DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Old New York Post Building is a three bay, thirteen story commercial structure sited across from St. Paul's churchyard in Lower Manhattan. The steel frame structure has a stone clad facade, and side and back walls constructed of brick. The three distinct bays of the facade emphasize the structure's verticality while decorative stonework forms horizontal bonds at each floor level. The four uppermost stories manifest a complex of ornamentation highlighted by four sculptured figures in niches flanking each bay. Cast iron railings with repeated "EP" monograms are attached to narrow balconies within each bay at the eleventh story level. Each of the three bays is capped with a large dormer emerging from the copper clad mansard roof line.

The street level facade, the lobby, and the office arrangements have had some later alteration and modernization, but much of the structure's interior has remained unaltered.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

Built in 1906 as a new publishing office for the famous New York Evening Post, this thirteen story structure is an unusual architectural expression of the Germanic or geometric phase of the Art Nouveau style. Designed by Robert Kohn and ornamented with two sculptures created by the German realist sculptor Gutzon Borglum and two others by Estelle Rombold Kohn, the Post building represents a foreshadowing of the predominent Art Deco taste of the nineteenth-twenties.

The historian Allan Nevins evaluates the New York Evening Post as "one of the world's greatest newspapers,...one which has been important to the whole course of metropolitan journalism in America since 1800, and [also] upon some important parts of local and national history."

The editorials of the Evening Post reflected the progressive ideas of its writers, proposing social and cultural advancements which eventually became a part of the fabric of this city. Ideas were initiated through Post editorials for a park in a central location, an art museum metropolitan in nature, a public library in addition to the already existing private ones, and multiple-unit housing prior to the advent of the apartment house dwelling.

"The Evening Post, in its century-long history, united three strong traditions. First, the traditions clustering about its founder, Alexander Hamilton; second, the traditions created during the long editorship of William Cullen Bryant,...and finally the tradition of fighting Manchester liberalism embodied in the trenchant work of Edwin Lawrence Godkin, editor of the New York Nation... The career of a newspaper conducted by such strong and aggressive journalists was certain to be stormy...

During the early part of the First World War, internal divisions at 20 Vesey Street threatened the paper with total The editor was Rollo Ogden and the owner was destruction. Oswald Garrison Villard, son of Henry Villard, and grandson of William Lloyd Garrison. Villard was a pacifist, taking editorial positions that were highly unpopular in the United States. Ogden resigned, taking an editorial position with The New York Times. imes.

As a result, "The financial position of the Evening Post became increasingly precarious; the staff, restive and unhappy, began to break up and seek other positions, and the daily lost nearly all its influence... [It was] finally rescued by Thomas Lamont of the house of J.P. Morgan..., but by 1918 its great days were over. It was essentially of of the casualties of the war."3

At the time the Evening Post was planning the new facility at 20 Vesey Street, The New York Times noted that "The plans prepared by Robert D. Kohn, the architect, are the result of a study of newspaper buildings in the principal cities between St. Louis and the Atlantic Coast."4 Describing the building, the article informs us that there were fifteen stories in the building. two basement levels below the street, the four topmost stories, and one third of the ground floor were reserved for its own use.

An obituary notice in the Michigan Society of Architects Bulletin of July 1953 stated that Robert D. Kohn, architect of the Evening Post building, died at the age of 83. He had just been elected to the National Academy of design. Kohn had practiced in New York since 1895 and was architect for R.H. Macy's department store, and the Temple-Emanuel buildings, both done in collaboration with Charles Butler and another of his partners, Clarence S. Stein. The Board of Design, New York World's Fair (1930), and the Division of Housing P.M.A. (1933-4), were also designed by him. Kohn was president of the American Institute of Architects from 1930 to 1932. He was also president of the Society of Ethical Culture and was architect of the building at 2 West 64th Street in which their Sunday school meetings are held.


