DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

The Henry H. Timken barn is a circular brick structure approximately 125 feet in diameter with a circular courtyard approximately 80 feet in diameter. The building, which formerly housed animal stalls, is 22 feet wide and one story tall. It has small regularly-spaced windows on both the interior and exterior elevations, and steep gable roofs surfaced with slate and vented by projecting shed-roof louvers facing the courtyard. This circular structure is accented by four round towers, 26 feet in diameter and two stories in height. The towers have conical slate roofs, wide eaves, and cylindrical shafts with flared bases. There is a continuous corbeled sill under the exterior windows on the second floor. There are also rectangular windows and doors on both floors, facing both the courtyard and the exterior. The western tower has two roundarched entrances with wooden doors and three rows of brick woussoirs. All of the walls are constructed of dark serrated brick, and most of the windows are boarded up or broken.

The structure contains four undivided curved rooms. They have open metal-truss ceilings, concrete floors, and brick walls. These rooms are connected by corridors on the inside wall of the building. The corridors give access to several small storage rooms and a larger room in each tower which opens into both the courtyard and the exterior. Some of the ground-floor tower rooms have white glazed tile walls. The second floor in each tower has an open metal-truss roof, a reinforced concrete floor, and some ruined wooden bins and machinery used in the sorting and storage of feed. Most of the interior's non-structural partitions have been removed and its remaining equipment vandalized.

The building stands on a wooded grassy knoll with small scrub trees growing adjacent to the exterior wall and within the courtyard. There is an exit ramp from Interstate 77 to the east, a residential development to the north, an office building to the west, and a major street on the south, whose construction has exposed part of the barn's foundation wall.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

The Henry H. Timken barn, with its circular plan enclosing a courtyard and its four round towers, is a unique architectural structure in the State of Ohio. In addition, it is the last remaining significant building from the estate of one of the nation's leading industrialists.

Henry H. Timken was born in St. Louis in 1868. His father Henry Timken gained a national reputation as the inventor of the modern roller bearing. The two sons, Henry H. and William, took over the Timken Roller Bearing Axle Company one year after it was organized in 1898. The Company became Canton's largest industry and the world's largest roller bearing manufacturer. In addition to leading the Timken Company, Henry H. Timken was an executive or director of the Timken Steel and Tube Division, the Timken-Detroit Axle Company, and the Hercules Motor Corporation. Timken's civic efforts included the establishment of the Timken Foundation, the ownership of the Canton Daily News, and support of Canton's YMCA and Timken Vocational School.

Henry H. Timken built his estate on the northwest edge of Canton following the enormous expansion of the company during World War I. He resided there until his death in 1940. The main house was located on the present site of the Timken-Mercy Hospital, and the estate has been divided by the route of Interstate 77. The barn, located just to the west of the highway, is a monumental relic of the early twentieth century wealthy class. The coincidental resemblance of the circular plan to the cage ring of a roller bearing is striking. The ingenuity of the architectural plan reflects the inventiveness, executive character, and industry of the Timken family.




