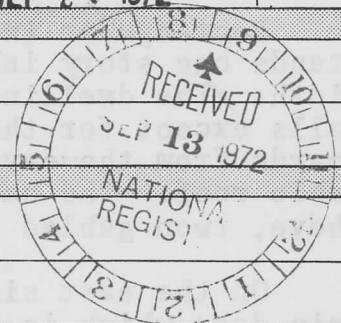

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Rectangular in shape, the William Stoutenburgh House stands one story in height, five bays in length, and two bays in width. The dwelling is constructed of coursed fieldstone bearing walls except for the north gable end which is sheathed by clapboards from the eaves line to the peak of the wood-shingled gable roof. The eaves are finished in a simple cornice and, above, two gabled dormers occur on the front or east elevation.

On the east side of the structure four windows flank the main door which is framed by fluted woodwork with corner blocks and which is sheltered by a one-bay, flat-roofed wood porch. Two windows occur on the south gable end at the first floor level, and above two small window openings flank the stack of the interior end chimney. On the north gable there is one window at the first story level on the northeast end of the north elevation, and two smaller openings, like their counterparts on the south, flank the interior end chimney. In addition there are small rectangular window openings at the ground level which provide ventilation and light to the cellar.

Later additions abut the structure on the west.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Closely associated with the Stoutenburgh family which was prominent in the settlement once known by the family name, the William Stoutenburgh House is one of the few remaining stone dwellings in the town of Hyde Park which were characteristic of architecture in the rural Hudson Valley prior to 1800.

Before his death Jacobus Stoutenburgh, the original settler of the village now known as Hyde Park, divided much of his land among his children. To William he granted the width of the ninth water-lot on both sides of "Creek Road" now called Violet Avenue. About the year 1765, the William Stoutenburgh House was erected on the west side of "Creek Road" in the area now called East Park, in the town of Hyde Park. It is believed that the Jacobus Stoutenburgh family took refuge at William Stoutenburgh's residence when the British force commanded by General Vaughn sailed up the Hudson in October 1777 and bombarded structures within reach of the ships' cannon. The William Stoutenburgh House has functioned continuously as a residence since its construction.

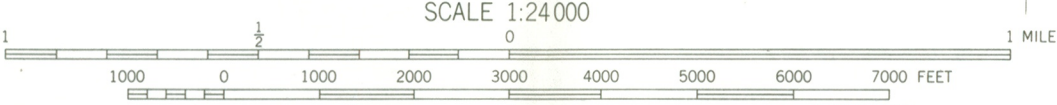
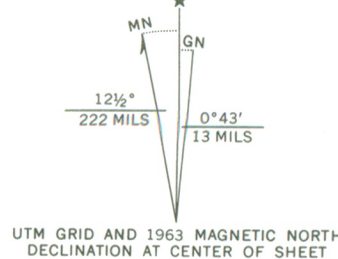
