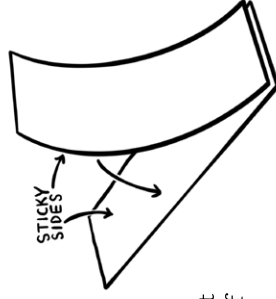


Prayer Reminder Wristband Instructions



Supplies:

- ☐ duct tape
- ☐ scissors
- ☐ wet wipes (for wiping scissors blades if the tape leaves a sticky residue)
- ☐ self-adhesive Velcro® dots
- ☐ markers
- ☐ stickers



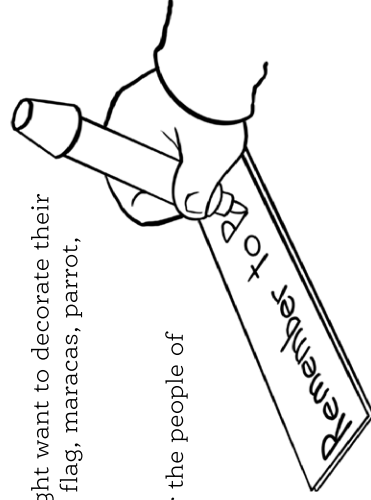
Instructions:

Step 1: Stick two strips of duct tape together back-to-back about 6–8 inches in length to fit the wrists of the kids. (Kids can use two different colors of duct tape to make the wristbands reversible.) Trim the ends if necessary to make the ends even and straight.



Step 2: Lead kids to stick one Velcro® dot on the end of one side and the other Velcro® dot on the end of the opposite side from the first dot.

Step 3: Invite kids to write **Remember to pray** on their wristbands as a reminder to pray for Puerto Rico. They might want to decorate their wristbands with other icons like a coquí frog, Puerto Rican flag, maracas, parrot, and so forth. They can attach stickers as well.



Tell kids to wear their wristbands as a reminder to pray for the people of Puerto Rico and the missionaries serving on the island.
