



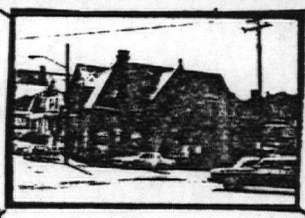

42. Further Description of Important Features
The building is distinguished by arched windows and 2 arched doors, a smooth rock faced belt course, 2 wall dormers with gabled roofs, one on front and one on side, 2 small dormer window with shed roof on south side of side wall dormer. Chimney, one in interior with pilaster and acanthus leaf at base of pilaster. #36. The Arts Center has slightly altered the building, (Door & Windows)



43. History and Significance
Strong corner building contributing to visual integrity of neighborhood. This building was constructed for use as a police station by the City of Cincinnati in 1895.

44. Description of Environment and Outbuildings
Building in association with busy intersection, mixed style, function, period, scale buildings. Bounded on the west by Ravine St.; on the north by McMillan; on the east by a line parallel to and 25' from Ravine; and on the south by a line parallel to and 120' from McMillan.

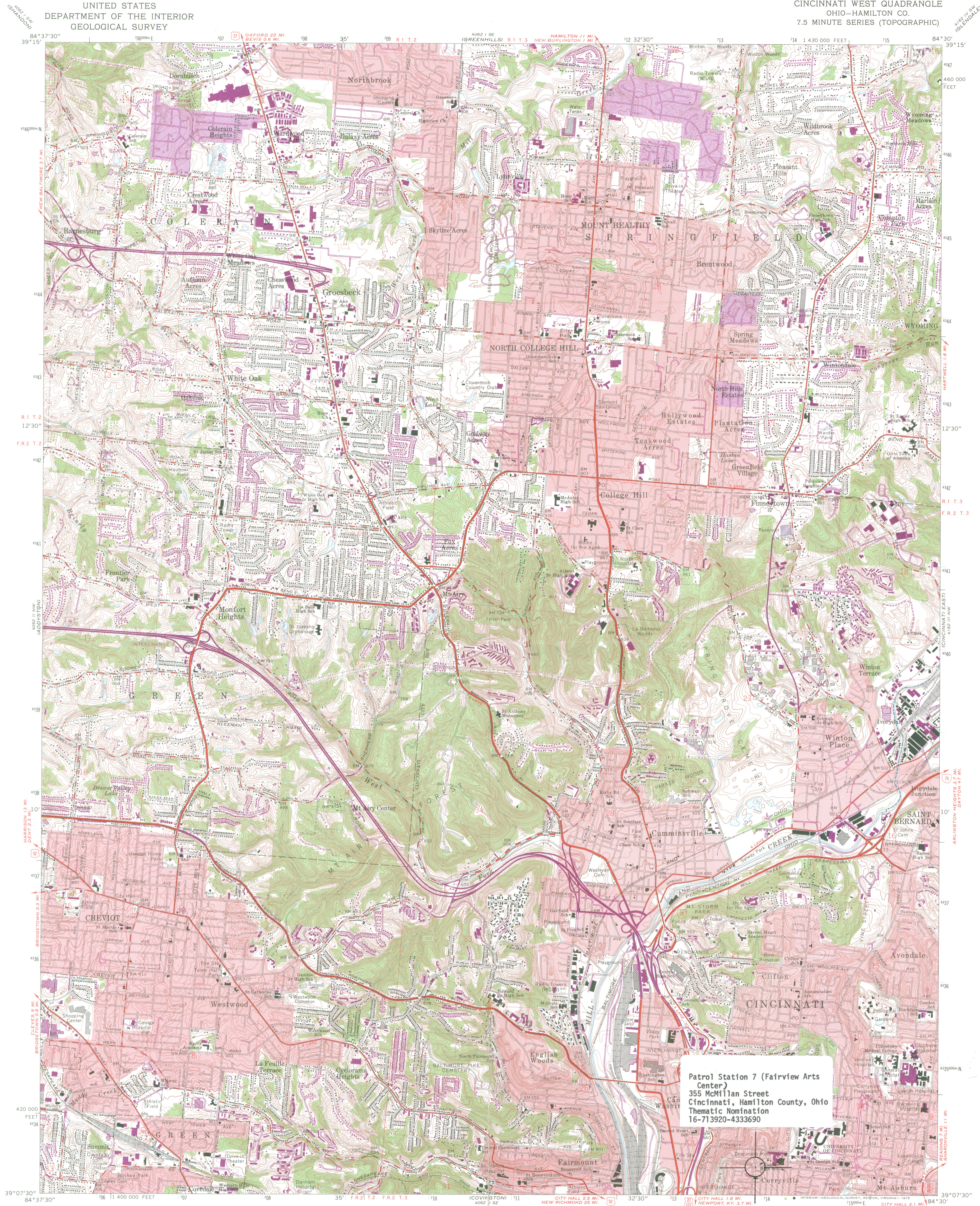

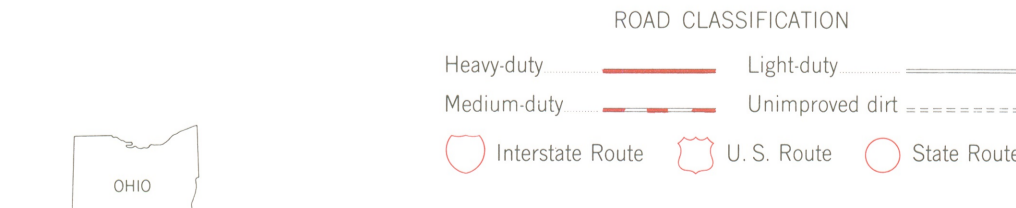
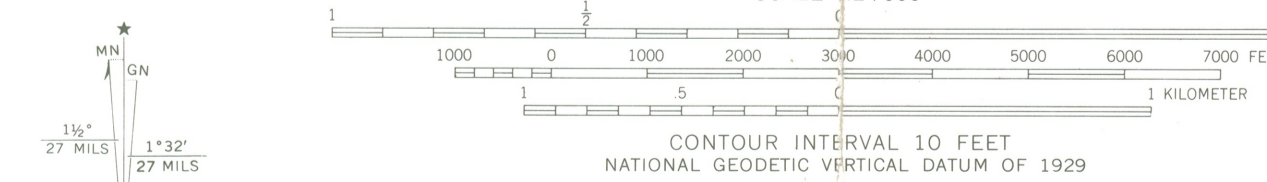
