallowed by a big fish after trying to run away from God. (Jonah)

A brave woman becomes queen and saves her people from danger. (Esther)

Daniel is thrown into a den of lions, but God keeps him safe all night long. (Daniel)

An angel tells Mary she will give birth to God's Son. (Luke)

Jesus feeds more than 5,000 people with just five loaves of bread and two fish. (John, Matthew, Mark, Luke)

Jesus tells a story about a man who finds a treasure in a field and sells everything to buy it. (Matthew)

Paul and Silas sing praises to God while they're in prison, and God sent an earthquake to set them free. (Acts)

John sees a vision of heaven and the new creation God will make one day. (Revelation)

Bible Detectives: Jesus Calms the Storm

Mark 4:35-41

- 35 On that day, when evening had come, he told them, “Let’s cross over to the other side of the sea.”
- 36 So they left the crowd and took him along since he was in the boat. And other boats were with him.
- 37 A great windstorm arose, and the waves were breaking over the boat, so that the boat was already being swamped.
- 38 He was in the stern, sleeping on the cushion. So they woke him up and said to him, “Teacher! Don’t you care that we’re going to die?”
- 39 He got up, rebuked the wind, and said to the sea, “Silence! Be still!” The wind ceased, and there was a great calm.
- 40 Then he said to them, “Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?”
- 41 And they were terrified and asked one another, “Who then is this? Even the wind and the sea obey him!”

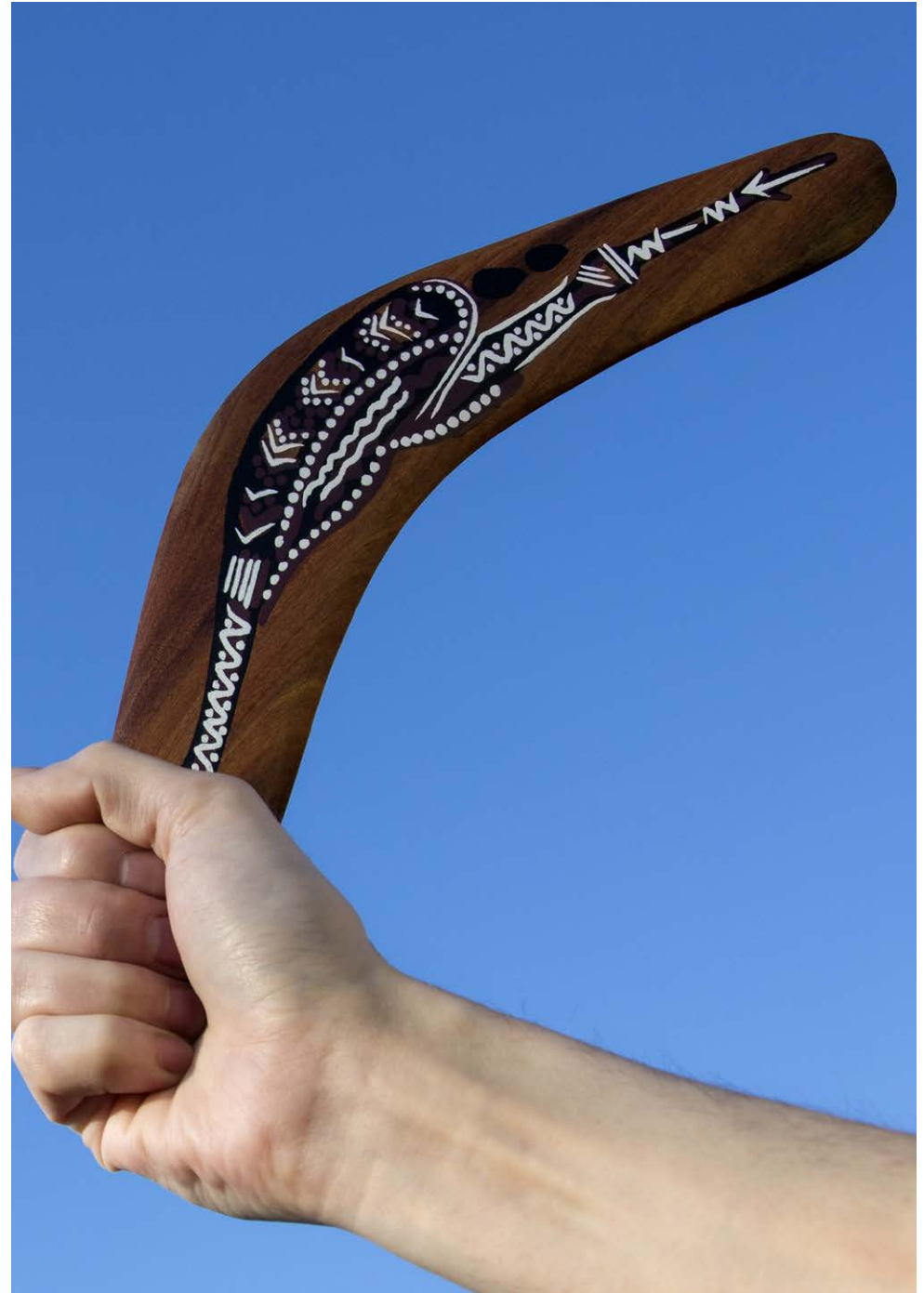

always true!”)







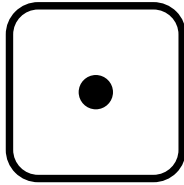




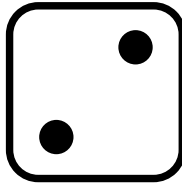
ROLL GENEROSITY
