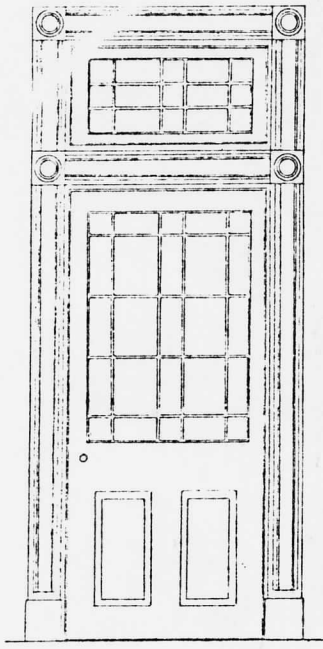

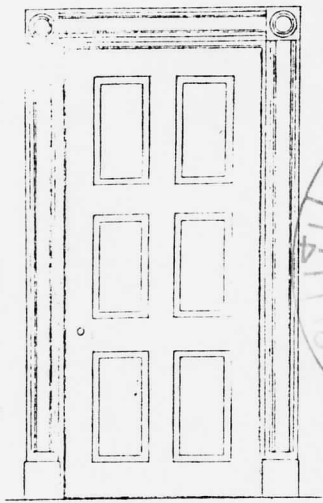
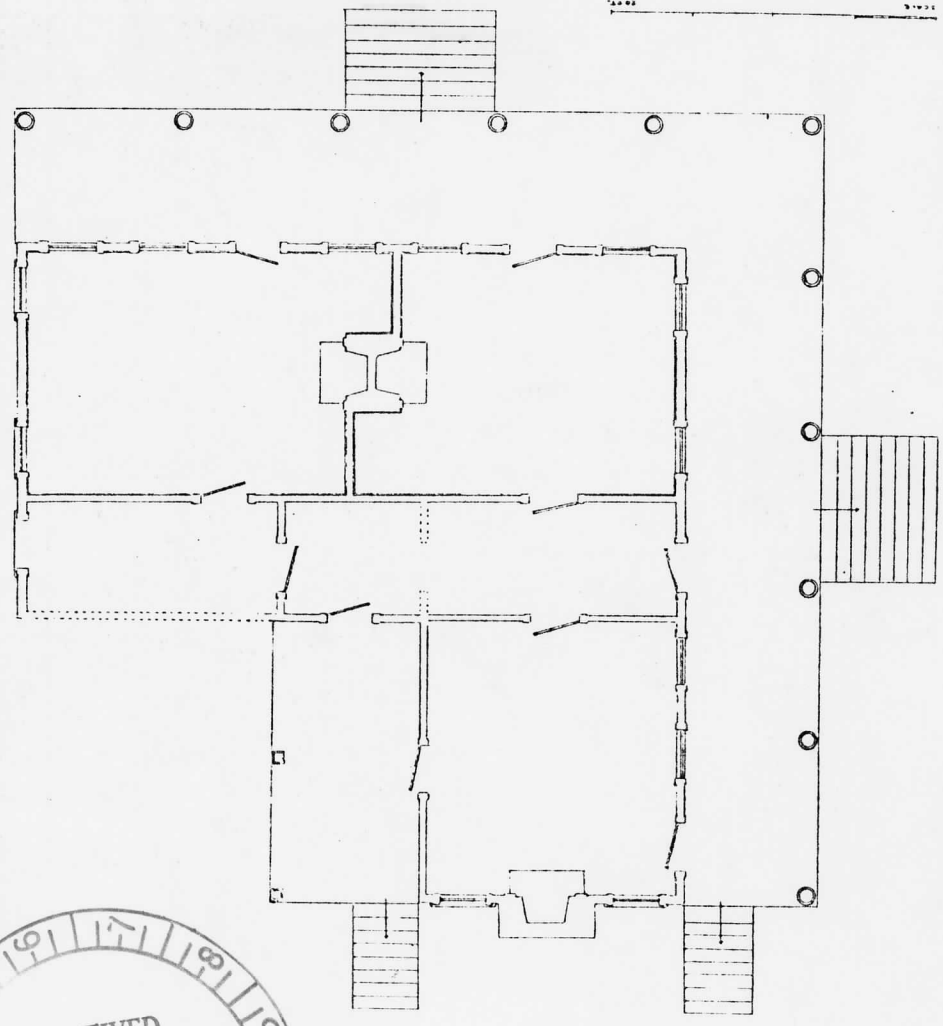

SIGNIFICANCE: This is the first constructed and certainly the oldest stylistically of three L-shaped cottages with L-shaped verandas (the other two are Little Berry Pippen #9-early 1840's and Daniel Wright House #10 - 1847). Termed a Creole Cottage by Clay Lancaster, it shares the cut-under porches of that style and like many of the Louisiana and South Carolina coastal dwellings, it is raised on brick piers.

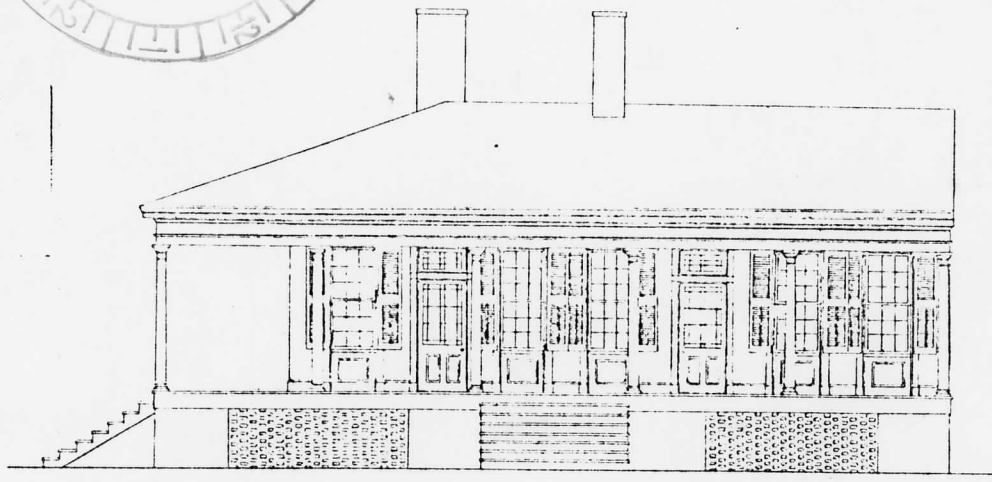
DESCRIPTION: The Vaughn House has an L plan featuring a porch running along the two outer sides, making a double front, toward the east and south, the latter seeming inexplicable as it faced the back of the Reese carriage shop. Eleven round colonnettes support the entablature, and the roof has a hip at the angle and gables at the ends. Walls are of flush boards on the porch and clapboards elsewhere. Doors and windows on the gallery are closely spaced, the doors with glass in and transoms over them, and windows paneled beneath. Frames are similar to those of the Asa White (#3) house. An external chimney is on the west end, and a second shaft is between the two east rooms. The plan is unusual, consisting primarily of three large rooms and connecting halls. The room at the corner would have been the parlor, and that at the west end (nearest the kitchen in the yard) must have been used for dining. This leaves the remaining room for a bed chamber, which is slightly larger than either of the others. As in the two south rooms of the Dr. John C. Anderson house on Prairie Street, the partition staggers to either side of the back-to-back fireplaces, allotting one space to each room on the east front of the Vaughn house. These two rooms alone have chairrailing. Interior doors have six equal panels. The only remarkable chimneypiece is that in the west (dining) room, with pilasters, and panels in their impost and center fascia board.

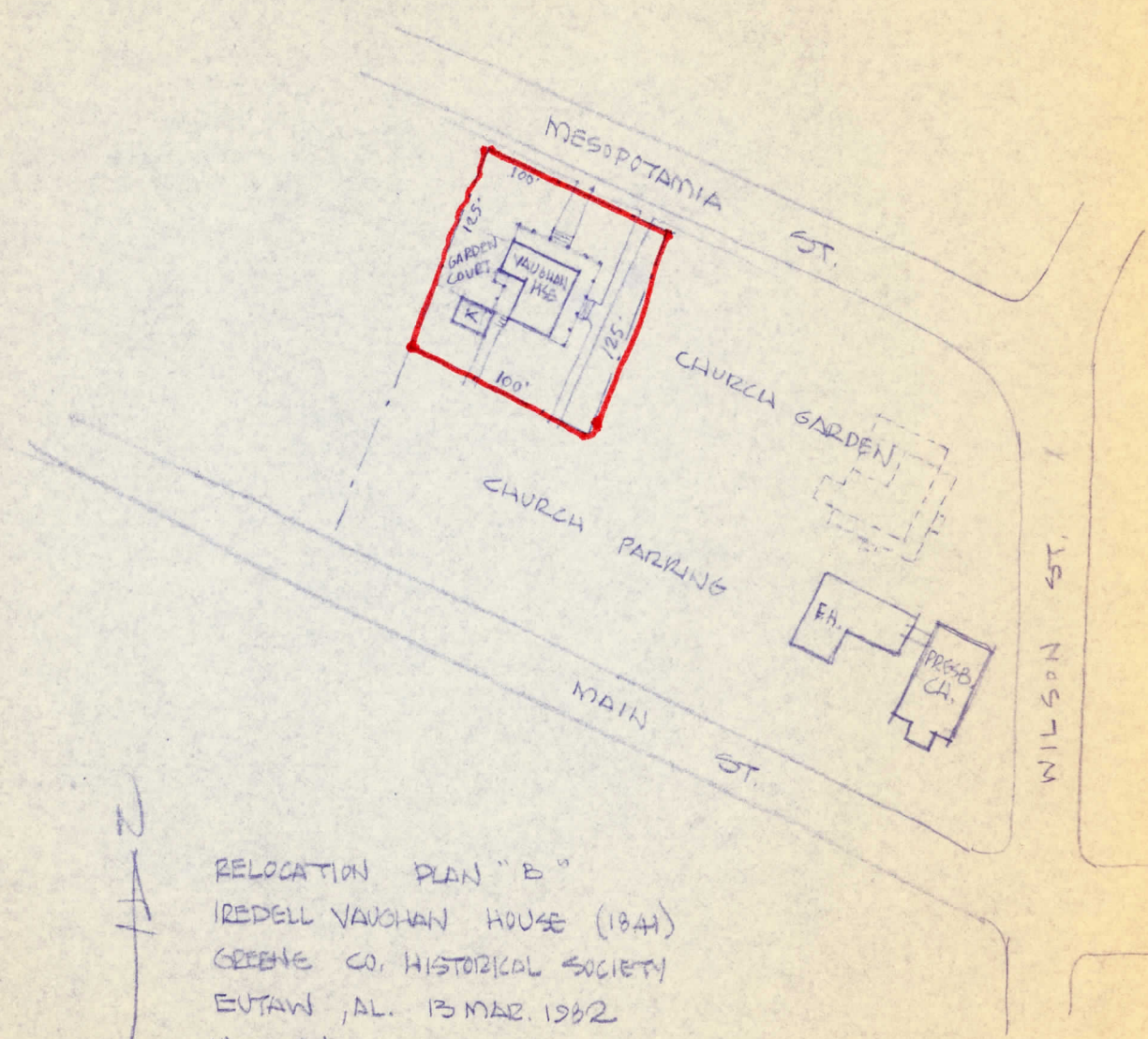

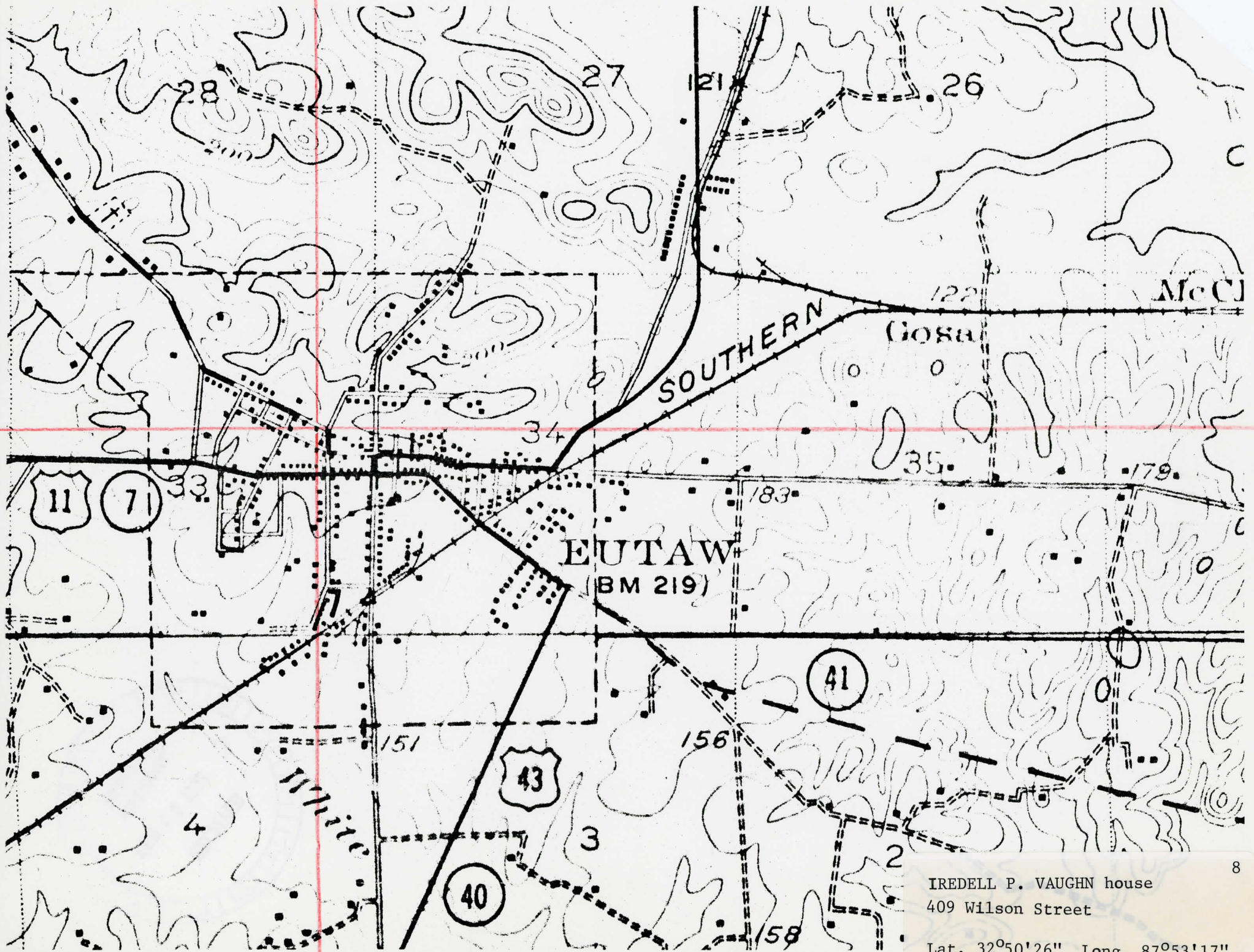

The Iredell P. Vaughan House, 409 Wilson Street, Eutaw, Greene County, Alabama, which was listed on the National Register of Historic Places on April 2, 1982, was moved on its original lot in March of 1982 to avoid its demolition by the Presbyterian Church. The building was moved approximately 50 yards to the rear of its original lot and reoriented to face Mesopotamia Street (North rather than the original East). An inspection by our staff determined that the building had not been damaged in the move. A plan showing the relocation of the house and the new boundaries is attached for your files. Also enclosed are photographs of the house on its new location.

We hope this submission will clarify the status of the house as far as its listing on the National Register is concerned. You may also wish to change your file to indicate that the new owner is the Greene County Historical Society, 111 Kirkwood Drive, Eutaw, Alabama 35462.
