DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Chelsea is an eleven story, twenty-five bay, brick hotel located on the south side of West 23rd Street, a main crosstown thoroughfare. The facade is arranged in five parts with engaged towers in the center and on either end, the former being slightly higher and having a pyramidal roof with a massive chimney attached to its northeast corner; the latter are topped with brick gables within which each has a large tri-partite pointed arch window. Six other large chimnevs emerge from a slate roof which is punctuated by two large dormers over each of the two recessed portions of the facade. A notable architectural feature is the succession of floral design, iron balconies from the second through the eighth story. The balconies run across the entire facade and are accessible from the apartments through French doors. The main entrance, with Gothic style detailing has remained unaltered, although several street level storefronts have had some modernization.

Over the years some alterations have been made to meet safety codes, but many of the apartments retain their original decorative woodwork and high ceilings. fireplace in the main lobby still has its elaborately carved, wooden chimney piece, and the ornate iron railing of the main staircase is still intact.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Chelsea Hotel, designed and built by Hubert, Pirsson and Company in 1884, has been used as a hotel since 1905. The hotel is one of New York's most famous landmarks because it was frequented by numerous writers and artists. Over the years the residential roster has carried the names of Mark Twain, Sarah Bernhardt, O. Henry, Arthur B. Davies, James T. Farrell, Robert Flaherty, John Sloan, Eugene O'Neill, Thomas Wolfe, Brendan Behan, Edgar Lee Masters, Dylan Thomas and Arthur Miller. At the Chelsea, William Burroughs wrote Naked Lunch and Virgil Thomson created Lord Bryon, his first American Opera. Edgar Lee Masters dedicated an unpublished poem to the Chelsea and the hotel appears as a haven of refuge from atomic bombs for the hero of Stuart Cloetes novelette, The Blast. In Brendon Behan's New York several pages are devoted to experiences in the Chelsea and its environs. Among the movies filmed on the site was Andy Warhol's "The Chelsea Girls" in 1968.

The Chelsea survives as one of the great late nineteenth century apartment houses in New York. Philip G. Hubert, the chief designing partner, became famous as the originator of the co-operative apartment house in this country and for the introduction of fireproofing techniques in the construction. The florid, cast-iron balconies were made by the firm of J.B. and J.M. Cornell.

The Chelsea was among the earliest buildings to be designated a New York City landmark. This distinction was conferred on it because of its notable architectural features and because of its significance as part of the development of the literary and artistic heritage of the city.


