The records of the earliest county proceedings in Winnebago County were destroyed by fire in the fall of 1861. There exists only sparse information on finding a suitable spot for the county seat and nothing that can be found on the structures in which the first courts were held.

At the time that county government was run by the county judge, the issue was raised of building a courthouse in Forest City. Robert Clark was the county judge immediately preceding the Civil War days. A petition was presented to him bearing the signatures of all but one of the voters of the county, asking that a \$20,000 courthouse be built. Bonds were issued and a contract was let, but no work on a courthouse was commenced for some time because the contractor was primarily engaged in the mercantile business.

Under pressure from the county citizenry, a foundation for the courthouse was laid at about the time that the system of government had changed to vesting the primary county authority in a board of supervisors. The first action of the board was to disapprove the courthouse contract for being too extravagant. An injunction was served on the contractor, restraining him from continuing his work.

The courts finally decided that the action of Judge Clark was binding on the county, and that the board of supervisors was still responsible for the bonds. In the meantime, the contractor built a smaller and cheaper courthouse. The board finally made a settlement for \$3,500 as compensation for the construction.

Funds raised through local subscriptions were used to build the present Winnebago County courthouse. The construction began in 1894 and was completed by 1896. The brick structure with its tall outstanding clock tower cost approximately \$25,000 to erect.
