DESCRIBE THE PRESENT AND ORIGINAL (IF KNOWN) PHYSICAL APPEARANCE

This two story cut limestone rectangular structure was built in the Federal Style in 1842 with native materials by the members of the Presbyterian congregation. Two thousand dollars was pledged in cash, materials, and services. The entrance has sidelights and a recessed doorway. Plain lug sills and stone lintels head the windows and the doorway. The double hung windows are 2/2 lights. A graduated stone cornice meets the gabled roof line in the front and back of the building. There are five bays in the front and 2 bays in the side. In the center of the two inside end chimneys is a cupola which stands approximately three feet in height and is louvered on all four sides. The original bell remains inside.

The original academy appears to have had two large rooms downstairs and two rooms upstairs. These rooms have since been altered into smaller rooms. The north side of the upstairs was altered at one point in time to house the school master.

A cement block addition was added to the north side for more storage, and another cement block addition was added to the rear of the building (west side). The outer wall at the rear of the stone academy on the north west side was torn out to enlarge this room for industrial arts. The wooden floor in this room was replaced with cement to meet state standards for Industrial Arts. Previous to the addition of an industrial arts classroom, the academy was used as a library, cafeteria and a vocational agricultural shop.

Although there have been major alterations, enough remains of the interior that a restoration is possible. The original woodwork, fireplaces, and stairwell remain, and can easily be restored.

STATEMENT OF SIGNIFICANCE

During the 19th century, religious organizations were in the forefront of promoting educational activities, and South Salem Academy is significant as one of the earliest of these educational institutions in the Scioto Valley. A classical, mathematical, scientific and English school was established in 1843, at South Salem Academy to prepare students for higher classes in college, educating teachers for common schools and academies, training others for several other callings and gave sound Christian instruction. It was due to the success of the Academy which led to platting of the village of South Salem by John Sample in 1846 and the erection of several houses to accomodate students. In 1859, by vote of the stockholders, the institution was transferred to the care of the Chillicothe Presbytery.

In 1842, Rev. Hugh Stewart Fullerton, pastor of the South Salem Presbyterian Church, called together the members of his church and neighborhood to consider the question of establishing an academy. The project was met with favor at the meeting in the home of Satterfield Scott. The construction was done by members of the Presbyterian Church. Wood came from the surrounding forests and the stone was quarried along Paint Creek; it was said that every stone was laid with a prayer.

Along with a flourishing musical department the academy compared favorably with any similar institution, either in the East or South in its day. Many famous men attended South Salem Academy, including: Bishop Stephen Merrill; Judge Alfred Yapple of Cincinnati; J.D. McDill, Senator from Iowa; J.J. Pugsley, Congressman and Joseph Benson Foraker, Senator and Governor of Ohio.

On April 16, 1907, the academy trustees entered into negotiated agreement for a transfer of building and grounds to Buckskin Township to be used as a center of Buckskin Township School System, which later consolidated with the Greenfield Exempted Village Schools.

The academy is located in the village of South Salem, which is five miles east of Greenfield. The small village is predominately of 19th Century homes with tree-lined streets and a population of approximately 200 people.

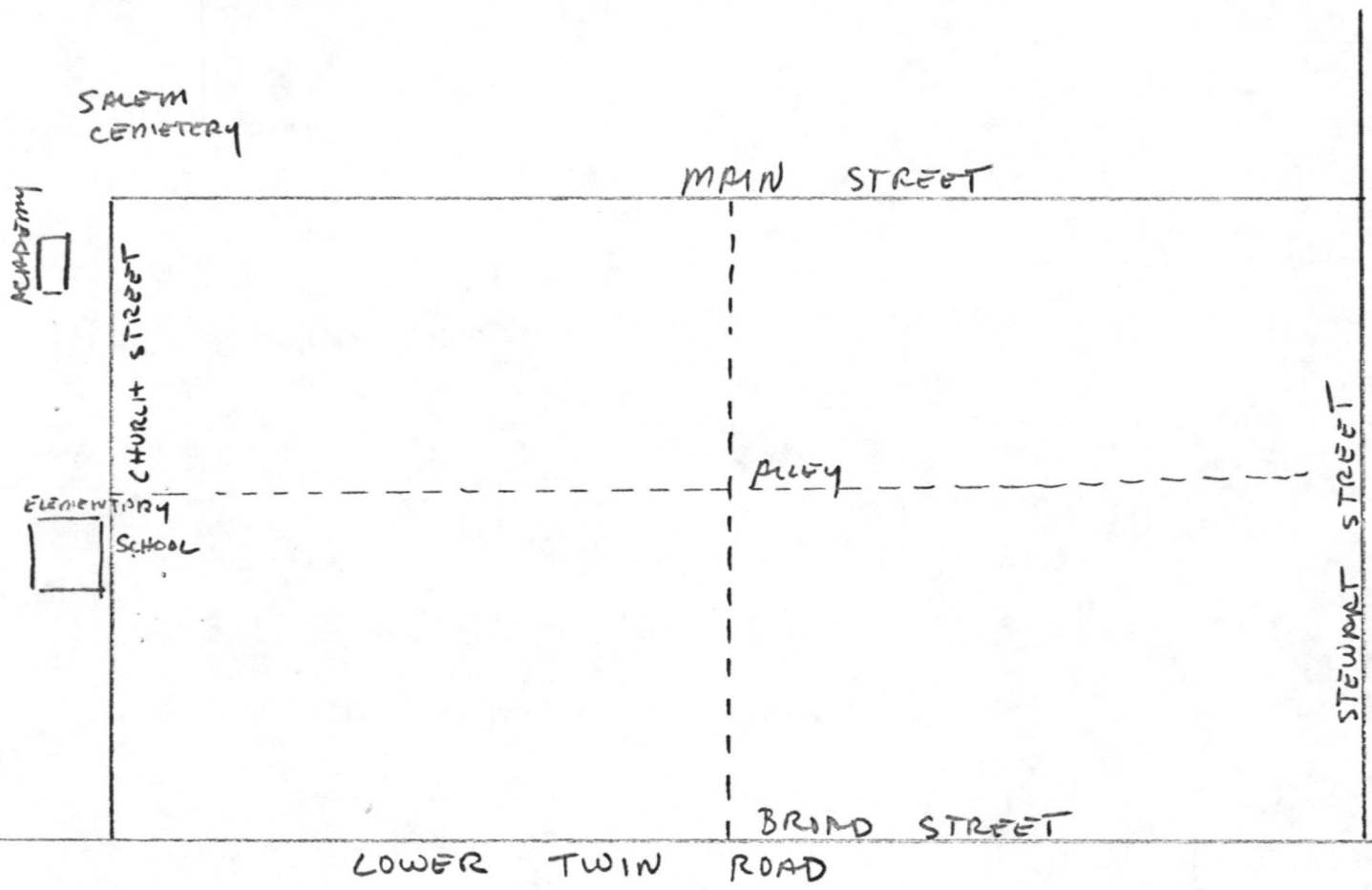

The area being nominated includes only that part of the Academy land that holds the 1842 building. Another building was constructed in 1874 to the south of the original structure, but it was torn down in 1928 to construct the present Elementary School. The latter is an unadorned three-story brick structure of no significance. Several items from the 1875 Atlas have been included for clarification.

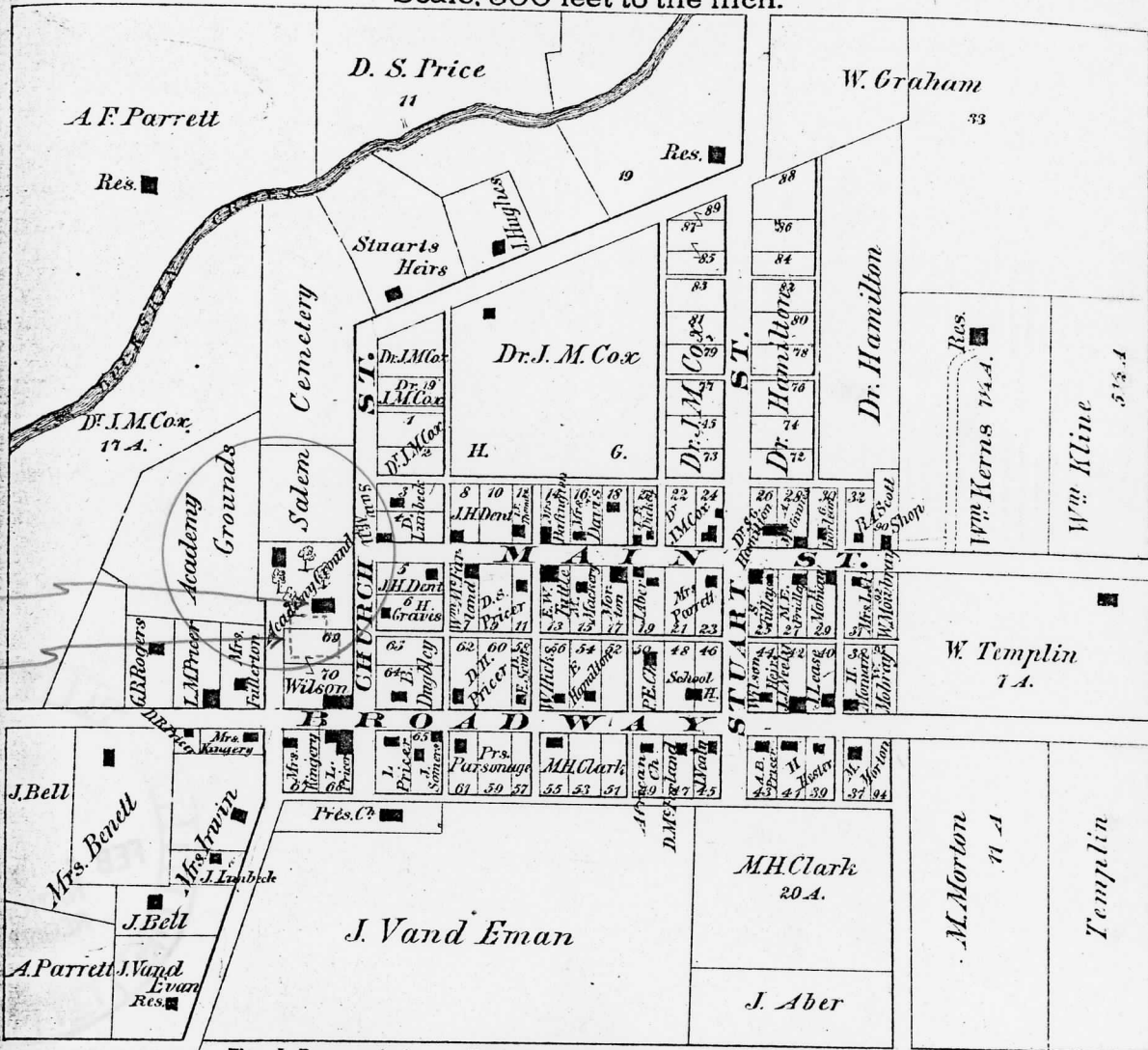
