## 7. Description

#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

Situated on a large corner lot, this four-story Classical Revival style bank of limestone, sandstone and marble contains a wealth of architectural detail and ornament. Extremely beautiful bronze candelabra stand on large bases flanking a short flight of stairs which lead up to the main entrance. The deeply recessed entrance is framed by a two-story arch formed by giant piers with paired Ionic pilasters which support an entablature and pediment. The arch is repeated at the secondary Broadway entrance and again on the Driggs Avenue facade. Two massive bronze doors with classical decoration form the main entrance.

A low attic story is located above the entablature and a monumental cast-iron dome with a lantern crowns the building. An ornately decorated cast-iron railing extending around the building at street level completes this impressive composition.

Significant interior features include clustered marble pilasters with Corinthian capitals, an organic frieze and architrave, and classical plaster moldings above the entrances to the president's, clerks', and cashiers' offices. The president's office retains the original wood carving above the doorways, windows and fireplace. The main banking room is surmounted by a gigantic dome on pendentives which is ornamented with mosaic decoration.

There have been three extensions to the original building. The first was designed by Helmle, Huberty & Hudswell c. 1910<sup>2</sup> to create a second banking room which features the same detailing as the main room but has a shallow coffered dome. In 1923 a small glass-covered extension was added to the rear of the building, and in 1941 a third extension was added to the side of the building to provide staff services.

The nominated site extends to the curbline to include the sidewalk. On the Broadway side the original sidewalk, consisting of stone blocks with grooves, runs from the corner to the 1941 addition. The remainder of the sidewalk on Broadway and on the Driggs Avenue side is old but less intact.

<sup>2</sup>Research reveals conflicting dates for the construction of the second banking room. Building department records are inconclusive, showing both 1903 and 1909 as possible dates. The attached map shows 1906 while a plaque in the second room reads 1910. It seems probable that construction began in 1909 and that the room was dedicated in 1910.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

The Williamsburgh Savings Bank, an imposing building rich in architectural details, is an excellent example of that Classical Revival architecture which preceded the Chicago Fair of 1893. This distinguished structure has served the banking needs of its community for over one hundred years and continues to do so.

Incorporated by an act of the New York State Legislature on April 9, 1851, the Williamsburgh Savings Bank opened for business two months later in the basement of All Souls Universalist Church on the corner of Bedford Avenue and South 3rd Street. Three years later it moved from these rented quarters to its own handsome Italianate building across the street. By 1867, the bank's business had outgrown the South 3rd Street building and the trustees began to search for a suitable location for larger facilities. The northwest corner of Driggs Avenue and Broadway in the commercial center of Williamsburgh was the site selected for the new building. An architectural competition was held and the winning design was submitted by George B. Post. The impressive Classical Revival style structure, with a striking cast-iron dome, is one of Post's earliest works; he later went on to design such notable buildings as the Long Island Historical Society (1878-80), the New York Stock Exchange (1903), and the College of the City of New York (1902-11).




