DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The present building is an exterior wall bearing structure with steel columns and beams, fire proofed with concrete. All interior floors are wood walls plaster ceiling-plaster, except the public lobby has terrazzo floor, marble base, oak wainscot with a special door and carved pedament over treatment for the door to the Postmaster's office. The exterior is modern beau art with Buff Indiana Limestone. The original building constructed in 1904 measured 50' x 90'. The building was expanded in 1931 to measure 109' x 90' by extending the north wall.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The old post office represents an example which is not common today of putting on an addition to an existing structure and to do so in such a manner that the addition actually was undistinguishable from the original. The sensitivity of one architect's work to another architect's design is nonexistent today. The conservation of materials including the reuse of stone, door and windows is evidenced by the two 1931 photos.

To recap the good points in this building - they are as follows:

The design of the building for 1904 was good. It is design in the opinion of the writer ahead of its time.... more like one would expect in 1931. The Classical was modernized in a pleasing manner.

The sensitivity of one Architect's work to another Architect's design is non-existent today. The 1931 Addition to the 1904 was beautifully done as evidenced by included photographs.

Conservation of materials - the reuse of stone, door and window is evidenced by the two 1931 photos. This shows up in the North elevation which was almost entirely reused and here and there other stone was reused evidenced by them being stained darker than the new. The building was gutter-leaving only the south wall and about 2/3 of the East and West walls. The South door was moved and relocated on the North end of the new front which was the West elevation.

Interior-wise, the Lobby is the only area which, in the opinion of the writer, is quality for the National Register. The wood wainscot, trim and doors have been carefully selected - quarter sawed oak and it appears the special care in book matching the bays or flashes which appear in quarter sawn oak. The finest detail is the door trim and overdoor treatment of the door to the Post Masters Office.

For some reason little information was found which pertained to the 1904 building and its 1931 addition.

Irving Weber wrote a history of Iowa City but little about the building. His history was more about the prior post office and the post masters.

The 1931 addition cost \$123,000.00. Postmaster Wm. Coen has stored in his vault the working drawings (blueprints) of the 1931 addition. Also what appears to be a complete set of construction photos (two different per month) of the 1931. Photos have been included with these forms.

In addition there are a few photos of the 1904 building - these appear to be when finished.

There was an article in the Iowa City Press Citizen dated October 28, 1929... titled Iowa City's First Postmaster Appointed During Van Buren Administration – 90 years ago which gave the cost of \$65,000.00 for the 1904 building... and that it was dedicated January 1, 1905. From the photos in Postmaster Coen's possession it would appear that the 1931 building wa dedicated late 1931 or early 1932. This could be reasearched by going through day by day issues of the I.C.P.C. newspaper. The writer felt that this was not of enough value to spend time and money.

The State Historical Society was the source that provided the October 28, 1929 article. It also had a few photos and post cards showing the 1904 building. The building has not been included in any surveys nor was it included in a book of public buildings published in 1939.










