DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Erected on a hillside, the Old Southeast Church stands two stories in height, and measures four bays in width on the north and south elevations, and three on the east and west. When it was originally constructed in 1793-1794, the building conformed to the meetinghouse plan of the Eighteenth Century, with the entrance on the south side, opposite the pulpit. According to the minutes of the Congregation, the building committee was authorized to construct a meeting house measuring fifty feet by thirty-eight feet, and was granted "...liberty to take such parts of the old meetinghouse as they might think best."<sup>1</sup> The committee was instructed "...to paint the outside, lath and plaster said house and hang pew doors, stairs and pulpit and canopy made...interior whitewashed or polished."<sup>2</sup>

<sup>1</sup> On March 5, 1830 the structure was partially damaged by fire. In the process of rebuilding, the church was altered stylistically: the entrance was moved to the west side, the belfrey added, the balcony re-oriented, and partitions erected at the west end of the balcony and at the entrance to create a vestibule. The clapboards on the exterior date from 1830 as does the ornamental segmental arch near the peak of the gable on the west or entrance facade. Two brick chimneys which were added on the north and south sides near the western end of the structure were partially dismantled and are now apparent only in the garret and the sanctuary.

The interior focuses on the pulpit which stands at the western end of the church between two interior doors which give access to the sanctuary from the vestibule. Doric columns support the gallery on three sides of the sanctuary, and support the ceiling. Distinctive among the features of the interior are the vertical wainscoting beneath the chair rail, the painted and grained pews, and the paneling of the gallery parapet and of the beams which support the gallery floor. The structure, free from Twentieth Century changes is still lit by fixtures installed during the last half of the Nineteenth Century.

Directly west of the Old Southeast Church stand a schoolhouse and the foundations of a carriage house. A one-story frame structure measuring three bays by one bay, the schoolhouse is believed to be among the oldest school buildings in the county.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE (Include Personages, Dates, Events, Etc.)

SEE INSTRUCTIONS

Since its construction, the Old Southeast Church has been the commanding architectural feature and one of the few remaining landmarks of the early settlement of Doanesburg, the principal hamlet of eastern Putnam County until the railroad diverted population and enterprise west to Brewster. A well-proportioned, simple frame structure, the church was originally constructed in 1794 as a meeting house, but it was altered after a fire in 1830.

The first church in Philipps' Precinct was constructed of logs circa 1735-1743, and was replaced by a frame structure circa 1761. According to the minutes of the meeting held on January 10, 1793, the Society voted to build a larger "...meeting house to be set at or near the place where the present house now stands."<sup>1</sup> The committee appointed "...for the purpose of hurrying on the said building...." consisted of John Waring, David L. DeForest and Joseph Crane, Jr.<sup>2</sup> Delayed by sickness among the workmen, the construction was completed by June 1794 at a cost of approximately £ 750. Partially damaged by fire on March 5, 1830, the church was repaired and simultaneously altered at a cost of \$1,115.00.

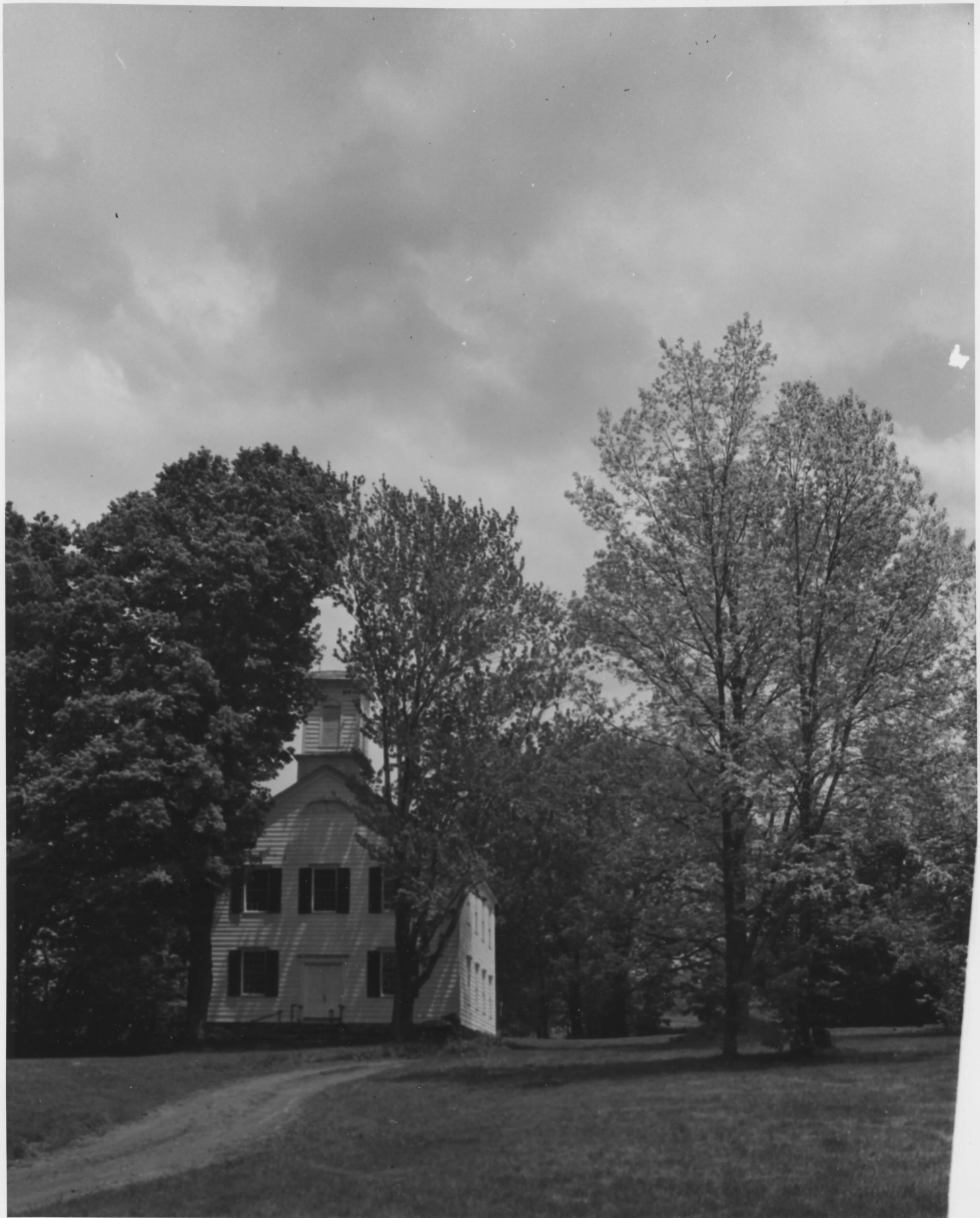
