#### **Summary Paragraph**

The Armitage Herschell Carousel is a circular carousel amusement ride. A center post with struts supports a multi-color canopy. The base is wood made of planks attached to a circular frame. The base rides on metal wheels in a track. Twenty-four hand-carved ponies, four oak sleighs and a circumferential bench provide seating. The carousel is installed in the gymnasium of the E.E. Bass Junior High School in Greenville. The original steam engine that powered the carousel is also in the gymnasium.

### **Narrative Description**

The Armitage Herschell Carousel is located in the gymnasium of the E.E. Bass Junior High School building in Greeneville, Washington County, Mississippi. The carousel is round with a multi-colored plastic canopy, a circular base with seating and two tracks where the sixteen wheels ride. The ride is powered by an electric motor which sits on the floor below the base. The steam engine which historically powered the carousel is also in the gymnasium.

At the center of the round structure a post rises from the base. The post is surrounded by a picket fence. Metal struts extend from the post and divide the canopy into panels of various colors. Metal struts rise at an angle from wood beams that support the floor of the carousel and attach to the circular frame. Vertical struts supporting the canopy are placed along the exterior rim of the floor and connect to a metal ring.

Sixteen cypress beams extend from a center ring located behind and underneath the central picket fence. The beams support the floor where the seating is located. The interior of the circular floor has a raised bench all the way around it which separates the floor from an open space near the center of the ride. The floor is composed of wood planks installed radially from the base of the bench. The floor is about ten inches above the ground.

The seating is composed of twelve pairs of ponies. Each pony is hand carved wood. They are mounted on beams. The ponies are painted white and have horse-hair tails. Each pony has a unique paint design. Seating is on a leather saddle which is a separate part. They have leather reins and metal stirrups. The ponies are fixed and do not move.

There are four wood sleighs interspersed between the ponies. Each sleigh has two seats. The sleighs are decorated with a painted floral design. Characters carved and painted on each sleigh tell a different story: Humpty Dumpty, Who Killed Cock Robin, Little Red Riding Hood, and, Mary Had a Little Lamb.

Although an electric motor now powers the carousel, it originally had a steam engine. The metal steam engine is also located in the gymnasium. The steel engine is mounted on four metal wheels. A large boiler powered two flywheels which pulled a steel cable causing the ride to turn.

The builder designed this model carousel so it could be taken down and moved with ease. Since the first local owner brought the carousel to Greenville, it operated at four outdoor locations in Greenville. The owner dismantled the ride in 1988 and put it storage. New owners hired a contractor to restore the carousel in 2006. The restored carousel was installed in the E. E. Bass Junior High School and reopened on February 17, 2007. Following the recent restoration, the carousel is in excellent condition and retains sufficient integrity for National Register eligibility as an object.

Statement of Significance Summary Paragraph (Provide a summary paragraph that includes level of significance and applicable criteria.)

The Armitage Herschell carousel in Greenville, Washington County, Mississippi is eligible for listing on the National Register of Historic Places under Criterion A for association with Entertainment/Recreation. It is a well preserved example of an amusement ride open to the public in the Greenville community beginning in 1901.

### Narrative Statement of Significance (Provide at least one paragraph for each area of significance.)

Merry-go-rounds, painted ponies, roundabouts, flying horses, flying jennies, are all names for the carousel. The word is derived from the Italian "carazello", meaning "little war," which described a game played by Arab and Turkish horsemen. The French adapted the game into equestrian competitions where competitors practiced on wooden horses attached to revolving platforms. Women and children began riding the machine for pleasure. With the invention of the steam engine larger carousels could be built, no longer dependent on man- or horsepower. Although there were some carousels in the United States prior to the Civil War, the "golden age" of carousel fabrication was from about 1880 to 1930.

Companies designing and building carousels prospered during the era. Leading manufacturers included the Dentzel Company, Philadelphia Tobaggan Company, M.C. Illions and Stein & Goldstein. Some companies were created by master carvers, like Dentzel and Illions. However, many companies employed itinerant master carvers, including Daniel Mueller, Charles Carnel, John Zalar, and Salvatore Cerrigiaro.<sup>2</sup>

Allan Herschell, born in Scotland in 1851, came to the United States in 1870. He and James Armitage formed a company to manufacture steam engines, boilers and mill and farm machinery in 1873. In 1882, while on a trip from their Tonawanda, New York shop to New York City, Herschell saw a carousel in Hornall, New York. Herschell determined that he could build a steam powered ride. The first Herschell Armitage carousel was installed in Niagara Falls in 1883. By 1890 the company sold sixty machines and sold another 100 in 1891. A five horsepower steam engine operated at 120 pounds of steam pressure.<sup>3</sup>

Herschell married Ida Spillman, and together with her brother bought out Armitage's interest in the company. The Herschell-Spillman Company continued to manufacture carousels until Herschell retired in 1911. Apparently, retirement did not agree with Herschell because he formed the Allan Herschell Company in 1915, which he operated until his death in 1927.<sup>4</sup>

The various Herschell companies specialized in small portable rides that could be easily moved from place to place. A 1913 catalogue identified these models as "County Fair Style". His rides were notable for their small stylized horse carving. His later creations were noted for their intricate relief carvings. Herschell's company produced 3000 hand carved wooden carousels at his North Tonawanda factory, which was listed on the National Register of Historic Places in 1985.

The exact provenance of the carousel in Greenville is not known. Eli Franklin Wineman, a Greenville businessman in St. Louis on business, saw an 1890 Armitage Herschell advertised in a St. Louis newspaper. He bought the carousel and brought it to Greenville in 1901. Initially, he rented it out to local communities. Wineman carved the sleighs himself creating the three "nursery rhyme" motifs. A fourth sleigh, "Lovers Tub" was removed in the 1950s and replaced with the Humpty Dumpty sleigh. Following the restoration he placed the carousel in his yard located at Broadway and Deason, where he held a grand opening on July 4, 1907. Due to the popularity of the amusement, he moved it to the corner of Percy and Dellesups, where he operated until failing health caused him to give up the business in 1934.<sup>5</sup>

Wineman sold the carousel to Harry Crockett, a long time employee. Crocket was a noted African American entrepreneur in Greenville. One of Crockett's most successful business operations was a hauling company he operated delivering building materials. Crockett moved the carousel to Walthall Street. Mary Crockett took charge of refurbishing the ride. She hired a local artisan to repaint the ride, including the horses and sleighs. The carousel remained at the Walthall Street lot until 1954.<sup>6</sup>

Mary Crockett sold the carousel to the Junior Woman's Club of Greenville in 1954. They moved the ride to Fairyland Park where it remained in operation until 1988. By that time age and exposure to the elements had taken a toll on the ride. It was disassembled and placed in storage. Beginning in 1991, Amanda Cottingham, a club member and fourth generation Greenvillean, began to work on restoring the horses. She and other volunteers stripped, cleaned and repaired the horses. In March 2000 the carousel was shipped to Ohio for repair. The Delta Children's Museum purchased the carousel in 2003 and arranged funding to contract with Carousel Magic, an Ohio company, for restoration work. The museum engineer, Andrew H. Koszowski designed and built a new drive system. Warren Harper, a carousel contractor, fabricated replacement seat backs and safety fencing. The restored carousel, in the E. E. Bass Junior High School building operated by the E.E. Bass Foundation, opened to the public on February 17, 2007.

The Armitage Herschell carousel is only one of two carousels permanently operating in Mississippi. The Highland Park Dentzel Carousel and Carousel House (NR, 1979; NHL, 1987) is in Meridian, Lauderdale County, Mississippi. The Exchange Club of Brookhaven, Mississippi owned a 1912 C. W. Parker carousel, but it was disassembled and auctioned for parts in 1986. Other known Armitage-Herschell carousels listed on the National Register of Historic Places are found in Iowa, Arkansas, California and New York. The 1890 Greenville carousel may be the oldest.

The Armitage Carousel in Greenville is a visual reminder of a form of public amusement that was once found in many cities and towns. Local residents and visitors enjoyed the ride for almost ninety years before it was dismantled. Through the efforts of concerned citizens and organizations, the Armitage Carousel has been restored and can be enjoyed by future generations.






