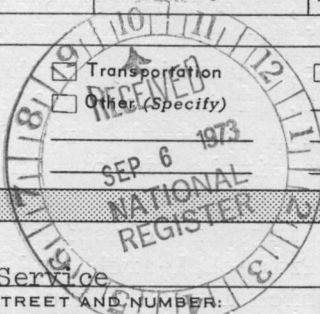

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The design of the gateposts is generally attributed to Charles Bulfinch who in 1814 was commissioned to do the Capitol restoration. Until 1874, the gateposts stood at the foot of the west capitol grounds, but in that year were moved to their present locations. The gateposts are 4 sandstone pillars measuring 5' x 5' at the base and approximately 12' in height.

The design of the gateposts is classical. Horizontal bands, around the top of the pillars, are carved out of the posts and they are topped with a frieze relief matching the one atop the gatehouses. The design atop the posts is again a classical motif, voluted using the stylized acanthus leaf form.

Gatehouses

These are two gatehouses attributed to Charles Bulfinch, which formerly stood on the west Capitol grounds. They are now located on the Northwest corner of 15th Street and Constitution Avenue and on the Northeast corner of 17th Street and Constitution Avenue.

Basically, the two gatehouses are identical in design though there are slight differences. The gatehouses are one-room structures built of sandstone, measuring, at the base, 15'8" across the front and 15'7" across the sides. Twin stone pillars 3'7-1/2" in circumference and approximately 9-1/2' high frame the arched doorway. The rear wall is plain stone and there are single windows in each structure on the side walls.

The buildings are classical in design, using modified doric columns, and a Roman-Triumphal-arch styled doorway with curved molding. There is a frieze which is continuous around the top of the building, matching the frieze around the top of the gateposts. Atop the frieze is a heavily foliated scroll using the acanthus leaf and rosettes. The four corners of the gatehouses employ the same horizontal bands as the gateposts.

The two gatehouses differ in that the columns surrounding the doorway of the structure at 15th Street and Constitution Avenue rise directly out of the pavement whereas the columns on the other structure are set on cement block supports. The 15th Street and Constitution Avenue Gatehouse also uses only six horizontal bands at the corners, while the other gatehouse uses seven. The 17th Street gatehouse rests on a cobbled brick foundation with the 15th Street gatehouse resting on a cement foundation.

The 15th Street gatehouse has a temporary frame structure appended to its rear wall, apparently for use in construction and maintenance storage.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Capitol gateposts and gatehouses were designed to harmonize with the basement story of the Capitol. In 1834, in a guide to the Capitol, they were described as "...four grand entrances to these grounds, two from the north and south for carriages, and two from the east and west for foot passengers. The western entrance at the foot of the hill, is flanked by two stone lodges, highly ornamented for watch houses,..."

The two gatehouses and four gateposts are allegedly the work of Charles Bulfinch, the architect who planned the restoration of the Capitol and its grounds after its burning in 1814 by the British. Bulfinch was the first native American architect to have charge of the construction of the Capitol. He was appointed Capitol architect in 1817 and set out to complete the plans of his predecessors. Outstanding features of his completed design were the original low dome on the building, constructed of wood and covered with copper.

The gatehouses were originally part of Bulfinch's Capitol scheme but in 1874 were removed from their original location and in 1880 were reconstructed on their present sites. In 1940, at the instigation of the Fine Arts Commission, the gatehouses which had settled slightly due to continued flooding were raised and repaired in keeping with their significance in relation to the development of the Capitol of the United States.

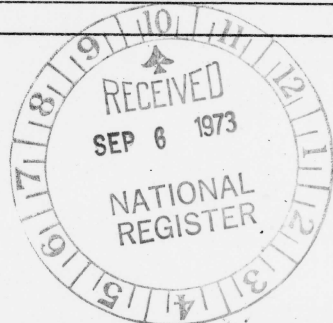
