7. Description

Indianola Junior High School is a three-story buff-colored stretcher bond brick building constructed on a concrete foundation. The 18 bay walls are pier and spandrel design with segmental and flat arched 4/4 light recessed windows. The entranceway at the right center facade is surmounted by a bison head carving and decoratively carved stone tiles of stylistic animal figures aside. Stone coping follows the roof-line and hipped roof with gablet is covered with asphalt shingles. A bas sculpture of an Indian chief is over the third story. The building is also ornamented with balconies, shields, and terra cotta urns. The front entrance has oak doors with arched leaded glass panes and brass studs.

Interior details include a wood-burning fireplace, ornamental plaster, doors and bookcases with arched designed leaded and tapestry glass. Oak woodwork and wainscotting, much of which is from the original building on 16th and Indianola Ave. is also present.

Statement of Significance (in one paragraph)

Indianola Junior High School is an architecturally significant 1929 3-story brick institutional structure with modernistic influences. Its decorative features include terra cotta ornament, balconies and sculpture. The building was designed by Howard Dwight Smith, an Ohio State University architect at the time who also designed the Ohio Stadium, a National Register property. Dr. Erwin Frey, another Ohio State man, created the sculpture on the building. He is noted for his statue of Dr. William Oxley Thompson which stands in front of the Ohio State University Main Library. Interior woodwork and ornamentation further highlight this structure's significance.

Columbus was the first to establish the Junior High School concept in this country with Indianola. Originally located in a still existant 1907 structure in the vicinity, the institution was moved to this school building in 1929 because of overcrowding. This building should also be recognized for housing an institution which continues to promote innovative practices in the field of education.




