DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The 1-1/2 story Jones-Cutler House was built of very large, cut sandstone block. The regular ashlar blocks are smooth faced and measure 3-4 feet long. With the exception of window sash and door frame, the house is constructed entirely of stone.

The main feature of the house is a full-height portico on the front (north) side. Four, square columns with Doric style capitals support the portico. Originally there were two engaged, round columns flanking the doorway, but these have been removed. The rounded depressions in the wall remain. Windows in the first floor have been altered. Presently there are two windows on either side of the entrance. There are two, 6/6 pane, windows, one to either side of the inside end chimney, in each of the gable ends. These windows are original. The frieze and cornice are plain stone and the gable ends have smooth stone coping. There is a 1-1/2 story frame addition, built in the late 19th C, to the rear. The gable roofs of both sections are standing seam metal and in good condition.

The interior of the house is arranged on a center hall plan. The door opens into a foyer that is connected to a hallway/sitting room to the rear (south). To the west are two bedrooms and to the east is a parlor. The rear wing houses a kitchen--dining area. The attic is unfinished.

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STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Jones-Cutler house is an interesting and good example of a Greek revival style house in Ohio. The full-height portico is more commonly found on templeform buildings, but its appearance on this small, simple 1-1/2 story structure is an interesting variation.

The Jones-Cutler House was built by an unknown builder early in the 19th Century. Though Jasper is a small town today, it was an important stop on the Ohio-Erie Canal. The canal route ran along the east side of Jasper between Main Street and the Scioto River. Some evidence of the canal bed and towpath are visible. The home is one of the finest in the area, built of local stone which is quite common in the area. During the 19th Century the stone was quarried in Waverly, about 6 miles north of Jasper.

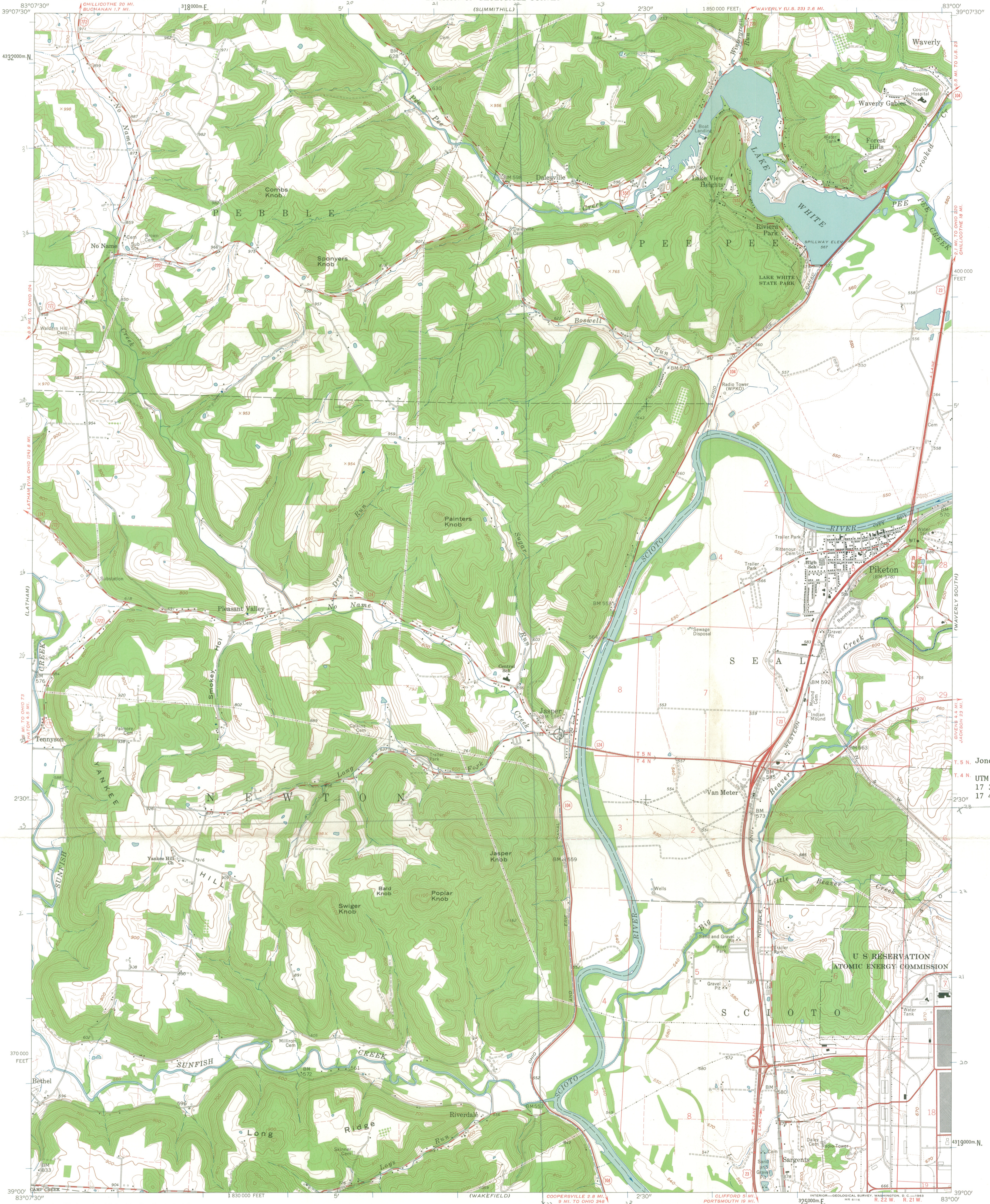

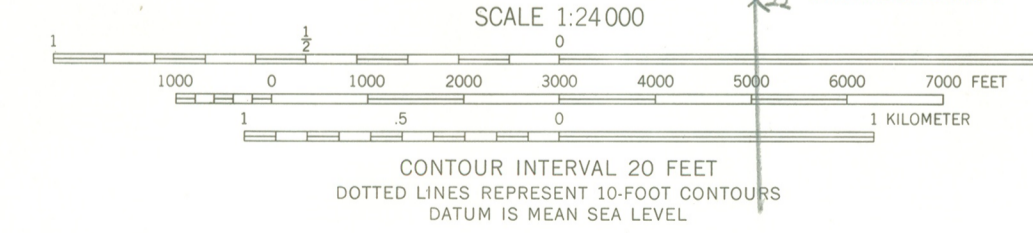

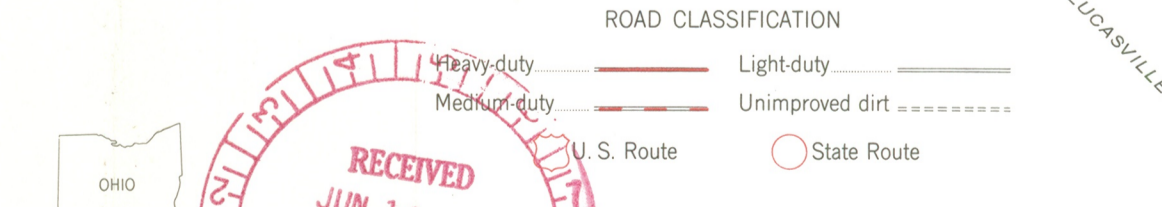

Dear Dr. Murtagh:

Transmitted herewith are eight (8) completed National Register forms. All of these forms were thought to have been sent to your office on October 9th, 1975 along with a letter of transmittal and three emergency nominations. Your office received only the letter and the three emergency nominations. Xerox copies were subsequently mailed as temporary replacements and, at this date, all of the properties have been placed on the Register.
