

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Number of stories: Two stories with high basement.

Number of bays: On north facade central block is five bays wide, and wings are three bays wide.

Layout and/or shape of plan: Central block is rectangular in plan with wings extending from east and west side.

Wall construction: Brownstone; rusticated brownstone basement in central block of building and on first story of wings. Ionic pilasters separate bays.

Roof: Hipped roof with balustraded parapet on central block and wings.

Cupola: Domed cupola has arched openings separated by pairs of Corinthian columns.

Doorway: On north facade main entrance with double doors, fanlights and sidelights is reached by double flight of stairs.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This structure was designed as the Albany Academy by architect Philip Hooker and erected between 1815 and 1817. Constructed of brownstone with Classical Revival details, such as the Ionic pilasters and the finely detailed cupola, the structure is considered one of Hooker's finest buildings. The First Reformed Church on North Pearl Street and the Academy are the only surviving examples of Hooker's work in Albany.

The building is now called the Joseph Henry Memorial in honor of Joseph Henry, who in 1826 was appointed to the Chair of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy at the Academy. While at the school he conducted experiments which led to important discoveries in electro-magnetics. He later became Professor of Natural Philosophy at Princeton University.



In 1826, Joseph Henry was appointed to the Chair of Mathematics and Natural Philosophy; during his six years there, he made a series of investigations which led to five basic discoveries in the field of Electro-magnetics. It was substantially restored in 1935 when the Academy moved out and the building became the Administrative offices for the Education Department of the City of Albany.
