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**DESCRIPTION**

The Vernal Presbyterian Church at 455 McInnis-Vernal Road, Lucedale vicinity, Greene County, Mississippi is a one story, gable-front, rectangularly-massed vernacular Gothic Revival church. Construction started in 1906 and was completed in 1908. All work was done by volunteers from the congregation. The church faces south toward a road leading east and west from Vernal River Road to Winborn Chapel Road. The Vernal Presbyterian Church is nominated within its immediate surroundings of three acres of wooded grounds along Evans Creek.

The church sanctuary has a steep-pitched roof, with a rise of approximately eighteen-in-twelve, covered with composition shingles. The gable on the front or south side has boxed eaves with cornice molding and a wide simple fascia. The foyer protrudes beyond the sanctuary with an approximate fifty-five foot tall tower containing a belfry with open handrails and a very steep sloped steeple roof reaching a height of approximately sixty-five feet. There is no evidence a bell was ever hung in the belfry. Two 2/2 wooden windows with colored glass Gothic arch transoms flank the entry.

The exterior of the building is clad in wood lap-siding over 2x4 balloon framing. The double-entrance doors are wood panel in a simple wood surround. Entry steps are of pre-fabricated concrete in place of the original wood steps. Three-quarter inch black pipe forms the handrail.

The wood joist floor structure is supported on brick piers approximately ten feet on center.

Five 2/2 wooden windows with colored glass Gothic arch transoms on the west and east elevations of the sanctuary contribute greatly to the character of this structure.

A Sunday school addition constructed in 1954 is visible on the west elevation north and east of the sanctuary. The site has a gradual slope to the north so the two stoops at the Sunday school entry door visible on the west elevation are taller than the foyer steps. The Sunday school addition windows are 6/6 wood.

Two 2/2 wooden windows with Gothic arch transoms are visible on the north elevation of the sanctuary. The north elevation consists of two components, the original building built in 1906 and the Sunday school addition built in 1954. In 1974 a fellowship hall was added to Sunday school wing. A stoop of brick at the fellowship entry is visible as well as a wood entry door from the sanctuary

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The east elevation consists of two components, the 1954 and 1974 additions and the 1906 sanctuary. The 1954 and 1974 additions in the foreground have rectangular 6/6 wood windows. The side elevation of a porch on the fellowship hall with wood columns is visible. The east side of sanctuary in the background is the same as the west elevation. The fellowship hall has a porch facing south with columns.

One enters the sanctuary through a pair of wooden doors from the foyer. The floor is of 1x4 tongue-and-groove heart pine, typical of all floors in the building except the fellowship hall addition. The ceiling height of the sanctuary is twenty feet, with beaded-board placed on the diagonal in the center with the sides sloping vertical to a flat area formed by a collar beam approximately at the third points of the rafters. The ceiling and walls above the chair rail are of pine beaded-boards painted white. Below the chair rail the walls are diagonal beaded-board with a dark stain. The base is a 12" wood heart pine board with a dark stain.

Viewed from the foyer entry doors, the interior is an open rectangular space divided by two rows of wooden pews forming a center aisle and two side aisles. The pews, made of oak, have molded top and end rails and mitered corners; they were refinished in the 1970's.

Original fittings and details survive in the sanctuary. The original choir seats are three rows of attached theatre seats situated in the northwest corner of the sanctuary. An original handmade pine lectern of beaded-board tongue-and-groove heart-pine lumber with simple molding is placed on the small raised platform. A raised platform of 1x4 tongue-and-groove heart flooring thirty feet by ten feet and seven inches tall extends along the north and west walls. Captain McIntosh donated the communion table and the pulpit chairs. These were in the old church before it was moved into the new church. He is said to have brought them from Mobile, Alabama, in an ox-drawn wagon.

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**STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE**

The Vernal Presbyterian Church, a rural vernacular church located in the Vernal community between Leakesville and Lucedale, Mississippi, in the southern part of Greene County, is significant under Criterion C for architecture because it is an increasingly-rare and unusually intact example of a rural Gothic Revival church from the first decade of the twentieth century. Vernal Presbyterian Church retains its original framing, weatherboard siding, windows, and interior fittings including woodwork, floors and pews.

The Vernal Presbyterian Church was organized on Saturday, February 28, 1880. Original church members and families were largely of Scottish and Irish ancestry. The first permanent church building was erected in 1882.

On October 23, 1905 the congregation met and resolved to build a new church building. The building committee consisted of A.A. McLeod, Neil McLeod, W.N. McInnis, P.A. McLeod, W.W. McLeod and John McInnis. This building, which is still our place of worship, was completed and dedicated in 1908.

The kerosene lamps were replaced in the church by electric light in 1946. In 1949 the church building was repaired and gas heat was installed.

On August 1, 1954 the congregation met and approved the plan to build a Sunday School Annex, and a building committee was appointed. By December 1954 this Sunday school annex, built adjoining the back of the church sanctuary, was ready for use. On February 22, 1970 the congregation met to approve plans for construction of a fellowship hall, kitchen and bathroom facilities. This addition was completed in 1974.

The property of the Vernal Presbyterian Church consists of two parcels described as follows:

**Parcel #1**

Commencing at the Southwest corner of the SW  $\frac{1}{4}$  of the NE  $\frac{1}{4}$ , of Section 20, in Township one (1) North of Range six (6) West of St. Stephens meridian in said County and State, as a place of beginning, thence East a distance of 135 feet, thence North a distance of 135 feet, thence West a distance of 135 feet, thence South a distance of 135 feet to place of beginning – the said land being 135 feet square.

**Parcel #2**

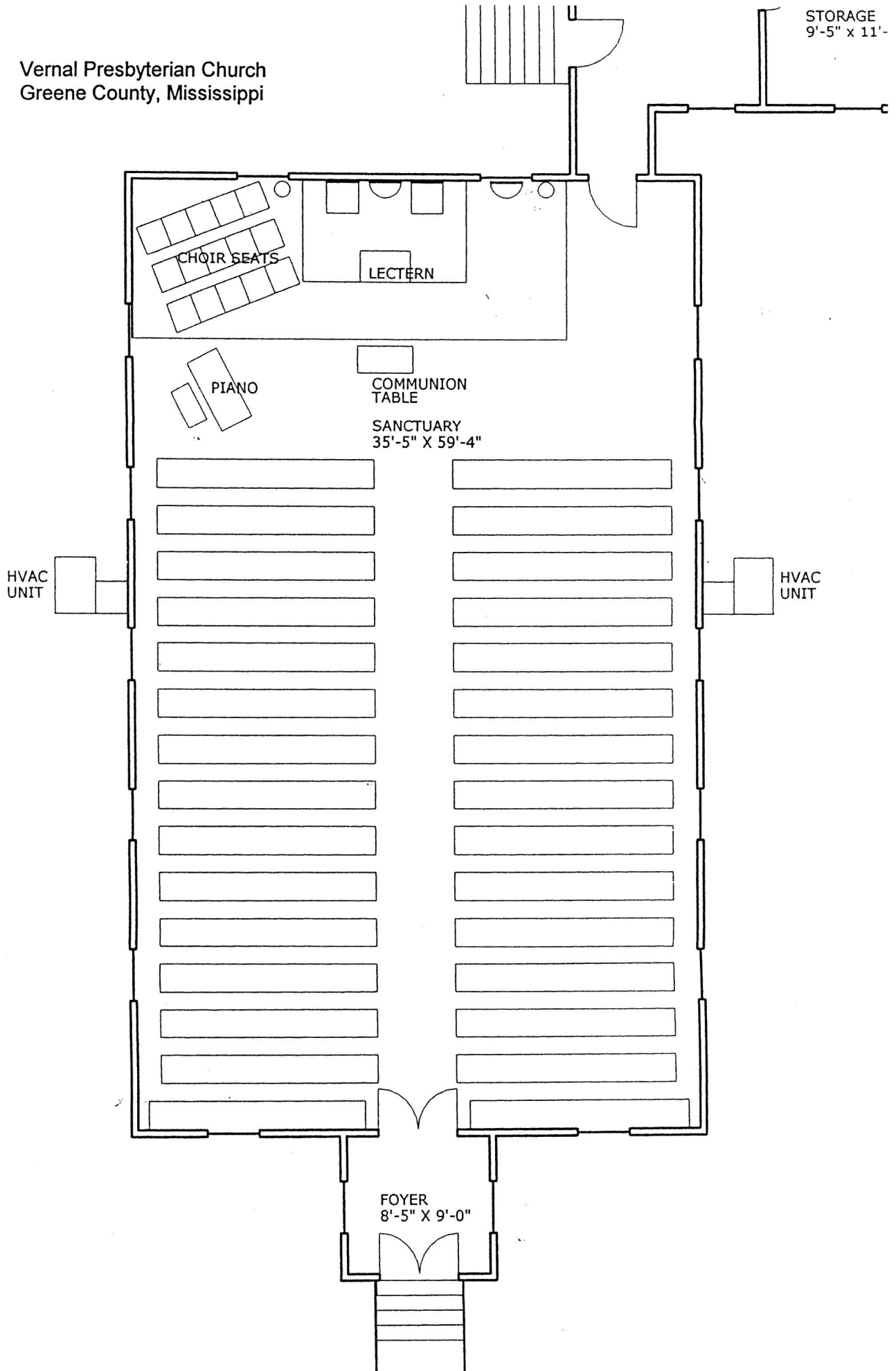
Beginning at the center point of Section 20 Township one (1) North, Range six (6) West and run East on the center line of said Section a distance of 315 feet, thence South a distance of 210 feet, thence West a distance of 600 feet to the meanderings of Evans Creek, thence up the center of said Evans Creek, to where said creek crosses the center line dividing Section 20, Township 1 North Range 6 West thence East along said center line to the starting point.

The west side of the church building sits approximately 30 feet east of the center section marker of section 20. The north side of the building is approximately 50 feet from the north boundary line (Parcel #1). The east side of the building is along the east side of (Parcel #1) boundary line. The south side of the building extends into the land described in (Parcel #2).

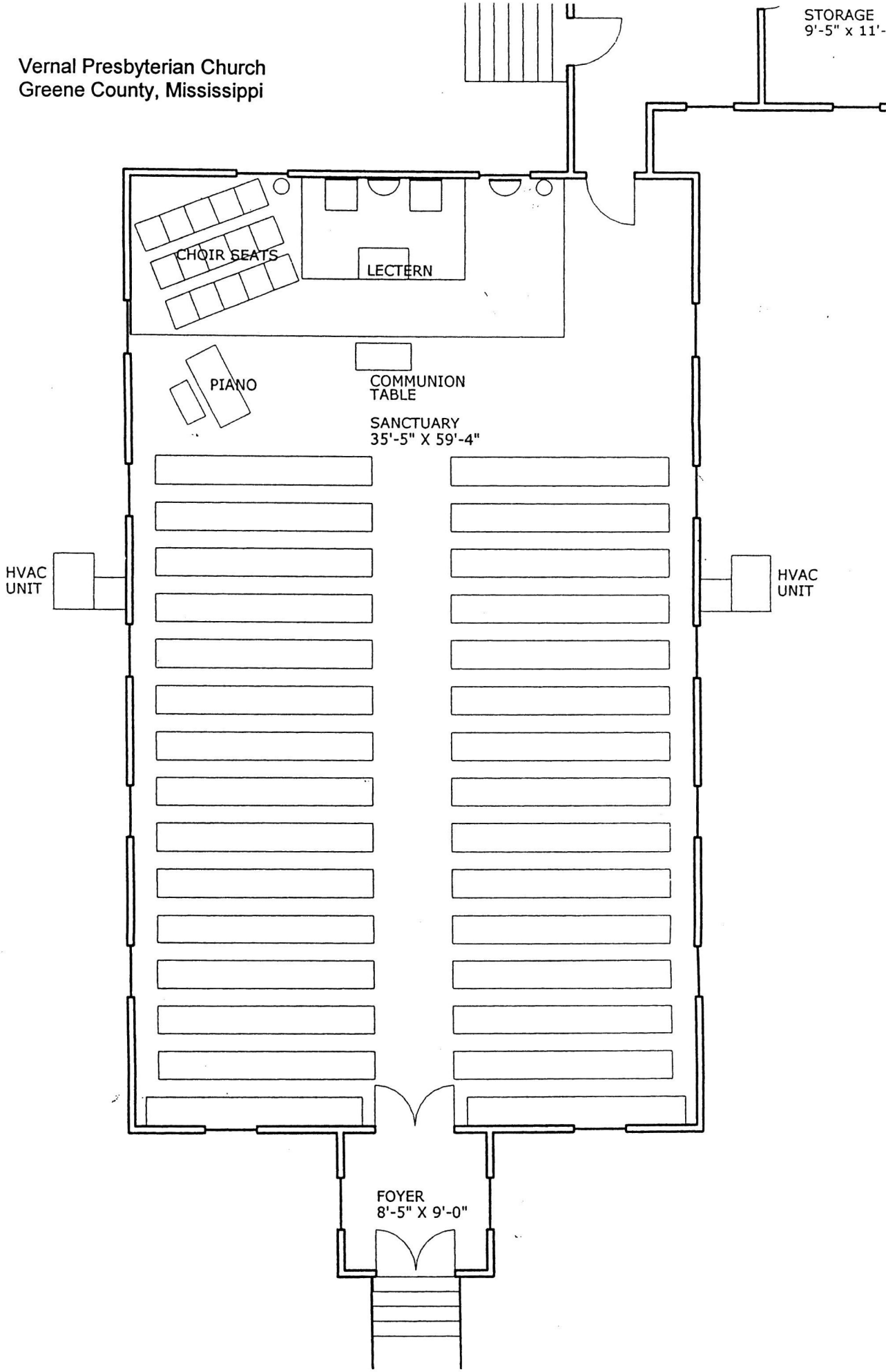

ABSTRACT/SUMMARY COMMENTS:

The Vernal Presbyterian Church is locally significant under Criterion C in the area of architecture. The church is a rare and intact example of a rural vernacular church with Gothic Revival stylistic influences. Construction began in 1906 and was completed in 1908. Members of the congregation provided all of the labor. The building retains nearly all of its original features, which include Gothic arch windows, a steeply-pitched roof, and a tall bell tower. Additions for a Sunday school and a fellowship hall were built to the rear of the building in 1954 and 1974, respectively. These alterations are clearly distinguishable from the church and have not compromised its historic appearance and character. Overall, the church is an exceptionally good example of a rural ecclesiastical building with Gothic Revival influences and retains integrity from its period of significance.
