Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

St. Peter's Roman Catholic Church at 22 Barclay Street is no doubt the foremost and finest example of a Greek Revival church building in New York City. is the Greek temple-church in full form with six Ionic columns widely spaced, supporting a low pediment to form the portico. The wide entablature and cornice are composed of heavy wooden moldings which are sheathed in a protective covering of sheet metal. The building is a large rectangle with a high basement and a lowpitched peaked roof. The sides of the building which face the streets are of granite ashlar masonry laid with great precision. The east side is done in Manhattan schist. A full-width flight of granite steps leads up to the columned porch and the main level of the church, which is emphasized by a broad granite belt course at the top of the basement. The main facade behind the columns of the porch is completely plain except for three monumental doorways. The side elevations are also plain and regular and contain six long, narrow windows which have square windows above them. This regularity tends to set off the perfection of the masonry and further accentuates the mass of the building which serves as a foil for its extremely refined detail. The combination of all of these features results in a building of fine proportions, crisp detail, monumental aspect and purity of design. The exterior of the church was designed by John R. Haggerty and it is clear that, with some modifications, he took his inspiration from the famous "Temple on the Ilissus" at Athens erected in 484 B.C. The handsome iron fence with its spear finials is original and is in excellent condition.

SIGNIFICANT INTERIOR FEATURES: The design of the interior of St. Peter's is attributed to Thomas Thomas. The entire interior is one large space 2 1/2 stories in height and unencumbered by any supporting arches or columns and this is most unusual. There is a gallery only across the rear. Designed as a massive entablature with large plain moldings, it is supported by only two sizable fluted wooden Ionic columns. The ceiling is very fine, with guilloche, foliate and egg-and-dart plaster moldings and three large plaster acanthus leaf rosettes in the central section. There is an original organ screen in the form of a triple tabernacle with Corinthian pilasters and decorative anthemions. The white marble main altar and side altars were installed in 1905 as the gift of three brothers, George, John and Edward Smith, in memory of their parents.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

St. Peter's Church is an outstanding example of Greek Revival architecture. It is one of only two churches with full temple fronts in Manhattan. Its site at the corner of Barclay and Church Streets is the location of the oldest place of continuous Roman Catholic worship in New York City.


The parish was founded in 1785 by St. Jean de Crevecoeur, the well-known observer of the American scene in the last quarter of the eighteenth century. Famous for his Letters of an American Farmer, he was the French consul to America at the time. The cornerstone of the first church on the site was laid in 1785 and that building was razed in 1836. The present St. Peter's is the second building and has been in continuous use since it was completed in 1840.

The architectural importance of St. Peter's has caused it to be attributed to many prominent architects but its architects were John R. Haggerty and Thomas Thomas, who are relatively unknown, but were masters of their craft. Haggerty withdrew from the project in 1838 and Thomas took over to complete the building. The building has been described in Classic New York:

"St. Peter's Church...is the temple-church at its finest. Here again is the monumental scale and meticulous simplicity by which austere elegance was deliberately invoked. Dedicated in 1838, and finished in 1840, it was built for the oldest Roman Catholic parish in New York and was a most unusual choice of style for a Catholic church. The rage for the Greek united all."


