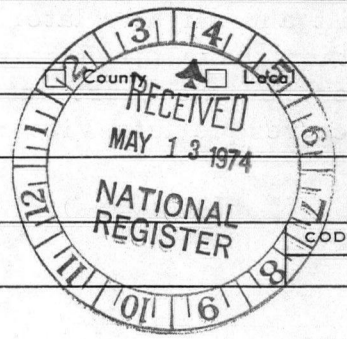

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is a district including a public green, courthouse building, and two blocks of commercial stores facing the west side of the green. Unfortunately, the buildings on the other three sides of the green are undistinguished, or do not qualify for inclusion in the district.

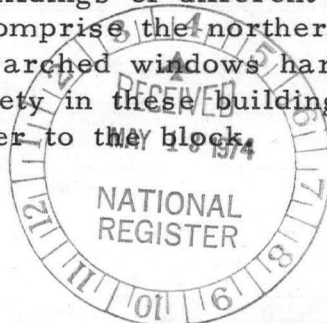
The green is bisected by an east-west street, and the courthouse stands in the center of the north half. It is a large two-story building of brick, stone and frame construction in the High Victorian Italianate Style. There are some iron girders in the structure. The basic plan is fundamentally a conservative pre-Civil War one, consisting of a large rectangular mass; 61 feet by 85 feet and 50 feet high, with a single tower axially placed at the narrow end. The brick walls are enlivened with heavy stone quoins at the corners of the building and of the tower. Both the building and tower eaves have large paired brackets. A full story above the roof line, the square tower changes to an octagon, with a tall cupola and lantern reaching 112 feet. The windows and doors are round-arched, and segmental-arched on the main floor. The main windows of the tower have a clustered trefoil effect, with tracery mullions. There have been no significant alterations to the exterior design of the building.

The centerpiece of the west side of the square faces the south half of the green. It is a commercial block of twelve stores in the High Victorian Italianate Style, 231 feet long and 66 feet deep, two stories high and of brick construction. In the center of the block a lodge hall rises an additional story. The windows have stone molded caps. In the block north of Court Street there are additional store fronts in the Italianate Style, obviously designed to harmonize with the courthouse. The ground floor fronts of both of these blocks have been refaced with various modern materials. A few have attempted to maintain some conformity with the original style. Nevertheless, the main impression is one of consistency because of the uniform cornice line and the good condition of the upper stories.

At the north end of the block is a slightly later church building, a square brick structure in the Victorian Gothic Style, with a square buttressed tower at the corner, and pointed windows. Built in 1883-1886, it was redecorated and repaired in 1908 and 1928, and the sanctuary was rearranged and the ceiling altered in 1939 and 1944.

Eight smaller commercial buildings of different size, individually built and slightly later in style, comprise the northern block. Three of them have three stories. Round-arched windows harmonize with those on the courthouse. The variety in these buildings gives a more picturesque late Victorian character to the block.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This district is significant for three reasons. It is an excellent group of late nineteenth century structures, the majority in the High Victorian Italianate Style, which are unusually harmonious in design and in their relationship to one another. It is important in local history as a testimony to the enterprise of the citizenry in rebuilding the area after a devastating fire. Finally, the builders and architects were known and important men in the history of the region.

In the early morning of July 25, 1868, the entire business section of the village was destroyed by fire, including forty businesses, offices, meeting halls, and the first courthouse. At a meeting of the citizens, it was decided to rebuild immediately, with fireproof construction. As the effort would have been too great on an individual basis, the Chardon Building Company was formed, and on August 13 a contract for the construction of the Union Block was given to Herrick and Simmons of Cleveland. The builder Rensselaer R. Herrick had come to Cleveland in 1836 at the age of ten, became a carpenter's assistant, and began his own career as a builder in 1846. The Union Block was one of his last jobs, as he had been active in Cleveland public and political life since 1855, and he was elected mayor of Cleveland in 1879.

In September, 1868, L. J. Randall contracted to built the Randall Block just south of the Union Block. Randall was also the contractor for the courthouse. Its cornerstone was laid on September 10, 1869. After Randall's death, the courthouse was completed by Carpenter and Matthews of Meadville, and occupied on August 20, 1870. The architect of the courthouse was Joseph Ireland, active in Cleveland 1865-1885. He came from New York where he was a pupil of R. G. Hatfield. His works in Cleveland included the old Society for Savings building (Chamber of Commerce), 1866, and the Daniel Eells residence on Euclid Avenue, 1876. He returned to New York in 1885. The Italianate Style of the courthouse is conservative by comparison with the High Victorian Gothic of the Cleveland buildings mentioned.

The church was the second building of the Methodist Church (first in 1832). Because of its mass and color, it makes an effective terminal to the architectural character of the northern block.

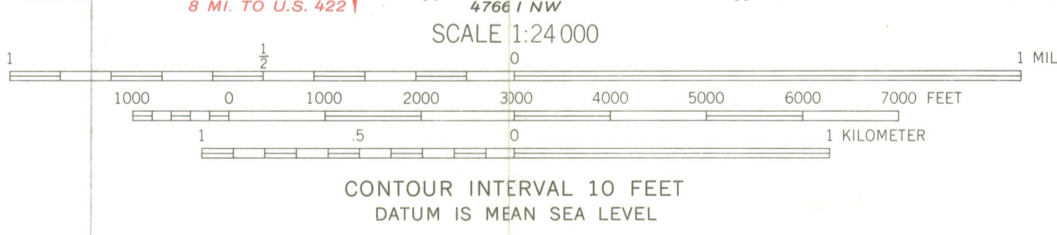

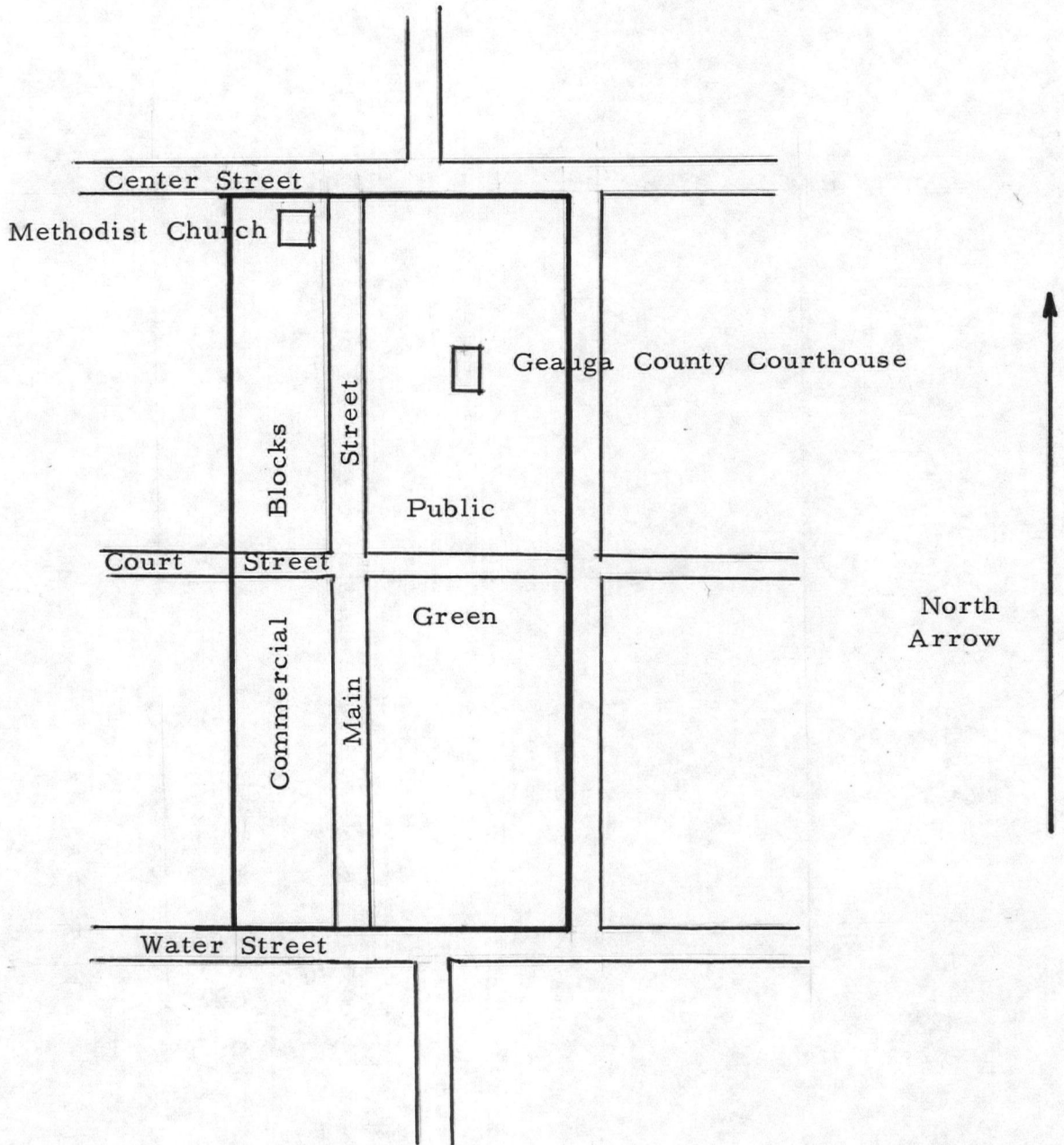
