4. Read John 13:10-11. It appears that Jesus washed the feet of Judas Iscariot along with the other disciples. What does this teach you about Jesus' servant attitude?

- 5. Read John 13:12-17. According to verse 17, what does Jesus say will be the result of following His example? How have you experienced blessings in your own life after serving another? Describe that experience.
- 6. "Actions speak louder than words." Read 1 John 3:16-18. While you will probably never have to lay down your life for another like Jesus did, it is only a matter of time before you encounter a person in need. What are practical, simple and effective ways you can meet the need(s) of another? How could we do this as a Life Group? (If there is a known need in your group, together create a plan of action to help meet that need.)
- 7. "Treat others as royalty." Read Romans 12:10. Who can you honor in your life this week? What's something you could do for them that could cause them to say, "Thank you you're the greatest!"?

Luke 22:23-30

In teaching His disciples about greatness, notice what Jesus does not do:

- Jesus does not rebuke His disciples; He teaches them
- Jesus does not <u>condemn their desire to be great; rather, He</u> encourages them

In teaching His disciples about greatness, notice the contrast Jesus makes:

- The world embraces <u>authority</u> Luke 22:25
- Christ embraces <u>humility</u> Luke 22:26

How can I become the G.O.A.T. to those around me?

 Replace your definition of "greatness" from the world to Christ Luke 22:26

 By assuming the place of least <u>power</u> -- like the <u>youngest</u>
Luke 9:46-50

 By assuming the place of least <u>position</u> -- like a <u>servant</u> John 13:1-17

- 2. Remember the example of Christ Luke 22:27
 - Jesus <u>vacated His place of power</u> *Philippians 2:6*
 - Jesus <u>vacated His place of position</u> Philippians 2:7

Like the disciples, what if I fail to become the G.O.A.T.?

- 1. Rejoice you have a great <u>advocate</u> in Christ 1 John 2:1-2
- 2. Rejoice you have a great <u>future</u> with Christ 2 *Timothy 2:11-12a*
