Personal Time with God- Proverbs

Setting aside an intentional time with God is so important in growing your relationship with God. Often we will look to others to feed us God's Word, but we can go directly to the source of truth. We invite you this week to begin reading through the book of Proverbs a chapter a day, answer a few questions, and have a meaningful prayer time. The Lord taught us how to pray in Matthew 6:7-13: P.R.A.Y. (Praise, Request God's will to be done and Kingdom to come, Ask for physical and spiritual needs, Yield to God to resist sin). Prayer is "intimacy with God that leads to the fulfillment of His purposes."
