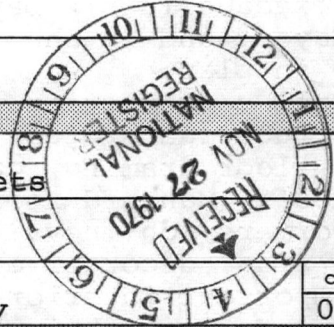

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Number of stories: Four stories with attic and cellar.  
 Number of bays: East facade is nine bays wide; south facade is six bays wide.  
 Layout and/or shape of plan: The building is rectangular in plan.  
 Wall construction: Brick with stone trim.  
 Structural system: Brick exterior bearing walls, wood floor framing, cast iron columns.  
 Roof: Mansard roof, bracketed cornice.  
 Dormers, chimneys: Flat-roofed dormer windows on east side; decorative corbeled chimneys.  
 Important interior features: Much of the original interior fabric is intact. On the first floor, which was used as bank, wooden tellers' counters, vault and offices remain. On the second floor, the original plan of a centrally located theater ticket booth remains. Much other late nineteenth century building fabric also remains, including gas fixtures, ticket booth, doors and door trim, radiators, wallpaper, lavatories and "syphonic" water closets.  
 On the third floor is the theater with a balcony on the fourth floor level. The balcony is suspended by tension rods from the roof trusses. The theater walls and ceiling are still covered with the original painted canvas covering. A painted stage backdrop, gilded loge boxes, gasoliers, balcony benches and dressing rooms under the sloping stage are still intact.

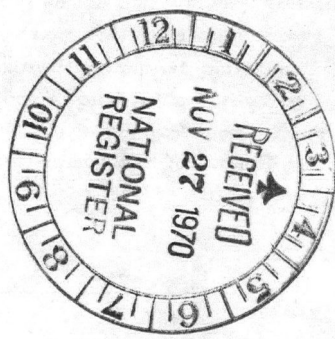

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

In 1874 James Masten, owner of the Cohoes Cataract, and William Acheson, a mill owner, built the Music Hall as a business enterprise. The post office initially occupied the north end of the building. The upper two stories housed a theater capable of seating 1,000 persons, and was one of three theaters in Cohoes in the latter part of the nineteenth century. In 1876 the city library moved into rooms in the second story. In 1880 the First National Bank of Cohoes opened offices in the building.

The exterior of the building is an impressive example of the commercial architecture of the 1870's. Although the building contains traces of the so-called "French Second Empire" style, it is essentially an example of American urban architectural design of the period. The theater itself is an architectural jewel, and it is especially notable that it has existed so long with so much of its original fabric intact.
