7. Description

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Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Bronx Post Office occupies the entire block between East 149th and East 150th Streets, the Grand Concourse and Spencer Place. Its smooth gray brick walls rise above a granite terrace which varies in height along the side elevations to conform to the slope of the street. Broad, shallow steps lead up to the three entrances facing the Grand Concourse. The terrace is enclosed by a classically inspired balustrade, flanked at the entrance steps by blocks decorated with highly stylized swags and rosettes and carrying flagpoles. The ornate foliate bronze flagpole bases have a rather baroque character.

The most prominent features of the building are the graceful window openings set within marble arches which contrast handsomely with the smooth gray brick walls. Radial brick arches, above impost block level, enframe the marble arches of the window openings. The three openings which contain the bronze entrances are set within deep reveals. The facades are crowned by a simple continuous stone band course set with stylized rosettes and containing the inscription "Bronx - United States Post Office - New York."

Two sculptures, larger than life-size, affixed to the front facade add further interest to the building. The designs were chosen from over 400 models submitted in a national competition held in 1936. "The Letter," designed by Henry Kreis, portrays a mother and her child receiving a message from an absent member of the family. "Noah," by Charles Rudy, depicts the Patriarch, with a deer in one arm, straddling the ark, and receiving the dove's message that the flood was subsiding.

The interior is ornamented with simplified marble Ionic columns and pilasters, and lighted by four globe light fixtures. The main lobby has been modernized, with new writing desks and post office boxes. Of considerable artistic and historical interest are thirteen mural panels in the main lobby, most of which are eighteen feet in height. They are the work of Ben Shahn and his wife, Bernarda Bryson. Completed in August 1939, the murals depict the varied occupations of American workers, and were inspired by Walt Whitman's I See America Working.

Bulletin boards have been removed from the lower portions of the four murals along the west wall. They were to be replaced by plaques explaining the murals, but due to personnel changes, this has yet to be accomplished.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The elegant simplicity and finely executed detail of the Bronx Post Office, designed by Thomas Harlan Ellett and built in 1935-37, make it an exceptional example of 20th-century government architecture. Its style combines modified classical ornament with simple detailing, and successfully integrates sculpture by Henry Kreis and Charles Rudy.

The most noteworthy features of the Bronx Post Office are the thirteen interior murals by Ben Shahn and his wife Bernarda Bryson. These murals, sponsored by the U. S. Treasury's Section of Fine Arts, were chosen after a competition involving 198 contestants. The various panels, inspired by Walt Whitman's I See America Working, represent a panorama of American agriculture and industry, with the artist's intention being "to show the people of the Bronx something about America outside New York."

Ben Shahn (1898-1969) is best known for his social protest canvases, particularly for a sequence of works on the theme of the Sacco-Vanzetti case in the 1920's. After World War II, Shahn's themes expanded in scope to deal with a variety of psychological rather than socio-political subjects. His best known work from this period is Death of a Miner of 1949.

A description of the Bronx Post Office in Architectural Forum for June, 1938 states:

A distinct modern influence and the continuing tradition of 'government classic' are the two conflicting tendencies which have resulted in the first signs of vitality in American post office design, and the new Bronx Post Office is an excellent example of best recent work...the building subtly suggests a Georgian precedent without the use of traditional detail....²

Thomas Harlan Ellett (1880-1951) designed a variety of private homes and institutions. His best known works are the Cosmopolitan Club on East 66th Street in Manhattan, and the library in Wilton, Conn.

Although the Bronx Post Office is less than fifty years old, it was determined eligible for the National Register in 1976 based upon the value of its interior murals by Ben Shahn, and its significance as an example of Works Progress Administration architecture.


