DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Sioux City Central High School Building was constructed in 1892 of rough-hewn, brownish-pink Lake Superior sandstone and is of strong and heavy Romanesque-Gothic design. A centrally-located, castellated bell tower marks the main entrance facing the Missouri River and is flanked by two stepped-gable roof and facade projections. The symmetry of the whole, including identical window placement, places the round-arched romanesque and the castellated medieval character of the whole building in a classically ordered context.

The interior of the structure contains over 145,000 square feet: a large auditorium, a stage, a gymnasium, locker rooms, large study halls, laboratories, a library and administrative offices.

The north wing was added in 1917-12. Floors in this wing are reinforced clay tile and concrete with terrazzo finished surface. The stairs here are steel with terrazzo trends and open steel rails.

By 1930 stairwells in the original part were encased on three sides with masonry partitions and new walls installed of reinforced concrete and terrazzo finish.

In recent years new wooden flooring has been added in the classrooms on all four floors and tile board ceilings in approximately 30 percent of the rooms.

Also in 1930 the hip roof was removed and the walls between turrets and tower were extended to accommodate a fourth floor addition.

Known as "The Castle", the Sioux City Central High School, the city's oldest community high school, was built in 1892 and served the community as an educational institution until 1972. Still located at the city's center, this building stands as a monumental example of the kind of civic pride which accompanied the late nineteenth population boom which many towns such as Sioux City experienced. Covering an entire city block, "The Castle" was designed by the architect F. S. Allen of Joliet, Illinois, and the construction contract was awarded to contractor, Eric Lund of Minneapolis, Minnesota.







Dear Mr. Walker:

I am writing to you in your capacity as executive director of the advisory council on historic preservation in addition to your duties with the National Park Service. A recent newspaper article in our Sioux City Journal covered the information that our former Central High School located at 1212 Nebraska Street had been accepted in the National Register of Historic Places and, as a result, would have to be retained by the school district. This large building has been deserted for the past year and I am seeking as much information as possible from you as to what the acceptance in the National Register means to this district. For example, does this acceptance have any implication on the Board of Education's authority to either convert, remove, or dispose of the property? What conditions must this school district meet and what funds are available for the purpose of preserving or restoring the building?

I would appreciate all available information on this topic since a citizens committee will be making a report on the building in three weeks and I am sure that my Board of Education will be asking for specific answers at that time. There is a great deal of local sentiment toward the preservation of this structure originally built in 1892 but there have not been many specific proposals for a functional use for this nearly 150,000 square feet of floor space. If there are funds for preserving such a building for historical purposes, I would appreciate very much having the funding areas or possibilities pointed out to me as well as what can be included, what applications are necessary, and to whom they are to be directed. We maintained minimal heat in this building during the last heating season but the combination of a fuel shortage and second year of disuse combine to make this nearly impossible for the coming winter season.

Any information you can give me on the present status of Central High School due to its acceptance in the National Register, as well as any legal restrictions on the prerogatives of the Board of Education as a result, and the possible federal funds available as a result would be greatly appreciated. Thank you very much for any assistance you can give me in this matter.

Central High School was added to the National Register on July 23, 1973. The enclosed brochure explains the National Register programs.

> Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (80 Stat. 915) requires Pederal agency heads to allow the Advicory Council on Historic Preservation opportunity to comment when undertakings to be licensed, funded, or executed by their agencies will affect properties listed in the National Register. No restriction is placed upon a private owner or upon a state or local government acting without Pederal involvement. If a Vederal agency is involved in a transaction concorning Central High School, the agency should inform the Advicory Council on Historic Preservation, 1922 K Street, N.W., Suite 430, Washington, D.C. 20005.

We believe you will be interested in the grante-in-aid program authorized by the Rational Historic Preservation Act of 1966 (80 Stat. 915), as amonded, which is described in the enclosed folder, "The National Register of Historic Places," and the fact cheet. Properties listed on the National Register and consistent with an approved State Historic Preservation Plan could qualify for either acquisition or development grants. You should note, however, that available State matching funds generally total more than the Federal appropriation for grants-in-oid, and in consequence, only a portion of all grant applications can be approved.

Reminations to the National Register, as well as applications for entching grants, are sade by the state through the State Historic Preservation Officer. In Iowa this official is Hr. Adrian Anderson.

The writer is Attorney for the Sioux City Community School District, which is the owner of a High School, which is on the National Register of Historic Places.

Certain questions have arisen, pertaining to the disposition of said High School, and your name was referred to me by Mr. Adrian Anderson, Iowa State Historic Preservation Officer.

The school, which is on the National Register, is called "CENTRAL HIGH SCHOOL", and is known as "THE CASTLE ON THE HILL". The school is no longer used for educational purposes and, pursuant to the Laws of Iowa, a Referendum is being presented on a Public Ballot in which the Voters will have the right to direct the School Board to sell or lease Central High School.

I would appreciate your response on the following questions that arise in the event Central High School, being on the National Register of Historic Places, is to be sold or leased:-

- (1) If the Buyer uses no Federal funds, either for demolition of the building or for construction of a new building on the site, are there any restrictions of any kind imposed by the fact that the school is on the National Register?
- (2) In the event the building is sold, is there any requirement that the present facade of the building be retained?
- (3) In the event the building is sold, and the Buyer applies for and receives Federal funds from the Federal Housing

Administration or from some other Federal agency, what specific restrictions would there be on the demolition of the building, and upon the construction of a new building on the site?

I would greatly appreciate your response to the above inquiries as soon as possible.

Also, would you kindly forward to me any rules and regulations that apply to buildings on the National Register of Historic Places? I do have access to Public Law 89-665, adopted by Congress, on October 15, 1966; however, I presume that your office or some other agency, under the Department of Interior, might have other rules and regulations that should be considered.

It subjects ony Pederal agency contemplating on undertaking or licensing action which would have an affect on the property to the procedures instituted pursuant to Section 106 of the Historia Propervation Act of October 15, 1966, 65 Stat. 915, 16 8.3.C. 470.

The listing has no other effect on the property. It does not affect, is any manner, the range of actions the owner could take, as long as Pederal financing is not involved, and it gives no governmental unit any authority or control ever the property, its use or its disposition. Also such listing makes the property sligible for financial assistance under Title I of the Act.

Enclosed is a copy of the Advisory Council on Mistoric Preservation's procedures for compliance with the Historic Preservation Act. The Advisory Council, along with the State Historic Preservation Officer and the Federal agency, determines compliance as it applies to each case.
