"The Truth About Jesus and Temptation" Luke 4:1

If Jesus truly is the Son of God, He must pass the tests

and handle temptations!

John 19:4, II Corinthians 5:21,

Hebrews 7:26,27- "For it is fitting that we should have such a high priest, holy, innocent, undefiled, separated from sinners and exalted above the heavens; who does not need daily, like those high priests, to offer up sacrifices, first for his own sins, and then for the sins of the people, because this He did once for all when He offered up Himself."

In what ways was Jesus tempted and anyone else tempted?

I John 2:15-17- "Do not love the world, nor the things in the world. If any one loves the world, the love of the Father is not in him. For all that is in the world, the lust of the flesh and the lust of the eyes and the boastful pride of life, is not from the Father, but is from the world. And the world is passing away, and also its lusts; but the one who does the will of God abides forever."

- 1. Jesus was tempted physically (the lust of the flesh)
 - tempted with desires to meet a need that is good in a

bad way. Luke 4:1-4

Jesus quoted <u>Scripture</u> - *Deuteronomy 8:3,* John 4:31-34

2. Jesus was tempted <u>mentally</u> and <u>emotionally</u> -(the lust of the eyes)- tempted with thoughts of <u>doubt</u> and feelings to escape <u>painful</u> hardships. *Luke 4:5-8*

Jesus quoted <u>Scripture</u>. Deuteronomy 6:3, James 5:10-11

- 3. Jesus was tempted <u>spiritually</u> (the pride of life)
 - tempted with thoughts of putting God to the <u>test</u> and not submitting to His revealed <u>plan.</u> *Luke 4:9-13*

Jesus quoted <u>Scripture</u> Deuteronomy 6:16, Luke 22:42, Psalm 119:105
