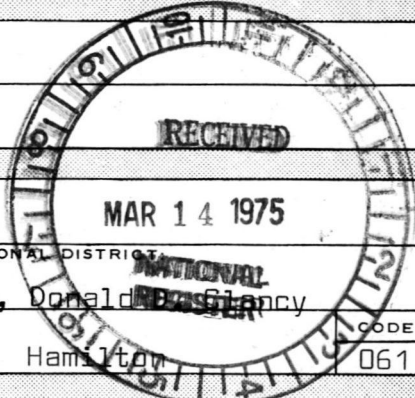

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

Exterior: This is a two and a half story random coursed trimmed stone house with wood trim. The house has been altered since its original construction and as a result has an irregular profile and roof line. On the main southeast facade there is a center portion under a gable roof set at right angles to the rest of the house. At the first level there is a three sided square bay. Above this at the second level there are three flat arched 1/1 double hung sash windows under one stone lintel. The center window is wider than the two narrow flanking windows. At the attic level there is a round arched 2/2 double hung sash window. The gable area on this facade and the gables on the other facades all have turned wood arch braces and hammer beams with brackets. There is carved wood infill between the arch braces and the hammer beams and a carved finial at the roof crest of the east gable.

To the left of this gabled portion is the main entry. Above the entry is a single 2/2 double hung sash window. Over this entrance portion is a steeply pitched hipped roof with imbricated slate tile and a shed roof dormer. It rises above all the other roof lines and terminates with metal cresting.

To the left of this entry portion is another portion with a gable roof and shed roof dormer. There are single 2/2 double hung sash windows at the first and second level.

To the right of the center gabled portion is a hipped roof portion. It has a shed roof dormer with two 2/2 double hung sash windows with wood infill between. On the first level there is a highly ornate cast iron porch with a pattern simulating the stone of the house.

On the south facade there is a two story five sided bay. The windows are 1/1 double hung sash with a round arched 2/2 window in the gable area.

The west facade is equally as irregular as the main facade and contains many of the same architectural elements, i.e. three sided square bay, shed roof dormers, and gable treatment. To the south of the center gable portion is a one story porch with a three sided wood paneled bay above.

On the north facade there are two entrances with shed roofs above short flights of stone steps. There are two interior end chimneys on this facade. They are tall random coursed stone with heavy wood caps which add to the irregularity of the roof profile.

Interior: The house has an irregular floor plan. There is a large entrance hall with an elaborate wood stair. The original rooms on the first floor have white marble and gray slate fireplaces. The room to the right of the entrance hall has a carved plaster ceiling as do several other first floor rooms. The large bay windows throughout the house have extensive carved wood trim.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

This house is significant because it was the home of Robert Reily, the founder of Wyoming, Ohio. It is an unusual example of Nineteenth Century architecture and reflects the architectural changes made by subsequent owners.

Robert Reily (1820-1863) was born in Butler County, Ohio. His father was John Reily, a Revolutionary War veteran, who opened the first school in Cincinnati in 1790 and ran a pack train between Fort Washington (Cincinnati) and Fort Hamilton in Butler County.

Robert Reily graduated from Miami University in 1836 and then came to Cincinnati. He started work as a clerk in a store specializing in imported silk, shawls, domestic linens and dry goods. He eventually became owner of the store and operated the business until he retired in 1859.

Reily was married to Isabella Gano, a member of a prominent pioneer family in Hamilton County. They had five children and built their house "Twin Oaks" in 1854 in a small community north of Cincinnati. In 1861 the adult members of the ten families living in the area met at Reily's House to consider a name for the village. Reily cast the deciding vote for "Wyoming". He later became the first mayor. Shortly after this meeting the Civil War began and Reily volunteered for military service. With Nathaniel C. McLean he organized the 75th Ohio Volunteers. He fought in the battles of Cheat Mountain, Cross Keys and Cedar Mountain in West Virginia. He was killed in the battle of Chancellorsville, Virginia, May 2, 1863.

The Reily House was later sold to George D. Winchell (1817-c. 1878). He married Martha Warner in 1842 and came to Cincinnati from Connecticut in 1843. Winchell was a descendent of Seventeenth Century settlers in Massachusetts. After he came to Cincinnati, he began a profitable tin, copper, zinc and sheet iron business. He lived in this house until 1878 when it became the home of Elisha Pinckney Stout.

Stout (1835-1914) was a banker and tobacco manufacturer and was one of the founders of the city of Denver, Colorado in 1858-59.

The present owners are very interested in the past history of the house and are working on its preservation. The City of Wyoming is celebrating its centennial this year and there is wide citizen

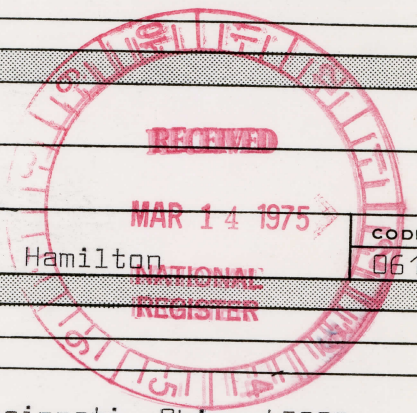
