Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Sam Jones Memorial United Methodist Church is a Classical Revival building with a full metal and stucco entablature and a portico supported by four Corinthian columns. The front entrance is reached by steps leading from the sidewalk. The church is built of beige brick with granite trim and rough-hewn granite blocks for the half basement and contains three floors. The below-ground half-basement contains a modernized meeting and dining room. The main floor contains a two-story sanctuary with its original pews, fluted Corinthian pilasters, original wainscoting, and a rounded-arch altar or chancel area. Stained glass windows were added in 1945. The original two levels of Sunday School rooms behind the altar area are now occupied by offices, a memorial room, a parsonage room, and a library on the main floor and choir rehearsal rooms and storage rooms on the upper level. Original brass hardware remains throughout as do the original steam heat and electrical fixtures. The grounds contain a small lawn and low shrubbery. There are no outbuildings on the nominated parcel. The church is surrounded by publicly owned property including the Bartow County Courthouse and city and county office buildings. Changes include the excavation of the basement in 1933 and addition and changes to the room created there, the addition of stained glass windows in 1945, the remodeling of the chancel or altar area in 1973, and the installation of a new organ.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Sam Jones Memorial United Methodist Church is significant in architecture as a fine example of a church built in the Classical Revival Style exemplified by the use of a full entablature and portico. It is also significant as a work of Walter T. Downing (1865–1918), and Atlanta architect, noted for his finely designed houses, churches, and a variety of other structures. The church is significant in local history as the current house of one of the county's oldest Methodist church congregations. The Methodists, since the 1830s, have been one of the two major faiths in Cartersville, as in most Georgia cities. Since this church was built, its membership has played a major role in the town of Cartersville through leadership positions in the community. It is also significant for having been named for one of Cartersville's most famous citizens, the nationally known evangelist Sam P. Jones (1847–1906), a member of the church, whose sudden death in 1906 during the church's construction led the congregation to name it as a memorial to him. These areas of significance support the property's eligibility under National Register Criteria A and C.

The Sam Jones United Methodist Church is the present edifice for a congregation that has had a long history in Cartersville, Georgia.

The town of Cartersville was created in the early 1840s as the railroad reached the region. The county (then called Cass) was created in 1832 but it was not until 1838 that the Cherokee Indians were officially removed. The original county seat was Cassville, established 1833, north of present-day Cartersville. This Methodist church body was first organized as "Ebenezer Church" and the first log church building erected by 1838 on land donated by John Leake within the present boundaries of Oak Hill cemetery, several miles north of the present church. As Cartersville developed, and more Methodists arrived, they grew tired of trying to reach the Ebenezer Church overland. The church body was soon moved to Cartersville where a wooden church was built on the present site of the Sam Jone Memorial Chruch on land donated by Col. Lewis Tumlin and others. In 1848, Dr. William H. Felton (later a congressman) preached the first sermon in the new church. At the time of the move, Cartersville had only 150 citizens. The Methodist church is said to have been the first one built within the city limits of Cartersville. The Presbyterians built in 1853 and the Baptist in 1856.

The church building survived the Civil War, although the other faiths lost their structures. In 1867, after Cassville was heavily damaged in the Civil War, Cartersville became the county seat for the renamed Bartow County.

In June 1872, a second church was dedicated on the original lot. It was brick, seated close to 700 people, and had a one hundred-foot spire. The membership reached 200 that year. By the turn of the century, the church decided a still larger building was needed. As construction began, one of the church's members and the town's most famous citizen, the Methodist evangelist Sam P. Jones, died. A church conference was held and it was decided to name the church as a memorial to Sam Jones. The new edifice included the pews and chancel from the 1872 church.

When the new church opened in 1907, it had the first pipe organ in Cartersville. The first service was the annual meeting on November 7, 1907 of the North Georgia Conference of the Methodist Episcopal Church South, the official name of the Methodist at the time.

The church has continued to meet in the 1907 facility since its dedication. A fellowship and recreation hall were added in 1933 when the basement was excavated. The hall was named to honor Wat Mabry who assisted in the digging but was accidentally killed about the time it was completed. In 1945, 17 stained glass windows were added to the sanctuary. These were designed by Joseph V. Llorens, a noted stained glass artist, and installed by his studio. In 1960, a three-story educational building that included a parlor and a chapel was built behind the sanctuary (it is not being included with the historic, nominated property).

Further remodeling took place in 1973 when the chancel was divided and the pulpit area extended to lengthen the chancel. The choir loft was redesigned to include more room for a new pipe organ. A Memorial Room was also established that included pictures of all former pastors but one and special items related to Sam Jones.

The church has been active in community affairs throughout its existence. At about the time the 1907 edifice was completed, the Home Missionary Society inaugurated a settlement house called "Hay Town" which was rented for meetings, nurses classes, and Sunday School. The women of the church have always had organized activities based on study, worship and service.

From the time this building was built until 1939 the official name of the faith was "Methodist Episcopal Church, South". From 1939-1968 it was known as the "Methodist Church" and since 1968 as the "United Methodist Church".

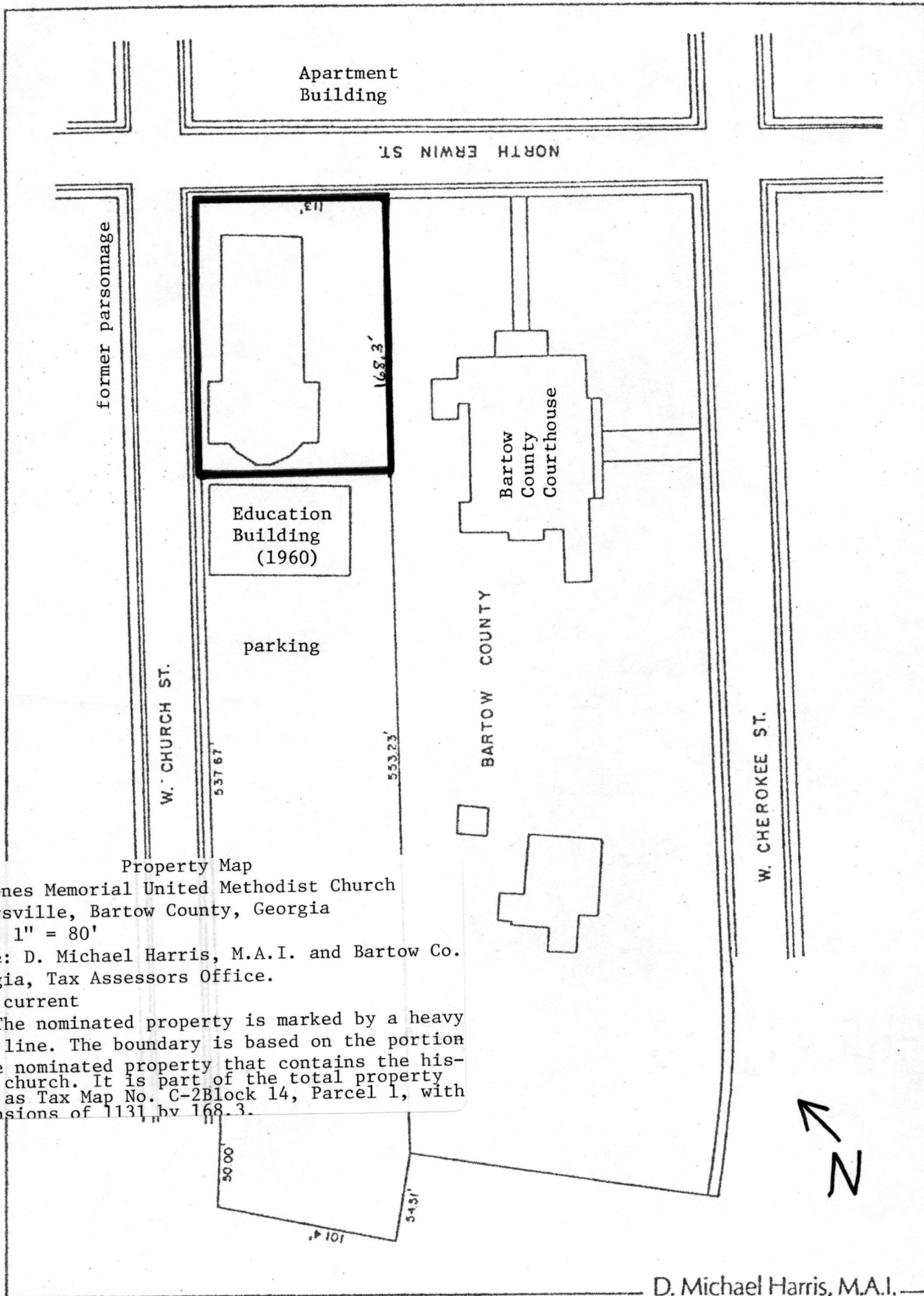

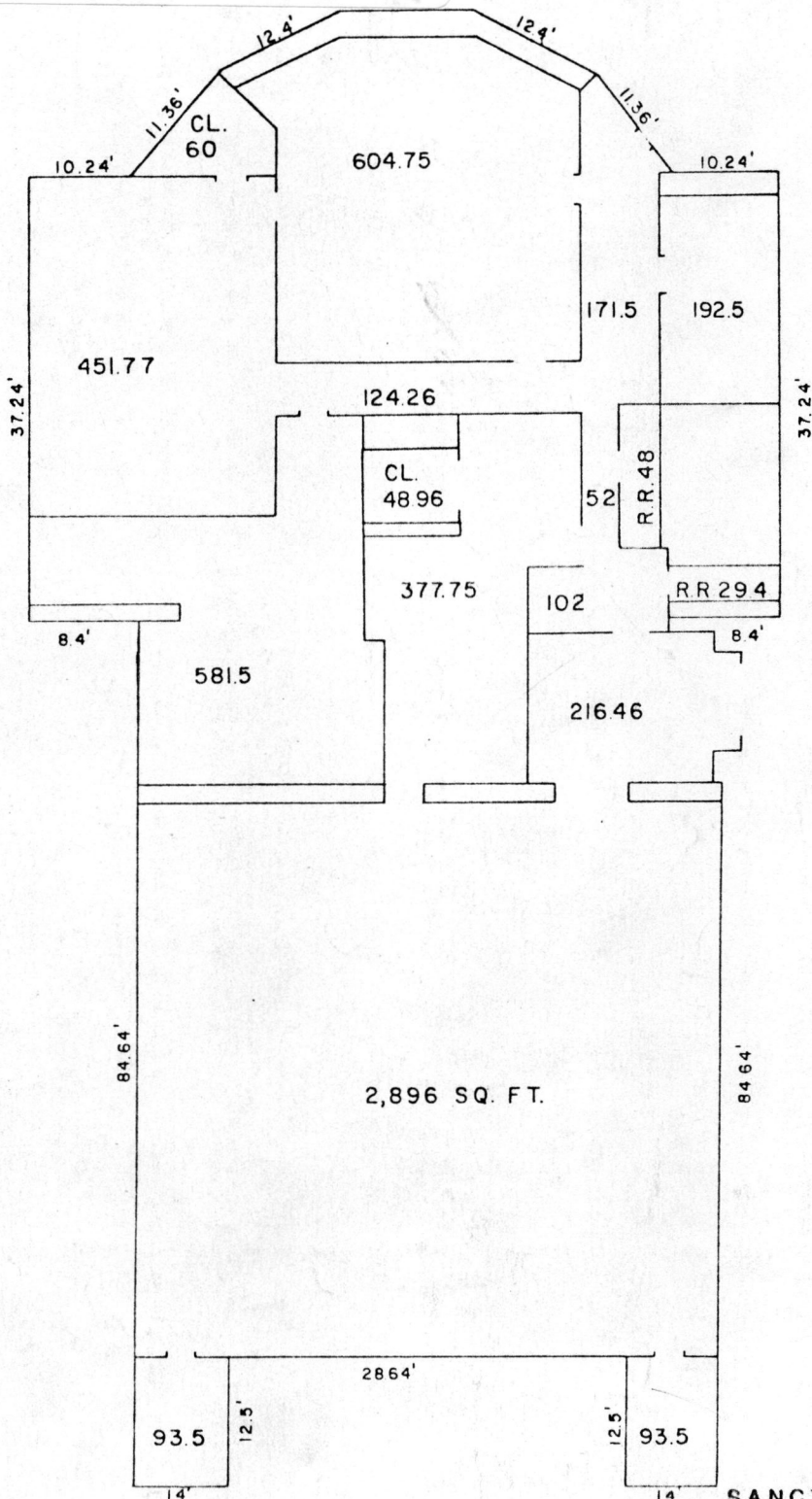

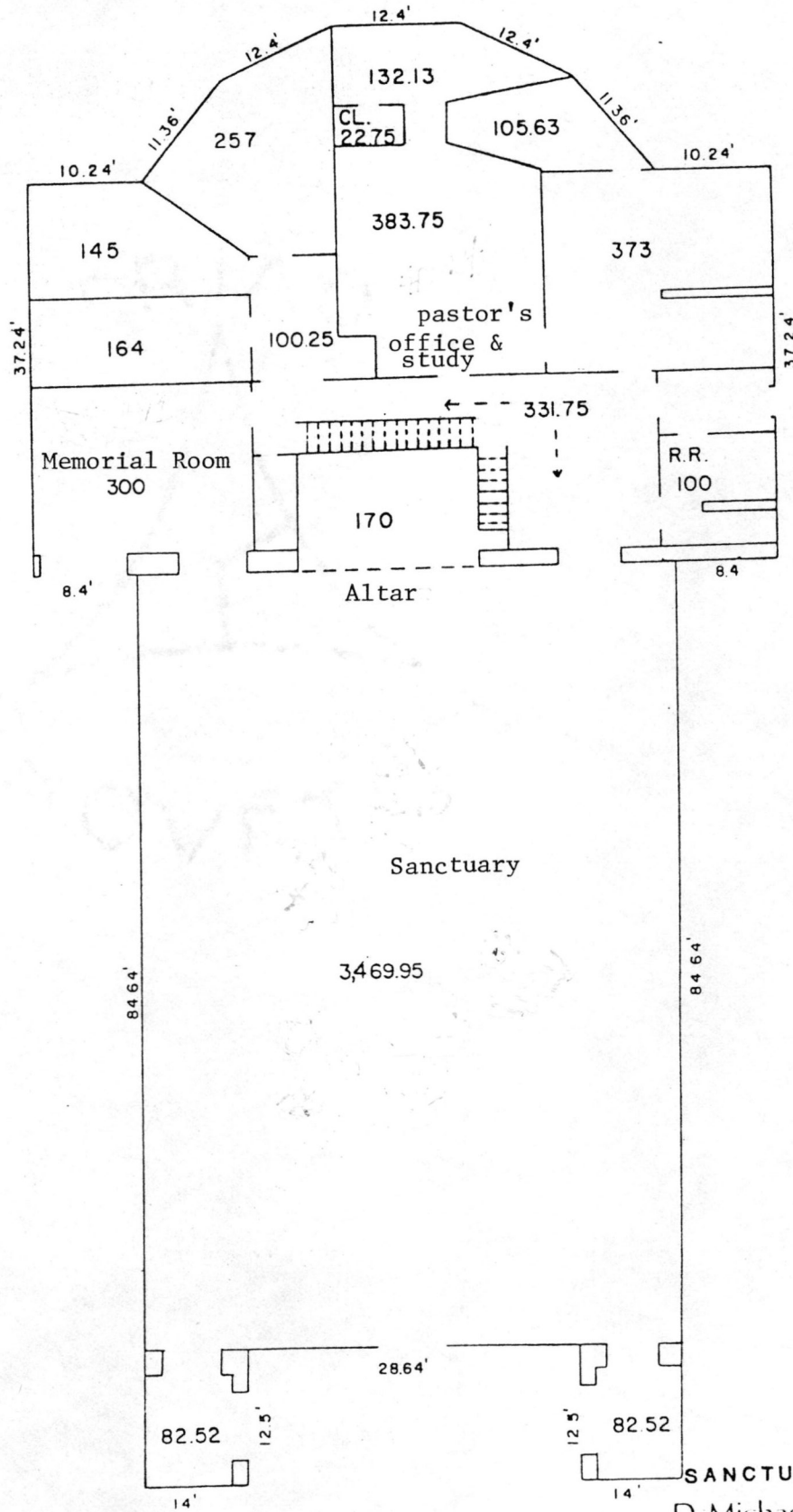


SANCTUARY BUILDING

Main Floor of Sanctuary Building

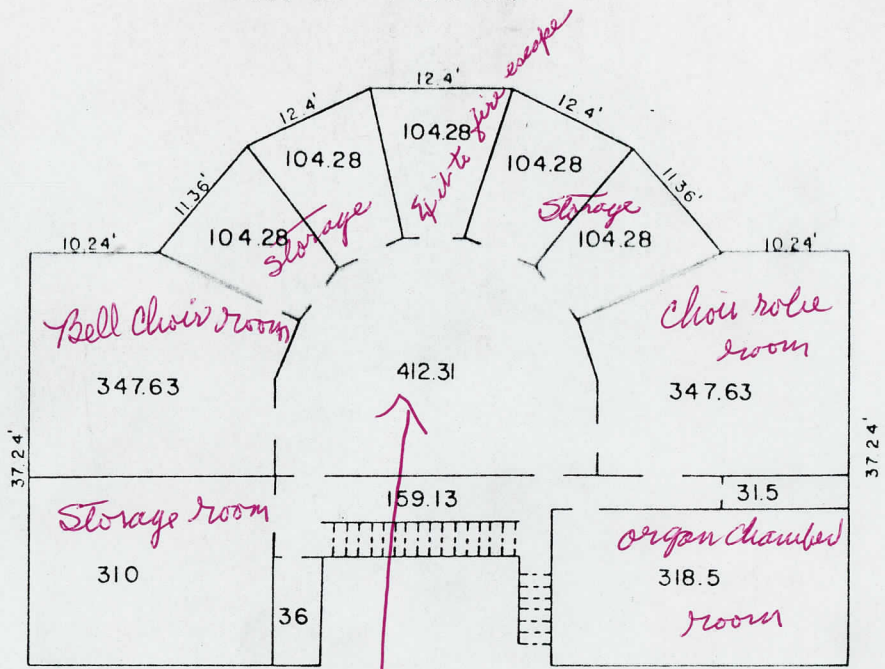
MAIN FLOOR PLAN

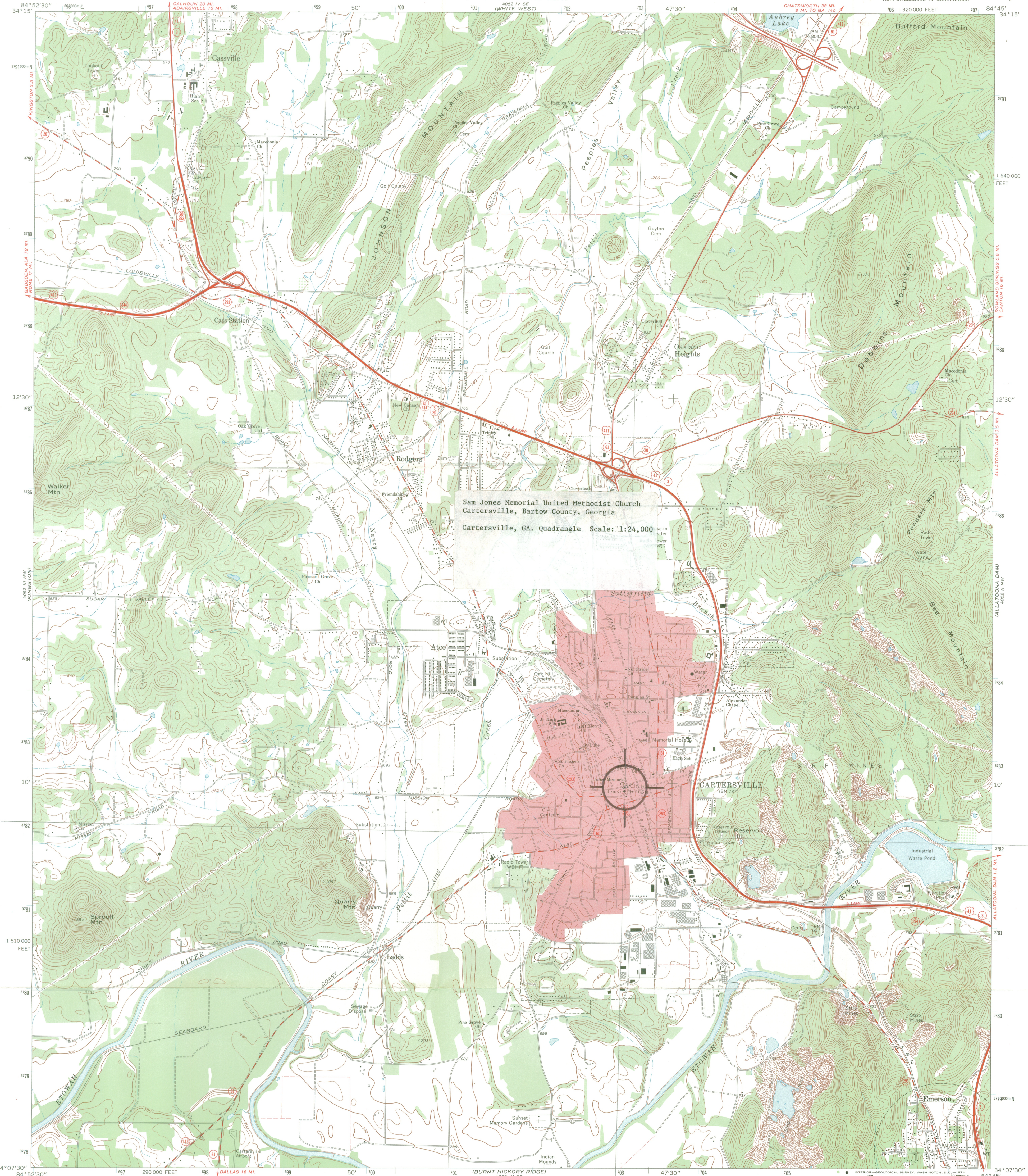

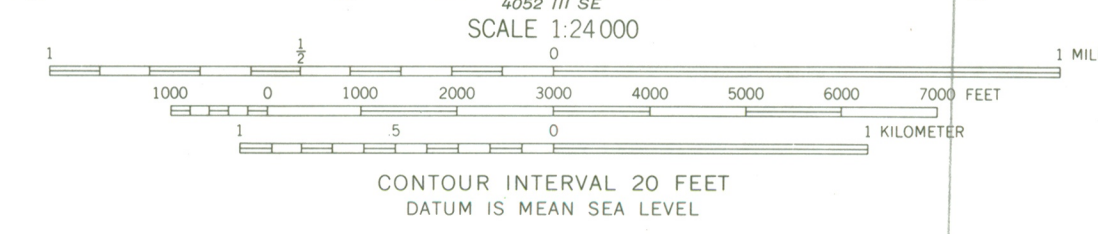
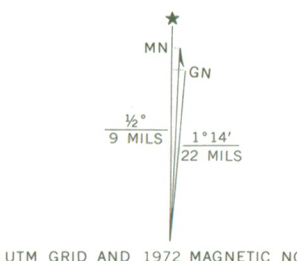

DEAR MR. CLOUES:

THE ETOWAH VALLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY LEARNS WITH INTEREST THE PROPOSED NOMINATION OF THE SAM JONES UNITED METHODIST CHURCH, 100 WEST CHURCH STREET, CARTERSVILLE, GEORGIA, TO THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES.

THE NOMINATION IS SCHEDULED FOR REVIEW AT THE REVIEW BOARD MEETING ON JANUARY 10TH, 1985.

OUR SOCIETY HAS LONG RECOGNIZED THE CHURCH'S OUTSTANDING ARCHITECTURE AND LOCAL HISTORY. IT WAS THE FIRST CHURCH CONSTRUCTED IN OUR CITY, DATING FROM 1848. THE 1848 CHURCH SUSTAINED DAMAGE DURING THE CIVIL WAR. IT WAS THE ONLY CHURCH LEFT USABLE AFTER THE DEPARTURE OF FEDERAL FORCES AND WAS USED AFTER BEING REPAIRED JOINTLY BY THE METHODIST, BAPTIST AND PRESBYTERIAN CONGREGATIONS. IN 1872 THIS WOODEN STRUCTURE WAS REPLACED ON THE SAME SITE BY A BRICK BUILDING, WHICH SERVED UNTIL THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PRESENT STRUCTURE IN 1907, ALSO ON THE SAME SITE. THE PRESENT STRUCTURE WAS NAMED FOR THE NATIONALLY KNOWN EVANGELIST SAM P. JONES WHOSE SUDDEN DEATH IN 1906 DURING THE CHURCH'S CONSTRUCTION LED THE MEMBERSHIP TO NAME IT IN MEMORY OF HIM.

IN VIEW OF THE ABOVE AREAS OF SIGNIFICANCE, THE ETOWAH VALLEY HISTORICAL SOCIETY HIGHLY RECOMMENDS THAT THE SAM JONES MEMORIAL UNITED METHODIST CHURCH BE PLACED ON THE NATIONAL REGISTER OF HISTORIC PLACES AND WOULD APPRECIATE THE APPROVAL OF THE REVIEW BOARD.
