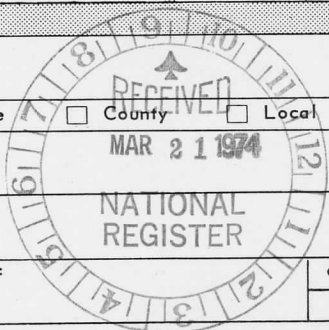

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a large two-story frame house of the seventeenth and eighteenth century central chimney type. The facade has five bays with a center entrance. The doorway has sidelights framed by slender moldings suggesting pilasters. The majority of the windows retain their double-hung sash with twelve panes over twelve. A modern kitchen wing was added to the rear of the house around 1900. There are no neighboring structures of sufficient importance to constitute a historic district.

The interior of the house has a typical central chimney plan. The front door opens into a shallow stairhall, with the stairs in front of the chimney stack making a sharp left-hand turn. The posts and balusters are plain rectangular spindles. Rooms on either side of the stairs have fireplaces in the central chimney. The corner posts of the house frame can be seen in the rooms. The large kitchen is to the rear of the chimney, with a great hearth and a bake oven. There is a smaller room on each side of the kitchen, making five rooms in all. The second floor plan is a duplicate of the first. A rear stair opened from the kitchen, making a right-hand turn to the second floor. When the rear wing was added, this stair was changed to continue straight into the addition. There is a full cellar, with the great chimney foundation occupying the center. Rocks and rubble support two giant hewn timbers, which in turn support corbelled timbers. These provide a bearing for some of the main framing timbers of the house, as well as the hearths and chimney masonry.

All of the original mantelpieces and woodwork are intact. The hall or keeping room has a chair rail which is original, as the walls have been plastered to the rail. Extensive stencilling has been found on the walls of several first floor rooms. The house has been undergoing a careful and thoughtful restoration by the present owner since 1968.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This is an unusually well-preserved house of the Connecticut and Massachusetts central-chimney type. This type of plan is far less common in Ohio than the later central-hall plan which appeared around 1750 and which is more characteristic of the Adam and Greek Revival Styles.

The seventeenth century central-chimney plan was first expanded by the addition of a lean-to providing additional rooms to the rear of the chimney. It culminated between 1700 and 1750 in the type in which a full second story was raised over all five first floor rooms. This house is a perfect example of that type, and thus represents a persistent older tradition by 1800, and shows that the builders came from a more conservative locality in New England.

The history of the house is unusually well documented. It was built by Colonel Erastus N. House, who migrated to Lenox Township in 1809 from Sandisfield, Massachusetts. The Memoirs of his second wife Abigail Clark Fish were published shortly after her death by Josiah Atkins. They record the story of her life on the homestead. Colonel House's first wife died in 1818, and he married Abigail in 1819. This house was begun shortly thereafter, and was certainly completed before 1825. Erastus House was a successful dairy farmer, local postmaster and historian. He wrote a pioneer history of Lenox Township in the 1840's which was later destroyed in a courthouse fire in Jefferson. Colonel House died in 1844. Abigail House was a strong personality herself and an ardent supporter of the anti-slavery movement. She lived in the house until 1854, when she sold it to her son-in-law J.M. Ray, moving to a smaller house not far away. She died in 1861.
