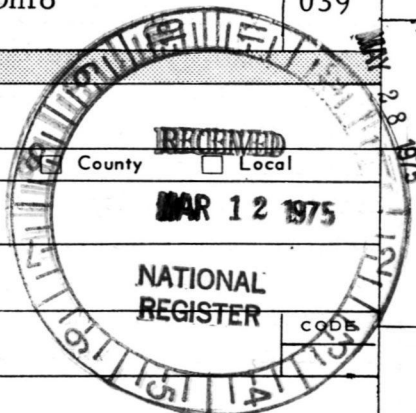

DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (if known) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This is an eight-sided red brick house in the Octagon mode, with ornamental detail in the Eastlake style. Each of the eight sides measures 17-1/2 feet, and the house has two and a half stories plus a cupola. The exterior walls are three bricks thick, and more than 99,000 bricks were used, all of which were made on the property. Specially-made bricks form the 135° exterior angles of the octagon. On the ground floor a wooden porch extends around four sides, with characteristic Eastlake incised ornament and brackets. The floor has been replaced once and the railings were removed years ago. The porch ceiling was plaster on lath, but is now deteriorated. The windows have plain horizontal stone lintels. The roof has four gables, one on every other side. It retains the original red tin sheathing with standing seams, and creates its own gutter system by curving upward at the edges. At the center there is an octagonal cupola with a round-arched window on each side. The cupola roof repeats the four-gabled form of the main roof. Originally there were four chimneys, of which three remain. On the east side of the house is a wooden one-room addition which was used as a kitchen, and added soon after the completion of the house.

The rooms of the first floor are arranged in a radiating plan around the center stairwell. The entrance hall faces the southwest, and leads, in a clockwise direction, to the front parlor (or library), a side parlor (connected to the library by a large three-paneled folding door), a back parlor, and the dining room which connects again with the entrance hall. A pantry off the dining room connects with the kitchen addition, and there is another kitchen entrance from the back parlor. The woodwork is cherry with late nineteenth century carved designs. There is wainscoting in the dining room.

The central stairwell is square in shape and has masonry bearing walls. The spiral stairway goes up to the attic. A small lavatory was added under the stairs on the first floor. The second floor has four bedrooms connected by the center hall, and a large triangular bathroom off one bedroom. The front bedroom has two large closets or dressing rooms, one on either side. The woodwork is some sort of fruit wood and very simple in design.

The attic is unfinished and has a separate entrance to the cupola. A skylight forms the floor of the cupola. The pegged beam supports of the cupola can be seen between the chimneys which bend at an angle. One chimney was removed at the floor level to support a large water tank for a gravity water flow system. There are no fireplaces in the house. The basement has two large rooms. The floors are brick. The stone foundation has specially shaped stones for the corners. The central furnace was installed in 1896. With the exception of the lavatory addition, there have been no important alterations to the building.

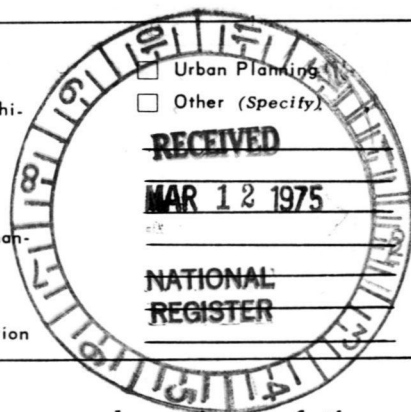

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Zimmerman house is a rare and unusual variant of the Octagon mode. Built almost twenty years after the height of the fashion was past, its four steep gables and Eastlake ornament seem to make it virtually unique. The builder Ezekiel B. Zimmerman was an unusually enterprising and well-educated man, and apparently designed the house himself.

Zimmerman's father, Ezekiel Zimmerman, was brought with his family from Pennsylvania to Chippewa Township in 1812 at the age of four. In 1843 he married his second wife Rachel (Rebecca according to the county marriage records) Ann McClellan, and Ezekiel B. was born in 1848. The son graduated from high school and attended Smithville Academy. He later received a certificate after completing a correspondence course from the Chautauqua Correspondence School. He married Frances Hess in 1877. His father owned approximately 320 acres at the location where the house was to be built, at the time of his death in 1876. It is believed that Zimmerman and a local carpenter planned the house, consulting only an architectural book. The floor plan is basically the one described in Section V of Orson Fowler's A Home for All. The "beautifully located and attractive dwelling" was completed in 1883, and numerous outbuildings shortly thereafter.

Zimmerman was a progressive farmer, building a greenhouse and planting rare and imported trees. He also served as a Chippewa Township trustee and as a school director, was a member of the Baptist Church and a Republican in politics. The house was one of the first in the area to have central heating, installed in 1896, and electricity from a Delco Electric Plant.

After passing to his second son Ernest in 1937, the house remained in the Zimmerman family until 1973. It is undergoing restoration by the present owners.
