#### Describe the present and original (if known) physical appearance

The Broad Street United Methodist Church, completed in 1885, is architecturally unique in Columbus due to its construction of green serpentine stone. The church and educational building to the rear entirely occupy the 94' by 187.5' corner lot. The plan of the church is square with an intersecting gable roof. A square entrance tower with tall spire, which is located in the northeast corner of the building dominates the composition. A smaller entrance tower is located in the northwest corner.

The facade features an enormous stained glass rose window placed within a slightly projecting gable flanked by slender tourelles. A series of small pointed arch stained glass windows are located on the first floor level below the rose window. The entrance towers also feature pointed arched stained glass windows and tourelles. The east and west elevations are also dominated by large pointed arched stained glass windows.

The most distinctive feature of the church is the green serpentine stone used in its construction. The stone is not found in Ohio and was reportedly imported from eastern Pennsylvania.

The education building to the rear has been altered in the interior, however its exterior remains intact and visually forms a unified composition with the church.

The interior of the church is impressive with its oak hammerbeam roof framing 60' above the floor, the semi-circular arrangement of original pews with decorative carvings, the carved wainscoting and enormous organ.

The Broad Street United Methodist Church occupies a busy corner lot in downtown Columbus and provides a striking contrast to the new office buildings lining Broad Street.

#### Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Broad Street United Methodist Church is significant primarily for architectural reasons. Completed in 1885, it was designed by Joseph Warren Yost, who along with his partner Frank Packard, were responsible for many significant late 19th and early 20th century buildings in Ohio. Included among Yost's and Yost & Packard's designs in Ohio are the Perry County Courthouse, Orton Hall (Ohio State University), and Toledo & Ohio Central Station (Columbus), all listed in the National Register of Historic Places. This building is also significant for the unique use of green serpentine stone in Columbus.

Due to the expansion of Columbus following the Civil War, the critical need for a new Methodist Church on the east side was recognized. In 1874 a Board of Trustees was appointed to establish a new church. The site at the southwest corner of Broad Street and Washington Avenue was selected. The first church, a frame structure measuring 40' x 70', was completed in 1875. The congregation expanded so rapidly as the surrounding residential area built up that by 1883 the need for a new, larger church was discussed. The Yost designed church was built at a cost of \$70,000.

The congregation recognizes the significance of the building and have proudly maintained it through the years.




