

42. Further Description of Important Features The elaborate Greek Revival doorway is a striking feature of this otherwise plain small cottage. The ornamental detail, particularly that on the pilasters, is derived from Asher Benjamin's <u>Practical House Carpenter</u> . A newer wing, recently constructed, extends to the north and new window sash have been installed. The interior has also been remodeled. This house is very similar to the Gregg House (LC 571 R7), located nearby.	
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5. Other Name(s)

43. History and Significance
 Whitney Clark owned this house, according to the 1874 Atlas of Lorain County. He also ran a 100 acre farm on adjoining property. The Clark family was among the first settlers of the township and owned much land near here.

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings
 This small house has one outbuilding to the west. Trees and shrubbery accent the lawn around the house. The house and one acre of land comprise this nomination.
